## STATE B. T. U. CONVENTION IGNORES SCRIPTURES

### Church Auxiliaries . . . . **Enemy No. I Producing** Unspirituality and Death

We feel that one of the most important of all meetings for any church is the prayer meeting. If there is little prayer life—how can there be spirituality? The one greatest foe to prayer meeting (and spirituality) is the AUXILIARY SYSTEM in churches. It is virtually impossible to get young people out to prayer meeting in any numbers if a church has a "B. S. U." or any other little church "clubs." Oh how the devil is using those things! Time and again brethren ask how to have a good, well attended prayer meeting, and when we answer by saying that the first step is to get the church to drop the auxiliaries, they look at us as if we were crazy. But why ask us if they don't want the

We consider the auxiliary system (unscriptural and inefficient) as the Public enemy number one of the churches and the Cause of Christ. We are not saying this as a voice but as one who for years tried to get along with this "abomination of desolation" which stands "in the holy place where it ought not." The greatest liberation that we have ever experienced since we have been preaching, is liberation from the toils of this system.

We didn't start out to say these things, but since we feel led in that direction, we close this article with an indictment of the auxiliary system. By this system we mean B. Y. P. U., W. M. U., Men's Brotherhood, and all of the brood of sub-auxiliaries under any of these, with all of their manuals, seals, banners, standards and et cetera. We indict the whole business on the following

1—IT IS UNSCRIPTURAL. We have as much right to change baptism, as we have to change the organization of the church Jesus established. And the church He established didn't look anything like the

### **Length of Creation Days**

1. The only day which has an evening and a morning is a 24 hour

3. The period lighted by the sun was a 24 hour day. Gen. 1:5,14,18.

### And Defies State Board Of Kentucky Baptists In Ashland Meeting

The State B. T. U. Convention has just closed an annual meeting in Ashland, in which they not only ignored the Scriptures as to a woman's place in public worship services, but defied the State Board of Kentucky Baptists who long ago instructed the B. T. U. forces to obey Paul's injunctions about women speaking in mixed public assemblies.

Here are God's prohibitions: "Let your women keep silence in the churches: for it is not permitted unto them to speak: but they are commanded to be under obedience, as also saith the law. And if they will learn any thing, let them ask their husbands at home: for it is a shame for women to speak in the church. What? came the word of God out from you? or come it unto you only? If any man think himself to be a prophet, or spiritual, let him acknowledge that the things that I write unto you are the commandments of the Lord. But if any man be ignorant, let him be ignorant." (1 Cor. 14:34-38).

"Let the woman learn in silence with all subjection. But I suffer not a woman to teach, nor to usurp authority over the man, but to be in silence." (1 Tim. 2:11, 12).

At the June 1925 meeting of the State Board, a resolution was passed demanding that the B. T. U. department obey the Scriptures as to women speaking in mixed assemblies.

Though for 1900 years God has demanded that the women keep quiet in public worship, and though the State Board made the same demand fifteen years ago, the wishes of both God and man were rudely trampled under feminine feet in this recent convention in Ashland.

Women appeared on the program from time to time. One delivered a message concerning "Church Manners." It was said to be a splendid address. Yet, someone ought to have

We are happy to present herewith Elder Roy Mason, pastor of the Buffalo Avenue Baptist Church of Tampa, Florida; radio pastor over station WDAE, and editor of "Faith and Life."

Brother Mason has the distinction of being pastor of a church whose prayer meeting during 1939 averaged weekly, 229, and on the first Wednesday night of this year of 1940, there were more than 300 present. In Brother Mason's pastorate, they use the Bible as their text book for teaching and preaching. Furthermore, they take no pledges and have no financial campaigns. By virtue of the growth of their church, they have had to enlarge their auditor-ium four times during the past few years.

Each Sunday morning at 8:30, they conduct a broadcast over station WDAE. This radio audience, in connection with their Sunday morning services, means that Brother Mason preaches the gospel to more people than any other church in Florida.

He is an old-fashioned preacher of the grace of God, and he is not ashamed of it. If you live close enough, attend his services. If this is not possible, listen to his broadcast. And even if you can't do this, by all means, subscribe for his paper.

(Continued from Page One) highly organized, top-heavy, unspiritual, powerless organizations that exist today. And there isn't a human anywhere who can deny that this system is unscriptural and back up his denial.

2—IT IS INEFFICIENT. Churches are not running efficiently when they lost most of the Sunday school pupils from the preaching services and most of the young people from the Sunday evening service. Auxiliaryitis breaks a church up into groups and factions and divisions and destroys unity.

3—IT LEADS TO UNSPIRITUAL-ITY. Some of the most highly organized churches are full of bridge fiends, movie fiends, mixed-bathers, and the like, and they can't even begin to have church discipline.
4—IT LEADS TO CHURCH

QUARRELS. The clubs and societies in our churches are back of ninetenths of the church quarrels.

5—IT FOLLOWS THE WORLD INSTEAD OF THE BIBLE. All of this "expert" modern organizing of churches is copied from the world. 6—IT MAGNIFIES PARTIES

AND "ACTIVITIES" AND MINI-MIZES THE PREACHING OF THE

7—IT MINIMIZES THE CHURCH and magnifies some appendages that have unwarrantedly been tacked on. Many a church member will choose their little club rather than the church itself any time.

8—IT MAKES COWARDS OF PASTORS. Many a pastor who is brave enough along any other line, will show himself as meek as a lamb when his W. M. U. or Brotherhood president pops the whip,

9-IT IS A "MOTHER HUBB-ARD" UNDER WHICH A BROOD OF CHURCH EVILS HIDE. The ills and evils of the average church can be seen sticking their heads out from under the auxiliary system, like little chicks out from under the mother hen.

10—IT HELPS TO MAKE CHURCHES INTO LITTLE CHAIN STORE UNITS which really belong to a super-system. It is the "A & P" system foisted on the cause of Christ. We believe that such is an abominatin in the sight of the Lord.

Now we realize that we are considered worthy of the guillotine by the devotees of this system. Pastors fret and fume and privately tell us of the problems that it brings, then in public they shout "Great is Diana."

CAN THE SYSTEM BE ADAPTED AND CORRECTED?

Some would try to adapt and correct abuses of this system, but we are convinced after having tried it, that it can't be done successfully. The thing is wrong. It perverts God's order. It is an affront to the New Testament pattern and example. "BUT," says some brother, "YOU

CAN'T GET ALONG WITHOUT IT, in this modern day!"

It's not so!

If every Baptist church in America were stripped down to the chassis, with all of the man-originated accretion of organizations and innovations and usurpations, we would have a veritable revival throughout this nation.

4. The idea of a cataclysm is contrary to all Bible teaching, for all Bible history shows there is always a remnant left by God, of His work. If there were a creation millions of years before Adam, it was such a colossal failure, that no trace of it was left.

5. No pre-historic man. Adam was the first one. I Cor. 15:45. If no pre-historic man, then no sin; no death; no cataclysm; no fossils.

6. Pink's main argument is drawn from the word, "replenish." That argument is based on ignorance. The word, translated "replenish" in Gen. 1:28, is translated "fill," "fulfill," or "to be full" 246 times in the Old Testament. Creation was never finished until Gen. 2:4.
