Very Much Up To Date

It is with hesitancy that I present this subject, "That Interchurch Movement" — for day's consideration. But after much prayer, and thought, I am impressed that it is the will of God, that His saints at this place should know the truth.

It was only about two years ago that this same subject, only under a different title, came before us as a Baptist people, and your pastor crossed opinion with one of our honored and distinguished denominational leaders. In the reply of this honored leader he stated that it would be denominational suicide to oppose interdenominational work.

This Movement is wholly out of line with the Word of God, and is antiscriptural, and undemocratic in its set up. I make this statement upon the basis of the following characteristics of the so called "Interchurch Movement:

IT IS TAINTED WITH THE SPIRIT OF AUTOCRACY

The Movement owes its origin to self ordained, men who were not satisfied with the Bible way of doing things or even with the methods of the different churches going forward in their own respective ways, but claim it is necessary that we all move together. This within itself is inconsistent, if they are conscious of their own Way being right. If they are in the minority, they are afraid of competition; if they are in the majority, they are not satisfied with what they are teaching, and to some extent conscious that they in some way short of all the truth.

This Movement started outside the church. I wonder among whom? If outside the church, then among UN-BELIEVERS. "Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers." If

(Continued from Page One) this outside movement can find shelter beneath the folds of the banner of Christ, what else may arise and ask admittance upon an equal footing?

Why argue that such was born of the spirit, when it sprang from a source outside the recognized body of Christ?

With a number of the leaders in this movement, their own denominational bodies refused to adopt a budget for the expense of this great movement as they call it.

All the leading officers are either from New York, or have recently moved there so as to be near the heads of the church movements. New York, like Rome boasts of being headquarters for preachers.

This movement has not only originated the phrase 'Drive', which naturally signifies there being a driver, but it has also insinuated the same phrase into the denominations. Even the secular press has condemned the enterprise, and stamped their disapproval by asserting that the churches have begun to engage in 'Wildcat Ecclesiatical Campaigning'.

The question which is so vitally before us, will we again bow our knees to the force which drove our Fathers from Europe during the 16th century?

IT IS UNREASONABLE IN EXPENDITURES

It has already borrowed huge sums of money on the credit of the denominations. They are holding their gatherings in the most expensive centers; they have done more advertising than is necessary for any business. Men termed devout men have laid down the pastoral charge, when there are already so many pastorless churches who need their assistance, in order to hold lucrative positions in this movement, doing sums in arithmetic, when they have stated that the LORD HAD CALLED THEM TO THE GOSPEL MINISTRY.

The Southern Baptist put a campaign over the top for \$75,000,000. at a cost of less than one per cent, and yet this venomious beast is asking for 5 per cent.

ALL THEIR METHODS

ARE WORLDLY

The departure of the true mission of the church has drifted so far, that the secular press is criticizing. The Philadelphia Inquirer said the other day, "When a church becomes a vaudaville, and a forum for men who have axes to grind, and salaries to earn, it becomes a source of irritation to most folk."

This movement from the very first has tried to attract attention; and started into business by putting on a big show called the WAYFARER. This play contained no less than thirty persons whom we have been informed do not even confess Christ. They played the crucifixion, and charged admission. This is worse than Judas did when he sold the Christ for thirty pieces of silver.

I do not object to organization, but it should properly follow internal reformation. These self appointed leaders have made the gospel message mechanical instead of spiritual; they are using the hurry up method, together with spectacular attraction. They seem to think that about all folk need to serve the Lord are bright lights and a brass band.

This movement trusts in man instead of God; it seeks financial responsibility of man, before man is won to God.

IT IS INFERENTIALLY UNTRUTHFUL

It says that it is the agency created within the church. That is not the truth. It says "Put the church in town, and vice and disorder will disappear." Now we all know this is not the fact. The church has been functioning now for 19 hundred years, yet vice still increases.

THIS MOVEMENT SETS ASIDE THE PURE GOSPEL

The WORLD OUTLOOK the official organ of this body says 'Its main object is to show "The practicability and attractiveness of Christianity, not creed." Thus only those things that are practicable and attractive are to be set forth in this movement. Doubtless to them "The preaching of the cross is foolishness", but we who really are saved know that it is the power of God.

WHAT IS THE RELATIONSHIP OF US BAPTISTS?

For more than six months we have been arguing about this phase. Many things have been said for and against, and some of them did not sound very Christ-like; but in spite of all that the devil has tried to cover up some things have spilled overboard.

At the Denver Convention the Baptists voted to co-operate with the Interchurch Movement in this great DRIVE, with some reservations. They flooded the country with literature concerning this move, but thousands of our people were determined not to be bartered into such an action. So many of our denominational leaders began to deny that we had any relationship with the Interchurch.

You remember that I stood here a few months ago and told you that as Baptists of the North we stood in the same relationship with the movement as one state stood with the Union; but several of you thought I did not know whereof I spoke. Some thought I was wholly ignorant about the movement. Because I am not a church dictator, but only an advisor, I chose to remain silent on the subject until the truth leaked out, which I was confident would happen.

Some of you were afraid to accept my advice and sought information elsewhere; for which I am glad.

Now let us turn to last week's Baptist Banner and see what Brother Bartlett the Editor of that stand says, and he is the same Brother Bartlett who said from this stand that they were separate and distinct Movements. I quote "There is little doubt that we would be over the top in OUR campaign, but for our relationship with the Interchurch."

What does relationship mean? I told you we were related months ago, but these leaders said we were not. Dr. Bartlett goes on and quotes Dr. Laws article from the Watchman-Examiner. Now heres what Dr. Laws writes: "As we proceed to discuss the weak points of the Interchurch Movement, let it be remembered that we are discussing a movement in which the Baptists are leaders, a co-partnership in which Baptist had to furnish twice as much money as anybody else. . . .We are discussing affairs that belong distinctly and uniquely to our denomination as a part, and a big part of the Interchurch Movement." . . . He further states: "Shall Baptists continue their co-opration? Let the Northern Convention at its Buffalo Meeting withdraw from the Interchurch World Movement. If we made a mistake at Denver, we can correct the same at Buffalo."

I am now wondering if there is anyone who will still argue that we have no relationship to this gigantic world machine, when men like these say the opposite.

The time is here when men must think for themselves. Think as they have never thought before. Study the good old book, and believe in the supernatural power of God. I have been criticized concerning my stand against this movement; but I was only honoring My God according to the dictates of my conscience.

It is not my will to dictate to anyone, but I feel this church should know my position NOW because if I go to the Convention I am expecting to cast my vote against the Movement; also I expect to vote for a re-adjustment of money received in the denominational phase. I am far more interested in the mission end than I am the philosophy that is being crammed down the throats of our young ministers of this day.

God help us to liberate our feet from these shackles, which are binding us so tightly.

But the title given him by our business friend who, as a matter of information, was one of this preacher's deacons (and a loyal one at that) is not enviable. For a minister of Jesus Christ and a Herald of the Gospel to be called a Clown is not complementary. Much less complementary is it for a minister to conduct himself in such a way that his people do not care to consult him in spiritual matters and will not

open their hearts to him.

Ministers, it is admitted, ought to be pleasant and winsome, and, at times, even entertaining, but no minister can afford to become a clown. With what dignity, with what grace, with what consciousness of his office, ought an Ambassador of the King of kings carry himself.

One does not need to exalt himself in order to magnify his office, but a good minister of Jesus Christ will do the latter. Dr. B. H. Carroll was eminently right when he said, "I maintain that there is no other office known among men that calls for the kind and degree of qualifications which God's Word requires for the ministerial office. He must have gifts, graces and character such as no human law requires for any earthly office.

Paul's admonition, "Let no man despise thee," does not mean that we shall endeavor to be popular, but, on the contrary, that we shall so live as to avoid the contempt of man.

Dr. Truett has well said, "Terrible is it beyond all words for Christ's preacher to be the wrong kind of a man. The Christian ministry is not for prigs and fops and charlatans. . Every preacher ought to be such a sincere and unselfish man that his community would be willing to trust its life into his hands."

When we laid down our tasks as ministers of the Gospel, our people ought to be able to say no less of us than Mark Anthony said of Brutus:

"His life was gentle, and the elements so mixed in him that

Nature might stand up and say to all the world:

This was a man." The Christian Index
