Here's The Story Of Repentance—Both True And False

We have been asked to deal with this topic, and it should prove helpful to all, for there is much confusion and misunderstanding on this subject.

WHAT REPENTANCE IS NOT

It is not being sorry that one has been caught. In the Scriptures we read, "the sorrow of the world, worketh death." This is the sorrow people have when they are caught in their sin and crime. Probably every criminal in every penitentiary has this kind of repentance. But if turned out, they would go and do something as bad or worse.

Bawling and crying and taking on is not repentance. A lot of the altar and mourners'

bench taking on is no deeper seated than the tear glands and vocal cords. We have seen this sort of thing during revivals and in a few weeks the mourners were back into their old habits. Sorrow is not repentance anyhow. The Bible says that "godly sorrow worketh repentance." (See 2 Cor. 7:8-11). Sorrow however is an element in repentance and must precede real repentance. No one repents of a thing until they are sorry it happened.

MEANING OF THE WORD REPENT

Greek word means, "to change one's mind." The thought of sorrow and change of purpose is in the word. We might express it like this: "Re-

pentance of sin is such a sorrow for sin and abhorrence of sin — such a change of mind about it, as leads the sinner to turn away from it with all his heart." Let us note some usages of the word. (Job 42:5,6; Luke 10:13; 1 Thess. 1:9; Acts 26:20).

REPENTANCE ON PART OF UNSAVED SINNER

The sinner must in every case repent of his sin. He must with changed mind and attitude, turn from his rejection of Christ, his attempts to save himself, his wrong doings. And — he must turn unto Christ, receiving Him as the One who died to pay his sin debt. For involved in salvation is turn- (Continued on page four)

BANK REPLACES DESECRATED BIBLE

The Central Bank and Trust Company of Denver has replaced the pulpit Bible torn up by vandals. The Bible, property of Westwood Baptist Church, along with an American flag, had been destroyed in the most satanic orgy in Denver police annals several months ago.

T. Arthur Williams, assistant cashier of the bank, gave the following reasons for the bank's action: "When vandals desecrated Denver's Westwood Baptist Church, the officers and directors of the Central Bank and Trust Company, like the vast majority of Denver residents, were horrified. Citizens from all walks of life rallied to help the church wipe out the marks of vandalism. Text: John 3-7 "Ye Must Be Born Again."

The following statement is from The Press:

"While we are considering Efficiency of Machinery and reduction of taxes it might be well to keep in mind that CRIME in the United States costs the citizen twice the amount of his income tax. If those that escape were apprehended the cost would be doubled." It has also been stated that the United States now leads the world in crime. Or there is more crime in the United States according

to the statistics than in any other country.

While we believe in law and order, law enforcement and civil proceedings, we do here state that the most effective cure for crime is The New Birth according to Jesus who said in the words of our text, "Ye Must Be Born Again."

If Jesus didn't mean what He said, why didn't He say what He meant? He was speaking to one of the scholars and leaders of His time and I am glad that He gave this text to him as otherwise we might have thought it applied to the substrates of society. If these words had been spoken to the woman at the well who had

four or five husbands instead of Nicodemus, the professor of Israel, we might have thought it applied to the slums, not the intellectuals of any age. It was not spoken to Zacchaeus, the man who later made restitution because he had cheated so many. But it was given to the Teacher and intellectual man of that day. There is no class that is exempt from this Almighty Must.

world's greatest speaker. It is the biggest theme in the book of that Saint and Evangelistic writer, John. Life is the greatest mystery of all mysteries. We can only trace the mystery of life back to God. God gave life and He is the author of it. He holds the patent on it. None can reproduce life. A scientist can create a kernel of wheat or an egg but the wheat won't grow nor the egg hatch.

JESUS said "Ye must be born again." Birth is the metaphor used here and taken from physical life to illustrate a spiritual truth. It is taken from the beginning of life which is a mystery. Life is a mystery, both its beginning and its ending, birth and death, none can explain. We accept the fact of life though we can not explain the mystery. The birth is the beginning of life. The New Birth is the beginning of our spiritual life. "Ye must be born again." A former university president once said, "Education is the greatest thing in the world." Professor Drummond once said, "Love is the greatest thing in the world." JESUS, the peerless speaker of the centuries, said, "Life is the greatest thing in the world, 'Eternal Life' is not a mere endless duration of time but a kind of life, a quality of life. A life rich in joy, love, peace, and the kind that passeth all understanding.

The mysteries we can not explain but the thrills, the throbs, the experiences we can tell about and preach about. Religion is life and not a mere code of morals. Morals is the result of the New Birth and the New Birth is not the result of Morals.

THE NEW BIRTH is the cause of Reformations. A revival was behind the greatest reformations.

Evan Roberts, while working in the coal mines in the old country, responded to the call of God. He went home and washed up and put on clean clothes and went to the services. He was mightily used of God. A great revival swept over Wales. One of my singers was in Wales at the time and assisted in this world renowned revival by playing the pipe organ in some of those services. The results were more than space here will enable us to tabulate. But the jails were empty for weeks afterward. The courts had nothing to do. Crime ceased because the people of those communities were held in the spell and the charm of the gospel. They were saved from criminal conduct of every kind. They were as a normal community should be.

There is no asset so great to any state or nation as the work of a great religious revival—A community cleaning—A home

helping, church cleaning, awakening, and quickening revival.

Revivals are behind reforms. They were in Martin Luther's time, they were in John Knox's time, they were in John Wesley's time. They are now when given a chance. Allow me to ask, has religion been tried yet in this present depressing, indifferent, immoral, crime committing age?

PHILANTHROPY is the result of the New Birth. Giving a biscuit to a tramp or a bed to a needy person, that is all well and good but it is not Salvation, Conversion or New Birth. That is philanthropy. A man may in this age of greed, graft and dishonesty, bleed his victims to get money. He may then build a public library and a Church, and put on it a sign-board, which reads, "Erected to the Glory of God and for the benefit of men" and men may sit upon its steps or live within a block of it who could starve and freeze and the brownstone or brick walls of that structure would not warm nor feed them. That is a sort of post mortem charity. New Birth is back of true charity, and it is back of true philanthropy, and all good works. Let us put first things first.

A MYSTERIOUS PROCESS

It is an indisputable fact and an irrefutable experience. There are things we know to be true that are otherwise inexplicable. The Niagara River flows from Lake Erie to Lake Ontario and on its way falls several hundred feet. This river rapidly flowing down its course leaps over a precipice of 166 feet down into a whirlpool below. This river accumulates a power when harnessed that furnishes power for light, heat, and transportation for the City of Buffalo and western New York. None can

explain electricity. Who can deny the power of electricity? We have sense enough to believe in and recognize the power of electricity. We apply it and use it.

JESUS said, "The wind bloweth where it listeth, but ye cannot tell from whence it cometh or whither it goeth." We believe in the fact of the wind even though we cannot see it. We see the wind mills run and watch them do their work. We follow in the wake of a great cyclone, and note the destruction of crops, herds, homes, cities, and we note the power of the wind. We can not deny it. Yet we can not explain it nor see it. At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came as a mighty rushing wind. There were hundreds born again. It was a mighty Revival that stirred Old Jerusalem, the wickedest city of the then known world. It worked wonders, and miracles, and was back of reforms.

We may not understand the Spiritual Birth, still we believe in it, experience it, we recognize the power of it. It is the cure for crime. It converts the criminal. It causes the bootlegger to empty out his bottle of bootleg booze and fill it up with baby's milk. It took Jerry McAuley from Sing Sing Prison and put him at mission work down in New York. It has changed the life of vicious criminals, it has cleaned festering spots of slum districts of our wicked cities. It has worked among cannibals of the Fiji Islands and brought about Church steeples and school houses and civilization. It is the cure for crime.

Some folks say that a revival costs money, well, how much does it cost to prosecute one criminal who should have been converted before he committed the crime?

Some folks say that a revival takes money out of a town, well, how much money does a circus take out of a town? How much money does a show take out of town? One show manager told me that he took \$29,000 out of one town in less than a week's time. I say that some folks are so stingy that the wrinkles on their faces grow into the shape of dollar marks (\$) and their faces are already the shape of an old money bag.

THE NEW BIRTH AND BUSINESS. There are some who say that religion is not business like—that religion should be business-ized. They say it is backward because the business of today needs to be religion-ized. Business needs Christianity more than Christianity needs business methods. There is too much crookedness in business and politics today and I say that Christianity doesn't need any of that kind of business methods. Too many business men are becoming nothing but chilled steel and brains without a heart or a soul development.

I say that the business of any town or city is benefitted by a revival of religion. Allow me to refer to one revival campaign which was conducted down in Pennsylvania by a personal friend of mine, the late John A. Davis, Evangelist. A tabernacle was erected in three days' time which seated twenty-five hundred people. Thirty churches united in this campaign. While this campaign was under way, a man who one or more years previous to the beginning of this revival in this city had broken into a home as a burglar and in getting away struck a woman down, but only succeeded in getting \$2.50, came into the city again and attended the meetings. He was impressed with the power of the Spirit and was later under conviction of his sins. He went from the meeting, and walked to the house he had previously broken into as a burglar and rapped on the door. The same woman came to the door. He gave her all the money he possessed which was \$1.50 and then confessed that he was the man who had struck her down. He then went to the police and gave himself up. This is a true story which can be proved today. I say that a revival cures crime and converts the criminal and it helps business. Allow me to further illustrate. In this same revival campaign in this Pennsylvania city, after the revival ended in the course of the weeks, there were more than two thousand dollars worth of bad debts paid up by those of that city who were listed as deadbeats and whose debts had been outlawed. I say a revival affects business. I say that business needs a revival of Christian Religion of that type today.



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THE CHURCHES NEED A REVIVAL. There are too many members who are only white washed and not washed white. Too many church members never were born again as by their fruits ye shall know them, saith the Bible. Too many have their names on a church book whose names are not evidently on the Book of Life. I had as soon my name would be on a board fence or a billboard as on a church book if I were not right with God. The churches need more than mere organization alone. Churches need more than budgets and millions of money to save this reckless crime committing race of citizens today. The church needs more than plausible entertaining discussions of the world's needs. They need consecration to Christ. They need a revival of religion that will get many of their members born again and give their church power to save society. Too many preachers are either sipping pink teas, or eating fudge when they should be preaching Bible facts. Churches are only a means to an end. Their job is to help Christ who said He came to seek and to save the lost. If the Church lays down on the job of revival work, of soul saving, then the Evangelistic parties and other bands of believers will get up where the church laid down and God will honor His teaching, "Ye must be born again."

The one greatest need in our country and the world today is for a soul saving, crime curing, church building, society cleaning, sweeping, nationwide, Revival of Christianity, that will spread like a great forest fire from Portland, Maine, to Portland, Oregon—from New York City to San Francisco, Calif.—from Washington, D. C., to Los Angeles, Calif.—from Savannah, Ga., to San Diego, Calif.—from Minneapolis, Minn., to New Or-

leans, La.—in other words, from the Atlantic Ocean to the Pa-

IF Baptists should be guilty of the above doctrines and practices they would be outlawed by all right thinking people in the world. Bigot, intolerant, religious prejudice are all pet words used by guilty men to escape further investigation.

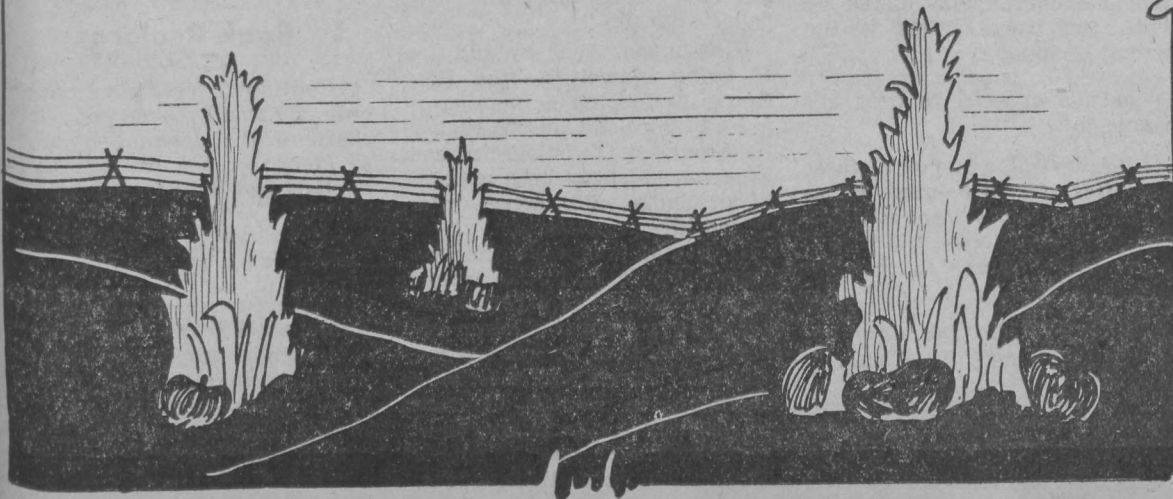

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ing from and turning unto. (See I Thess. 1:9). Genuine repentance and saving faith always go together—like the two sides of a coin.

REPENTANCE OF A SAVED SINNER

When a person turns to Christ, then Christ assumes that person's sin debt, and settles it—past—present—future. "Our Saviour Jesus Christ who gave Himself for us that He might redeem us from ALL iniquity." Now many have a warped conception of this, and assume that Christ pays for our past sins, but that we must take care of the ones committed following conversion. This is a strange mixture of justification by Christ plus works. The truth is, Christ becomes the surety for all our sins that we have or ever shall commit.

Those who don't see this think that for every sin the Christian commits, he must get individual forgiveness for, or else be lost. And some assume that if a person commits some great offense and gets struck down before it is repented of, that he goes on to torment. What a perversion of the plan of salvation! That puts our safety up to us—and conditions it upon our repenting separately for every sin. The truth is, the blood of Christ covers every offense that we shall ever commit, if we trust to it. Every sin is already paid for. This raises an important question:

Why should a saved person repent? Because the new nature, and the indwelling Spirit of God will impel him to. And in order that he may be restored to fellowship with God. Sin in the life of a saved person does not destroy relationship

but it does destroy fellowship. Your child can disobey you and still remain your child, but such disobedience injures your fellowship with that child. The child repents and asks forgiveness—not in order to be reinstated as a child, but to get back on right terms with you. Only as a Christian lives with no known sin unconfessed and unrepented of can that Christian have a life of full blessing and happiness. Every truly born-again person knows the unhappiness of God's frown. "Trust and obey for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey."

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A concubine is a woman a man lives with or visits regularly to whom he is not legally married. Hagar was Abraham's concubine. Solomon had 300 of them.

In II Cor. 11:2, the Bible says: "For I am jealous over you with a godly jealousy; for I have espoused you to one husband that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ." The Lord Jesus is not married yet. He is only espoused or betrothed, and the wedding will only take place when all those who compose His Bride are saved and gathered unto Him.

The Lord Jesus is no polygamist. He has no concubines. Paul told the local Baptist Church of Corinth that he had betrothed them to Christ. There are three essentials for any person being a member of the betrothed of Christ. (1) He must have the Holy Spirit in him. (2) He must be a member of a local Baptist Church. II Cor. 11:2 wasn't spoken to Christians in general, but to the members of a local Baptist Church. (3) All the betrothed must be "chaste virgins."

This means that in addition to being indwelt by the Holy Spirit, and being a member of a local Baptist Church, that to be a part of Christ's betrothed, a person must not be a member of any lodge, club, secret order, or worldly organization.

If a man keeps another besides his wife, that other woman is a concubine. If a person belongs in a Baptist Church and six lodges, then he has six concubines. That is why most lodge members in Baptist Churches do nothing for their church—it takes all their money to support their concubines—their lodges.

The man or woman who be-

longs to a lodge is untrue to his church in the same sense a man is untrue to his wife if he has a concubine. The time he gives to his lodges ought to be given to Christ and His Church. The money spent on lodges ought to be spent on Christ and His Church. The love and affection they lavish on their lodge ought to be lavished on Christ and His Church.

No man can serve two masters. No man can have a secret meeting with his concubine and be true to his wife. No man can be true to Christ and His Church with his love divided between his church and his concubine.

Since Brother Ben has had his concubine assist him, I imagine he'll be buried by his concubine too. When he gets to Heaven his head will be bowed low with shame because his entrance into Heaven was from the presence of a concubine and his last earthly act was to insult the betrothed of the Lord Jesus.

Won't that be hard on Brother Ben and all other lodge Baptists who have been traitors to Christ and His Church?
