Oh, you did not know about is? Well, you should; for the this? first five important steps have already been taken toward our reunion with Northern Baptists. Here they are:

1. Name has been changed. You wondered why Northern Baptists were so eager to change their name from the Northern Baptist convention to the American Baptist convention? That is simple — they were getting under way the greatest political move among Baptists of America since the unhappy division in 1845. "THE MARRIAGE OF THE

(Read Rev. 19:1-10).

In human life no event excites the emotion, stirs the affection, and stimulates hope like that of matrimony. As I look back over the thousands of weddings that I have preformed, I can think of many experiences which amply prove this to be true.

It has always been my custom to instruct the bride and groom to answer, "I do" to the questions which I shall ask. I remember one lad, years ago, who became unduly excited

and who said, "I do, yeah."

On another occasion a man fifty-three years of age, in answer to the question, not only said "I do" but he continued to say it some half dozen or more times, until I interrupted him with another question.

On another occasion when I told the couple to join their right hands, the man held up his hand as though he were going to take an oath in court. It is true that he was about to receive a life sentence, yet it was hardly necessary that he swear

his life away.

I can also remember some excitement on the day when I was married. Mrs. Gilpin was wearing a little two-piece suit with a pocket on the right side of the jacket. I had given the minister a five-dollar bill for his service in advance of the wedding and he in turn had given it to Mrs. Gilpin, who dropped it loose into the side pocket of her jacket. While the ceremony was taking place, she became so excited that she tore

(Continued from page one) the five-dollar bill into shreds. I thereupon decided that she wasn't a fit subject for handling money and I haven't given her any since. While I am speaking of her excitement, I might as well be honest and admit that the same was true with me. I wasn't married until after four o'clock in the afternoon, yet I was fully dressed for the wedding by twelve o'clock noon.

I cite these few incidents just to show you that there is no event which excites, stirs, and stimulates like that of marriage.

So it is with the marriage of the Lamb. The Bible is just one long love story. From Genesis to Revelation this is true. It thrills our souls to think of this coming wedding which will be the consummation of all of Christ's promises.

It is rather interesting to notice the following elements which go to make up the marriage of the Lamb.

T

THE BRIDEGROOM.

This will be God's only Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. Although there are many points of difference concerning other elements which will make up this marriage, I suppose that there is none who would doubt or say that the bridegroom was any other than the Lord Jesus Himself.

Several Scriptures indicate this to be true.

"Then came to him the disciples of John, saying, Why do we and the Pharisees fast oft, but thy disciples fast not? And Jesus said unto them, Can the children of the bridegroom mourn, as long as the bridegroom is with them? but the days will come, when the BRIDEGROOM shall be taken from them, and then shall they fast."—Mt. 9:14,15.

"The kingdom of heaven is like unto a certain king, which made a marriage for his son." —Mt. 22:2.

"Ye yourselves bear me witness, that I said, I am not the Christ, but that I am sent before him. He that hath the bride is the bridegroom: but the friend of the bridegroom, which standeth and heareth him, rejoiceth greatly because of the bridegroom's voice: this my joy therefore is fulfilled."

Surely this could mean nothing except that the Son of man —our Lord Jesus—is the bridegroom.

II

THE BRIDE.

It is not so easy to identify the bride nor will all Christians agree as to my interpretation. In fact, many Baptists within our own denomination would hardly agree as to what I shall say.

At the very outset, let me insist that the bride will NOT be the sum total of all the redeemed of God. To me, this is the most ridiculous position that any Baptist preacher can take to say that all the redeemed compose the bride. Why should I contend against alien immersion and for close communion, as well as contend against union meetings and denounce the universal church, if, after a while, I and all true Baptists and all the heretics as to church truth are going to be on the same plane and each of us a part of the bride? If I believed that all of the redeemed would compose the bride, I would practice alien immersion, open communion, take part in union meetings, and never dare preach that Jesus established a Baptist church. Why contend for the few brief years of our lifetime for these doctrines if these doctrines are all going to be forgotten at the marriage of the Lamb? I insist, beloved, that any Baptist preacher who thus believes that all of the redeemed will make up the bride puts himself in the most embarrassing position possible. I can see no reason for contending against schismatic heretics, if after a while, we are all going to be together.

glorious within: her clothing is of wrought gold. She shall be brought unto the King in raiment of needlework: the virgins her companions that follow her shall be brought unto thee." —Psa. 45:13.14.

It is highly conspicuous that "the King's daughter," who in this Scripture represents the bride, has a number of companions. Doubtlessly many will be saved who will be nothing more than the companions of the bride of Christ.

Here is another Scripture which would present the same truth:

"There are threescore queens, and fourscore concubines, and virgins without number. My dove, my undefiled is but one; she is the only one of her mother, she is the choice one of her that bare her. The daughters saw her, and blessed her; yea, the queens and the concubines, and they praised her."

—Song of Sol. 6:8,9. While there is but one bride, there are many attendants. Doubtlessly there will be many saved people who will make up the queens, the concubines and virgins — the attendants — yet they will not in any wise at all be a part of the bride.

"And he saith unto me, Write, Blessed are they which are called unto the marriage supper of the Lamb. And he saith unto me, These are the true sayings of God."—Rev. 19:9.

Baptists, I DO NOT MEAN TO SAY THAT ALL BAPTISTS WILL BE IN THE BRIDE. There are many Baptists today whose doctrines are a disgrace to our Baptist name. I am definitely positive that the Baptists who have compromised church truths on the great doctrines of baptism and the Lord's Supper, that they will not in any wise at all be a part of the bride. Surely the Baptists whose doctrine has been a compromise for popularity's sake will not deserve to be a part of the bride. Likewise, the Baptists who have lived alone for this world and what it could offer will surely be nothing more than invited guests. Those Baptists who have been united with worldly organizations, such as fraternal organizations, and who have put their time and money that ought to have gone to the cause of Christ into these worldly organizations - surely these will be in no wise a part of the bride. In other words no Mason, Oddfellow, Red Man or any other lodge man-no Catholic, Jew or Protestant,-and no immoral, worldly compromising Baptist will be any part of the bride. The bride will be a very select number of those whose consecration, fidelity, and love of the truth is unquestioned.

Let me insist, beloved, in the light of these Scriptures and likewise in the light of human reasoning that the bride will be a very small group—a select number of Baptists who have been loyal to the Word of God. I don't know just who will make up the bride, but I am positive that there will be a far greater number of guests and attendants than there will be of those who will compose the bride.

Don't misunderstand me: All saved people are going to Heaven, whether Baptists, Catholics, or Protestants. If redeemed by the blood of our Lord Jesus, then you are sure of Heaven, but you will not be in the bride unless your life and doctrine definitely conforms to the Word of God.

III

THE REJECTED SUITORS.

No wedding would be complete without a list of those who "also ran." There will be a tremendous throng of these rejected suitors. All Catholics will be in this group. All Protestants will likewise be in this group.

Both the Catholics and the Protestants have offered their churches to the world, and the world, in the main, has accepted them. Some say that the voice of the majority is the voice of God. This is definitely untrue. The voice of the Bible is the voice of God.

The Bible definitely predicts the total destruction and the complete annihilation of both thou sawest upon the beast these shall hate the whore, and shall make her desolate and naked and shall eat her flesh and burn her with fire." —Rev. 17:16

This is also in accord with the teachings of our Lord in the day of His flesh for He likewise spoke of the destruction of these false churches.

Even the best there is about us appears as the worst of filth in the sight of God.

The prophet Isaiah indicates that we are to be clothed in a robe of righteousness which has been provided by another.

(Continued from page one) ED that this should be the plan.

The reason we should tithe as Christians — yet not keep the Sabbath—is due to the fact that there is no N. T. teaching that we should keep the Sabbath, and is due likewise to the fact that the Lord's day, which began to be observed as the worship day, conserves the same principle of devoting a seventh of one's time to the Lord.

But Just Why Should A Christian Tithe?

1. Because God says so. This we have shown from I Cor. 9: 7-12. (Matt. 23:23 places the stamp of Christ's approval on tithing, although condemning failure to attend to even more important matters).

2. Because God has branded failure to tithe as "God robbery." (See Mal. 3:7-10). The question is, does God consider a thing highly honorable today among Christians, which he considered thievery back in the days of Israel?

3. Because tithing is the key to financial prosperity. (See Mal. 3:10,11. Also see 2 Cor. 9:6 and Prov. 3:9,10). It was back in times of the past. If you want to argue that it is different now, then just read Mal. 3:6.

Multiplied thousands have testified to the Lord's blessings that have followed the practice of tithing. We have known scores of such in our own experience, and we have the word of such men as H. J. Heinz, and LeTurneau who is called "America's Layman No. 1."

The biggest piece of foolishness is for one to try to beat God in a financial deal. You can hold back your tithe but he can collect it in a doctor's bill, or a fire, or loss of job, or accident, or in some other way. The best possible advice to members of our churches financially, is the advice to tithe.

What if we have a surplus in our treasury? That hasn't a thing on earth to do with our financial duty to God-not a thing. Suppose you owe a debt, and the person you owe it to has plenty, does that cancel the debt?

4. Because the Lord's cause needs your tenth. We had to fight Japan because we didn't send enough missionaries to evangelize that nation. And we didn't send them because people failed to tithe. If they had tithed there would have been plenty of missionaries.

5. Bacause through tithing you can lay up rewards for the future. All you are going to retain in the end is that which you have used for the Lord. And you will use many times more for Him as a tither than otherwise.

6. Because tithing puts the Lord's cause up out of the realm of beggary. But take all of the tithers out, and we would be in financial straits in our church-

"THERE WILL BE A SECOND CHANCE AFTER DEATH"

There have been and still are heretics in the land who teach that: "There will be a second chance after death." Charles T. Russell wrote six volumes which he called "Studies in the Scriptures," and in Volume I, pages 106, 107, 111, and 129 he teaches that men will have a second chance for salvation during the Millennium. Then in Volume I, page 143, he teaches that the second trial will be more favorable than the first one was. In the same volume, page 143, he teaches that Christ's work on the cross simply guarantees a second chance. On page 178 of Volume VI he says that should Nero during the Millennium become obedient, he will be saved, will be highly respected and his past forgotten. So is the teaching of "Russellism" which today is called "Jehovah's Witnesses."

This idea or popular misconception is only good for the "Hell Box" because it is a lie from the beginning. In Luke 16:19-31 we see the rich man, in Hell pleading with Abraham to send Lazarus back to his

father's house to preach to his five lost brothers. If there is a second chance after death, and if it is more favorable than the first chance before death, then why would the rich man in Hell want a missionary sent from paradise to preach to his five lost brothers? Why not leave them alone and let them eat, drink and be merry, because the second chance will be more favorable than the first was? Then if they are not saved when given the second chance the penalty according to Russell will only be a second death which is annihilation, Volume 3, page 117.

If there is a second chance after death, then why didn't the Lord Jesus give the lost preachers who had prophesied, and cast out devils, and had done many wonderful works in His name, a second chance? Instead of giving these lost preachers a second chance the Lord Jesus said that He never knew them and told them to depart. Matt. 7:22-23. If there is a second chance after death then two men will never have that chance because the two men will be cast into Hell alive. Rev. 19:20 and 20:10.

There is no second chance after death because, "It is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment.' Hebrews 9:27. We are told in John 5:22 that the Father hath committed all judgment unto the Son. After death the Lord Jesus Christ will be a Judge and not a Saviour. At death the lost person goes to Hell (Hades) and is tormented. Luke '19:22-23. Then at the second resurrection these lost tormented souls in Hades will be brought before the Lord Jesus as Judge (not as Saviour) and there before the great white throne He will judge them (not save them) according to their works and then cast them into gehenna or the lake of fire where they will have "their part" or degrees of punishment in Hell forever and forever. Rev. 20:11-15 and 21:8, Matt. 11:22, 24, Mark 12:40.

There is no second chance after death because, "Now (not after death) is the accepted behold now (not after time: death) is the day of salvation." II Cor. 6:2. So we see that the popular idea that, "There will be a second chance after death" is only good for the "Hell Box."



3. Our Southern Baptist convention leadership, to a man, is committed to the inclusive policy. Whether a pastor believes anything or nothing is none of the convention's business, so long as he supports the cooperative program and sends in large gifts; that settles everything. His church also may practice open membership; but that, too, is none of the convention's business! So why not unite with the new American **Baptist** convention?

Leaders Modernists

It is true that most of the leaders of this new American Baptist convention are modernists, liberalists or outright Unitarians; but that also, forsooth, is none of the convention's business. We are sure that our inclusive-minded leaders would forgive all such Northern Baptist leaders readily—if only they came through with large gifts to the cooperative program.

any cooperating Missionary Baptist church or pastor, no matter what they believe and practice or do not believe or practice, why should we hesitate any longer about reuniting with the American Baptist convention?

The president, Bro. R. G. Lee, says (in Religious New Service) that it will be a "man-size" job to reunite the two conventions; but he does not say that he is opposed to it. And Bro. Pruden hastens to announce that he hopes to "contribute to possible reunion of the two big branches of the church." So we are on our way to reunion. Why not?

4. Then Northern Baptists hold a formidable club over the heads of Southern Baptists-If we refuse to reunite with them, they will unite with the Disciples of Christ and thus have churches all over the south and west. For several years, they have had a 6-point working agreement with the Disciples. (See Unionizing Southern Baptists, page 9.) Also they have had committee after committee to explore all the difficulties and all the advantages of a union with the Disciples. And we predict that if this "son of peradventure," Bro. E. H. Pruden, is rebuffed by our Southern Baptist convention or its leaders this defacto union with the Disciples will be made de jure within the next five years. So we can take it or leave it. For Bro. Pruden will not fail to lift this formidable club over the heads of our Southern Baptists.

have already taken five definite steps toward reuniting with Northern Baptists. For example (1) Northern and Southern Baptist churches in Washington, D. C. are already united. (2) We have a Standing committee on common problems with Northern Baptists. (3) We have a Joint committee, known as the Inter-Convention committee on Negro Ministerial education. (4) We do not hesitate to elect such outright Northern Baptists as Bro. C. Oscar Johnson, to the vicepresidency of our convention and to place many Northern Baptists on our boards. (5) And our Foreign Mission board is pouring out great sums of our relief funds to the populations in distinctly Northern Baptist mission territory and, no doubt, on the request of the Foreign Mission Society of Northern Baptists.

Also we know that we have had a rather respectable group in the Southern Baptist convention, for some years, who were in fact Northern Baptists. And since Southern Baptist leaders have given public notice, at least a dozen times in the last year, that they will oppose any sort of a restriction, made by the convention, against
