Another claims to be a Baptist because the Baptist Church was more convenient to attend than the other churches, or because all the family for generations have been Baptists.

I believe people should be Baptists because of convictiona conviction based upon the Word of God. For this reason I have chosen as my subject "Three Reasons Why I'm A Baptist." These reasons may not be the same for being a

Baptist, but I can assure you that you can have no better reasons than these.

Other voices speak to a preacher other than Holy Spirit.

I. THE INDIVIDUAL RE-SPONSIBILITY TO GOD. The Bible teaches that every man is responsible for his own conduct and life. This is taught in II Cor. 5:10: "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in His body, according to that he hath (Continued on page two)

How Mormon Polygamy And The Reign **Of The Anti-Christ Are Connected**

The practice of polygamy still flourishes in the "underground" or "underworld" of Mormonism.

As for the "sacred principle" itself, the Mormon Fundamentalists continue loudly to champion it.

Despite congressional action against polygamy the Mormon leaders supported the "open advocacy" of the practice as long as possible. Hundreds went to jail rather than give up the "right" to be polygamous.

In 1886, Congress passed the stringent Edmunds-Tucker law which aimed to destroy the whole financial and ecclesiasti-cal system of Mormonism. It was only when the Supreme Court upheld this law and the overlords of the Mormon Church feared for the confiscation of their property and the disruption of their entire

worldly ecclesiastical domain in Utah that the Mormon leadership agreed to stop teaching polygamy as a religious duty and doctrine.

Why did they do it?. Because they ceased to believe that "plural marriage" is right? Certainly not!

Consider the words of their 'petition" for amnesty: "To be at peace with the Government and in harmony with their fellow citizens who are not of their faith, and to share in the confidence of the Government and the people, our people have voluntarily put aside something (plural marriage) which all their lives they have believed to be a sacred principle." (This was in 1891.)

But in 1886, President John Taylor announced a "revelation" to the effect that the "law of polygamy" remained the "law of heaven." In the light of the 1886 "revelation" the 1891 profession of "putting aside" polygamy appears to be a hollow pretense or insincere gesture. For the sake of preserving property or attaining "peace with the Government," men may cease to teach polygamy openly, but it still remains the eternal law of the Mormons and

For the benefit of those who might believe that a man can be lost after he has been saved, I approach this question in a new way, in that I want to show you what a believer must do in crder to be lost.

(Continued from page one) done, whether it be good or bad," and again in Rom. 14.4 and again in Rom. 14:4 we read: "Who art thou that judges another man's servants? To his own master he standeth or falleth. Yea, he shall be holden up: for God is able to make him stand."

For this reason we do not believe in god-fathers, god-mothers, or sponsors who pledge and promise that others shall do or refrain from doing certain things. One person cannot repent for another, or believe in Christ for another, or serve God for another. Each individual must repent for himself, believe for himself and serve God for himself; hence, the individual's responsibility to God.

Because of this belief in the individual's responsibility to God, we reject infant baptism believing that the individual should decide for himself whether he is to be baptized or not. The same is true of church membership, etc. Baptists have been prevented from religious persecution because of this doctrine. They have suffered persecution, both in the old world and in the new; but they have a clean record as far as religious persecution is concerned.

One of the darkest blots on American History is the record of the religious persecution of John Clark, Obadiah Holmes, and John Crandall, Baptist

and scourged for preaching the gospel and refusing to practice infant baptism (see Christian's History of Baptists, Chapter 21, Page 379-380).

Baptists have ever been the champions of religious freedom. They are responsible for the clause being inserted in The Constitution of The United States of America, which guarantees religious freedom. The clause reads as follows: "Congress shall make no law, establishing articles of faith, or mode of worship or prohibiting the free exercise of religion or abridging the freedom of speech or of the press, or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, or to petition to the General Government for a redress or grievances." (A History of the Baptists by John T. Christian, Page 392).

II. THE SCRIPTURES SUFFICIENT RULE OF FAITH AND PRACTICE. Baptists hold that the Bible is the sufficient rule of faith and practice, in religious matters and refer to II Tim. 3: 16,17, which reads as follows: "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof. for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works," and II Peter 1:20, 21, which reads as follows: "Knowing this first, that no prophecy of the Scripture is of any private interpretation. For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost. They believe this is sufficient authority for holding the belief that the Scriptures are a complete and sufficient rule of faith and practice in all matters pertaining to the worship and service of God.

Therefore, we reject all the Bulls of the Pope, Decrees of the Councils, and Traditions of the Elders. Baptists obtain all of their doctrines from the Bible which they believe to be the Word of God by Inspiration given; hence, we say, "If it's in the

preachers who were imprisoned Bible it's Baptist doctrine; and if it's Baptist doctrine, you'll find it in the Bible."

Baptists believe that there should be no addition, no subtraction, and no substitution for the Word of God. Therefore, we reject sprinkling for immersion, Open Communion for the Lord's Supper, and conscience and sentiment exalted above Scripture.

Baptist's believe that three things are necessary to constitute Scriptural Baptism: namely, the Proper Person-a believer in the Lord Jesus Christ; the Proper Symbol - picturing the death, burial and resurrection of Christ; and the Proper Authority - a New Testament church. The lack of any one of these three facts fails to produce Scriptural baptism. Baptists believe that the proper observance of the Lord's Supper requires the Proper Place, the proper purpose, Proper Participants, as well as the proper elements. Eating bread and drinking wine does not necessarily mean that the Lord's Supper is being observed. Baptists demand a "thus saith the Lord" for their actions.

III. THE CHURCH A COM-PLETE SELF-GOVERNING BODY. Baptists believe in the sovereignty of the church. They hold that the highest authority on earth is a local (there is no other kind) Baptist Church; that there is no authority on earth that supercedes a local Baptist Church. This association, the State Baptist Convention, the Southern Baptist Convention, or any board created by such, has no authority whatever over the government of a Baptist Church, which is a New Testament Church. Baptists hold (or believe) that one Baptist Church has as much authority to govern itself as another. The little church consisting of 12 members at the crossroads, has as much authority to determine the manner of its cooperation and the extent of its cooperation in the matter of government and practice as the First Baptist Church with thousands of members.

The Baptist Church recognizes Christ as its Head, the Bible as its rule book, the Holy Spirit as its leader, and missions as its mission on the earth. Baptists find no authority in the Scriptures for believing in a Universal visible or invisible church. The Scriptures tell us that a New Testament Church (which is a Baptist Church) is an organized body of baptized believers in Jesus Christ. He founded the first one and promised to it perpetuity (Matt. 16:18), and from that good day unto the present time and until the return of Christ, Missionary Baptist Churches will continue to exist on this earth.

The church that Christ founded was a Missionary Baptist Church for the following reasons: First, it was organized of Baptist material; second, it was given a missionary program; third, it was promised perpetuity; fourth, it is the only church in existence whose history can be traced back to the days of the Apostles. Bro. George W. McDaniel, former president of the Southern Baptist Convention, and long-time pastor of the First Baptist Church of Richmond, Virginia, and who is now with his Lord, had the following to say about the origin of Baptists "To be well-born is to enter life with an advantage. Baptists are justly proud of their beginning-the New Testament. They have an ancient and Scriptural origin. Certain characters in history are named as founders of various denominations. The Disciples began with Alexander Campbell, the Methodists with John Wesley, the Presbyterians with John Calvin, the Lutherans with Martin Luther, and the Church of England with Henry VIII. Not so with the Baptists. There is no personality this side of Jesus Christ who is a satisfactory explanation of their ori-The New Testament gin. churches were independent, self-governing, democratic bodies like the Baptist churches of today. We originated, not at the Reformation, not in the Dark Ages, nor in any century after the Apostles, but our marching orders are the Commission. The First Baptist Church was the church at Jerusalem. Our principles are as old as Christianity, and we acknowledge no founder but Christ."

To be a Baptist is a great privilege as well as a great honor. Baptists should take the matter of church membership more seriously, and they should serve with greater zeal the Head of the Church to which they belong.

"Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot."-I Pet. 1:18,19.

Beloved, if you have been saved, you have been bought by the Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, you no longer belong to yourself. This is what Paul meant when he wrote to the Christians at Corinth, when he said:

"For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit which are God's."-I Cor. 6:20. Beloved, you have been bought by the Lord Jesus Christ and you no longer belong to yourself. If you can be lost after you have been saved, you would have to have your owner's consent to sell yourself This, we know, is an again. utter impossibility, for when Jesus Christ bought you, He. didn't buy you for resale, that he might sell you again. Rather, He bought you for His own precious possession forever. Listen:

agorazo," which means that it is bought with the understanding that it is never again to be sold. Listen, brother, sister, you have been bought once by Jesus Christ, and for you to be sold again you would have to get your owner's consent, which is impossible. When Jesus Christ went to Calvary He bought you with the understanding that you would never again be sold.

Thank God, when a man is saved once, he is saved forever. When a man becomes a child of God, He can never again be sold into sin.

FOR A BELIEVER TO BE LOST, HE MUST PROVE THE WORD "EVERLASTING" CAN HAVE TWO DIFFERENT MEANINGS IN THE BIBLE.

If you will turn to the Word of God, you will find that the word "everlasting" is used forty-three times to qualify the life we have in Christ. Let's notice also how else it is used.

In Mt. 25:46 it describes the punishment of the wicked.

"And these shall go away into everlasting punishment: but the righteous into life eternal." In Rom. 16:26 it describes the

character of God's existence.

"But now is made manifest, and by the Scriptures of the prophets, according to the commandment of the everlasting God, made known to all nations for the obedience of faith."

In II Tim. 2:10 it describes the duration of Christ in glory.

"Therefore I endure all things for the elect's sake, that they may also obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory."

In II Pet. 1:11 it describes the duration of Christ's kingdom.

"For so an entrance shall be ministered unto you abundantly into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

Now, beloved, if the word "everlasting" is used forty-three times to qualify the life we have when we believe on Jesus Christ, it does mean everlasting salvation in the sense

have to prove that it has two meanings,-and that is utterly ridiculous. It is sheer nonsense. It is positive absurdity. If the word "everlasting" means "everlasting" when you talk about the character of God and the duration of Christ's kingdom and the duration of Christ in glory, and if it means "ever-lasting" and "eternal" when you talk about the punishment of the wicked, then surely the word "everlasting" means "eternal" when we talk about the salvation which is ours in Jesus Christ.

I tell you this morning, for a believer to be lost, he would have to prove that the word "everlasting" has two meanings within the Bible.

CONCLUSION

Beloved, whenever any individual can do all these things, then he can preach "falling from grace," but until he is able to do so, he has no right to ever lift his voice to talk about being saved once and then being lost after he has been saved.

I am glad this morning that I can present to you a Saviour who not only saves, but keeps. I am glad to tell you of Christ who went to Calvary and who died, not for a part of your sins, but for all of them. I am glad to tell you of a Christ who poured out His life's blood at Calvary to pay for all of your sins. Oh, may you believe on Him, and having thus believed, may it be a sweet morsel to you as you go about your daily tasks just to fall back upon this, that you are secure in the Lord Jesus Christ.
