heart of Baptist churches on July 31, 1950 by a decision handed down by Judge R. J. Thrift, Circuit Court Judge, in any other Fayetteville, West Va. Court on that day. A blow was struck at the cularly Masonry. For about and 42 who were not members two years the struggle has been going on. On last December 7, 1949, the church excluded about 85 members for non-support and public conduct which brought shame upon the church. To this number was added 42 persons whose names were not on the membership roll of the church. The suit against the church was brought against it on behalf of 130 persons.

These 130 persons were in the following categories: active, 54; inactive (no right to vote), 34; at all! A paper had been circulated, getting this number of signers, the object of the petition being to run the pastor away, and to destroy the church constitution. As long as the pastor said nothing about lodges in the previous years (four), he got along fine and there was no complaint to the pastor or church officials about the church constitution. But when the forces of evil (lodge people and their sympathizers) rose up

TRAGEDIES RECORDED IN

(Read John 3:1-18).

I say by way of preface that the word "tragedy" itself is not found in all the Bible, but the principle of tragedy is found all the way through the Bible. The word itself is not to be found within the Bible, but from Genesis to Revelation there are multiplied instances of tragedies in the Bible.

I recognize the fact that the majority of people don't like to think about tragedies. I judge that it is true of you, and I know it is true of me. I am satisfied that the majority of people would rather think about comedy than they would trage-

dy, but regardless of what your preference is, the fact remains that tragedy stalks this world day by day. Tragedy comes into your life and into mine, and, beloved, there are many tragedies recorded within the Word

During the last week end the long week end of July 4th - the papers tell that there are approximately 800 tragedies in the United States — people that met death in a tragic manner. It seems almost impossible to think that there could be 800 tragic deaths within the United States over one week end, yet, beloved, what was true this

week end will be true for every week end, perhaps not to as great an extent, but there will be tragedies, for tragedy continues day by day in life.

I want you to see what is true with us has been true all the way through the Word of God, for the Bible records numbers of tragedies that took place.

THE TRAGEDY OF SIN'S ENTRANCE INTO THIS WORLD.

Three years ago I almost took a vow that I'd never again stain the pages of THE BAPTIST EXAMINER with the name, J. Frank Norris. Considering him the most outstanding religious scroundrel that has walked the face of God's footstool in all ages, and knowing that the majority of our readers consider him in the same manner, I have thus refrained from speaking of him for the past three years.

I have said that ultimately he would be discredited in the eyes of the world, and now that prophecy has come true.

His entire empire is now tottering. He has been fired as pastor of the Temple Baptist Church, Detroit, Michigan. His school in Fort Worth is split in shreds. His mission office has been moved to Fort Worth. The most faithful men that have ever been his friends have now repudiated him.

There was a time when I would have sworn by him, yet like hundreds of others I have learned that he could never be trusted. No preacher has existed whose morals, ethics, standards or principles were lower. No preacher in America has had more good men as friends for a time than J. Frank Norris. Of course, the triumvirate of years' standing still exists: Norris, Luther Peak, and Louis Entzminger. They still hang to-. gether and they had better, for if they don't, they will hang separately. Each knows too much concerning the other for there to ever be a separation of these three.

When Entzminger and Norris temporarily separated a few years ago, Entzminger said worse things concerning Norris than I ever dared to say. I have the letters which Entzminger wrote. Both he and Peak know the character of Norris, and Norris knows the character of these two. But while these three cling together like the thieves of Bagdad who feared to separate, the balance of Norris' empire is fast slipping from him. Future history of not many days hence will prove Norris to be the most discredited preacher on this North American continent.

To the Membership of the Temple Baptist Church:

Recent vicious attacks upon our God-given leader, Mr. Vick, impel us to let you and the world know that we have made a thorough, careful and prayerful study of all the issues involved.

When we gave Dr. Norris an invitation to appear before us to present his side of the case, it was at once apparent to everyone of us present that Dr. Norris desired merely to use that meeting with us as a sounding board to vent his personal spleen against Mr. Vick and to indulge in low, vile gossip and innuendo and bring in matters which had no connection with the issues involved - even while he was, in the same breath, telling how much he loved Mr. Vick and his family.

We found from testimony of our own Office Force, and from personal testimony of quite a number of the Preachers of our Fellowship, and from the testimony of numbers of our fine young men who were ministerial students at the Seminary that Dr. Norris has repeatedly distorted facts and deliberately misrepresented the case. On the other hand, we have not found a single instance in which Mr. Vick has misrepresented facts nor where he has failed to conduct himself as an honest, honorable Christian gentleman.

Dr. Norris' attacks upon Mr. Vick are an attack upon the Temple Baptist Church and an obvious attempt to harm this great soul-winning church which he has professed to love and from which he received a salary for many years.

To all spiritually-minded Christian people it should be very apparent that these pitiful attacks are but the products of a mind that has turned to low, vicious things. That is why the Deacons of the Temple Baptist Church voted 25 to 0 to recommend to the church that we sever all connections with Dr. J. Frank Norris which recommendation was adopted by the church by the overwhelming vote of approximately 3000 to 7.

than to live on by himself, sinned also. Thus the first pair that was ever placed here within this world died spiritually, and they as the federal head of the human race, caused all of us to die spiritually that day. Lis-

"For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous." -Rom. 5:12.

Beloved, to me that was a tragedy to think that Adam sinned and passed that sinful nature on to his children, so that we today are all born as sinners. I say, beloved, that was tragedy—the entrance of sin into the human family.

This last week end a man whom I knew rather intimately, was killed. As I thought of that individual's family, it struck me forcibly as to what a tragedy that that man was taken in death. As I was thinking of this, I also remembered some-

time ago of a family here in Kentucky that was going to church one morning, and when their car stalled on the tracks, a fast train demolished the car, killing the father, the mother, and all six children. There Bibles and eight Sunday School quarterlies picked up after that wreck had taken place. I tell you, beloved, when you think of those eight individuals on their way to the House of God, and their lives snuffed out in a moment's time. it is no wonder that the daily paper referred to it as one of Kentucky's outstanding tragedies of all times.

Beloved, the greatest tragedy though that ever struck the human race wasn't the falling of an airplane. nor was it the striking of a train against an automobile, nor was it the failing of a submarine to rise to the top of the water, nor was it a motorcycle accident, nor a train wreck, nor a sinking of a ship,

but the greatest tragedy that ever confronted this world was the tragedy that came the day that Adam sinned and all humanity became sinners in Adam. Listen:

"As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one: There is none that understandeth, there is none that seeketh after God. They are all gone out of the way, they are together become unprofitable; there is none that doeth good, no, not one. Their throat is an open supulchre; with their tongues they have used deceit; the poison of asps is under their lips: Whose mouth is full of cursing and bitterness: Their feet are swift to shed blood: Destruction and misery are in their ways: And the way of peace have they not known: There is no fear of God before their eyes."-Rom. 3:10-18.

Here are fourteen charges which God brings against the human family in His indictment concerning us. You can't

It would seem to me that child of God ought to love God enough to live for Him. know as well as I that there are multiplied thousands Christians today though, whose lives come far short of what

(Continued from page two) God demands as a standard for us within His Word. Just be honest this morning, beloved. Don't you have a hard time yourself living like God wants you to live? Even though you love Him with all your heart, don't you have a hard time living for Him? I tell you, beloved, it is a tragedy to see Christians living in sin.

I believe that Ananias, of whom we read in the early chapters of the book of Acts, was a saved man. I don't think that I could prove it, but I believe he was a child of God. I think he was a Christian because he was associated with the Christians of that early church, but Ananias sinned and sinned grievously, both in the sight of God and in the sight of that church.

There was a godly man by the hame of Barnabas who saw that there was distress among the poor of the church, and he sold his property and gave it to the church. Accordingly, everyone thought of Barnabas as a great character and a marvelous Christian. When Ananias heard the people singing the praise of Barnabas as a great man of God, he became jealous. He wanted the praise that Barnabas was getting but he wasn't willto pay the price that Barn-as had paid. He sold his property and brought a part of the price and brought a part of the price, not all of it, and laid down at the apostle's feet. He said that he had brought all of the money but the Word of God tells us that he only brought a part of it. Immediately Ananias fell dead. When his wife came in later, not knowing that her husband was dead, she, too, acted out the same lie and fell dead and was carried out for burial. Here were two people who died because they lied to the Lord. I think they were saved people and I am satisfied that in the main, they were good people, but they lied to the Lord and res the church and the Lord Figw them.

I might pause and say, be-loved, it is a good thing that God doesn't treat liars like that today. If He did, we would have more deaths in the average Baptist church than we would have people to take care of the dead.

Let's look at another example within the Word of God. There isn't isn't a doubt in my mind but what Simon Peter was a saved man and is in Heaven today. We find these words concerning him:

You who are KEPT by the power of God through faith unto salvation ready to be revealin the last time."

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—I Pet. 1:5. Simon Peter did a lot of wrong while he was here in this life. In the book of Luke Will find that he did everyhing and anything but what a Christian ought to have done. When they arrested the Lord Jesus Christ, Simon Peter followed afar off, and when they indled a fire. Simon Peter sat down around that fire and Warmed his hands by the enemies' campfire.

tell you, beloved, it is a terrible thing for a child of God to find his fellowship with the enemies of our Lord. Every han outside of Jesus Christ is en enemy of the Son of God. Every unsaved man is an enemy to the Christ If you to the cause to Christ. If you get e a saved person and you get fellowship by association with that the people, that just means that you are finding fellowship with the Lord with the enemies of the Lord

Jesus Christ.

As Simon Peter sat around the enemies' campfire, three people accused him of being one of Jesus' disciples. In an effort to convince them that he wasn't a saved man, he turned loose with a volley of good oldfashioned, Baptist deacon cuss words. Look at him. He followed afar off, and he sat down and warmed his hands around the enemies campfire, and he has denied his Lord three times. Now he punctuates that denial with profanity. He doesn't look much like a saved man and he certainly doesn't act like one, but, beloved, he is saved. How do we know it? Why he tells us himself later on that he has been kept by the power of God.

Oh, what a tragedy it was that day for Christianity and for the cause of Christ for Simon Peter to sin when our Lord was just a few feet away and needed his help so grievously! Brother, sister, our Lord isn't far from us today. Even though He is in Heaven today, He still lives in us. I say to you, it is a tragedy for a child of God to live in sin. If Christ is living in you, then when you live in sin you are subjecting Jesus Christ to the presence of sin and you are making, compelling, forcing, the Son of God to witness the sin in your life. I tell you, as surely as He looks down upon us today, it is a tragedy for God's people to live in sin.

III

THE TRAGEDY OF LOVING THE WORLD MORE THAN

Only an unsaved person loves the world more than God. No Christian could be guilty of that sin. A Christian might live according to his flesh but only an unsaved person can love this world more than he does God.

Lot was a saved man. The Word of God tells us that he was a righteous man and that his soul was vexed by the unlawful and ungodly things the people of Sodom did. Even though Lot was a saved man, his wife was unsaved. On that memorable day when they were coming out of the city of Sodom in an attempt to make their escape therefrom, Lot's wife turned around and looked back in the direction of the flames of Sodom, and instantly was turned into a pillar of salt. Here was a woman who loved the world more than she did God. She had two alternatives could turn back to Sodom that she loved, or she could believe the Word of God. When God spoke to her and gave her warning as to the consequences of turning back, she made her choice, and God turned her into a pillar of salt. What a tregedy it was that she loved the world more than she did God!

Judas Iscariot is a good example also. See him as he comes to the high priest and makes a trade with them, saying, "What will you give me and I will betray Him into your hand?" When they covenanted with him for 30 pieces of silver (exactly \$15.95 in our American coin), Judas Iscariot went out to betray the Son of God into the hands of His enemies. He couldn't have been a saved man, for a saved man couldn't have done what he did. Jesus had already referred to him as a devil, for He said:

"Have not I chosen you twelve, and one of you is a devil?"—John 6:70.

I say to you, it is a tragedy to find a person that loves the world more than he loves God. There may be some woman here this morning whose heart is

"If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land."—II Chron. 7:14.

"If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me." -Psa. 66:18.

"Because I have called, and ye refused; I have stretched out my hand, and no man regarded; But ye have set at nought all my counsel, and would none of my reproof: I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when your fear cometh; When your fear cometh as desolation, and your destruction cometh as a whirlwind; when distress and anguish cometh upon you. Then saved since Jesus Christ has shall they call upon me, but I will not answer; they shall seek me early, but they shall not find me: For that they hated knowledge, and did not choose the fear of the Lord: They would none of my counsel: they despised all my reproof. Therefore shall they eat of the fruit of their own way, and be filled with their own devices."-Prov. 1:24-31.

and would rather satisfy their bodily appetites and passions and desires than anything else in this world. It is a tragedy to love the world more than you love God.

IV

THE TRAGEDY OF ANY LIFE TO BE LIVED ACCORD-ING TO THE FLESH.

Whether saved or unsaved, it

makes no difference. It is a tragedy for any life to be lived and governed solely by the flesh.

There isn't a doubt in my mind but what Samson was saved. If you will read the eleventh chapter of Hebrews, you will find that Samson is mentioned as one of the great heroes of faith. That to me is sufficient to convince me that Samson was a saved man and is in Heaven today. Samson didn't live like a saved man ought to live. He was controlled entirely by his flesh. If you will turn to the Word of God and read carefully the story of Samson, you will find that Samson could have been a mighty man in God's hand if it hadn't been for his flesh. Every chapter that tells the story of Samson gives an escapade of sin in his flesh. Without a single exception, every chapter that mentions Samson holds him up as a man who allowed his flesh to dominate his life.

He was a strong man physically and was endowed supernaturally and miraculously with additional strength from the Lord, yet instead of using that strength for the Lord, he wasted that strength by a life of the flesh. See him as he uses his strength for the Lord, taking in his hand the jawbone of an ass and slaying a tremendous throng of the enemies of our Lord. See him when he was used of God that he brought victory after victory in the name of the Lord, and then notice that after a victory was over, he would give himself over to the flesh. What a different story we would have concerning him if everything of Samson's life had been on the same plane that it was that day that he took that jawbone and slew those thousands of Philistines at one single time.

What a tragedy that any child of God might be controlled by his flesh! Oh, may God reach down this morning and help each of us that are saved, that our lives might be controlled by the Spirit of God rather than by our flesh.

THE TRAGEDY OF DYING UNSAVED.

It was bad enough that sin ever entered the human race, but God didn't leave sinners in that state. Beloved, God made a way whereby sinners might be saved. The Word of God tells us of the plan that was effected even before sin became a reality, for we read in Rev. 13 how Jesus was a Lamb slain from the foundation of the world. Long before sin became a reality, God had already planned man's redemption in Jesus Christ. What a tragedy then, beloved, that men die in sin and go out into Hell unsaved! What a tragedy to die undied on the Cross for sin!

Notice that rich young ruler who came to Jesus and boasted of the fact that he had kept the Ten Commandments. When our Lord put him to the test concerning the first of these, he failed on the test. If Jesus had put him to the test on everyone of those commandments, he would have failed just as miserably on the other nine as he did on the first one. See him as he turned away, loving his gold more than he loved his God, proving that the very first commandment had not been kept in his life.

(Continued from page one) against the preaching and publishing of the Word of Truth, they used the church constitution as their stooge to put forward. However, all people in the State of West Virginia know that it is purely a struggle between the church of the Lord Jesus Christ and the ungodly Masonic system, and its evil

The Masonic judge set aside the church constitution in his decision. The constitution was adopted by a unanimous vote of the church several years ago. On page four of the constitution is the following: "BAPTISTS STAND FOR THE BIBLE. IT IS THEIR LAW, THEIR CREED, AND FINAL AU-

THORITY IN ALL MATTERS RELATING TO FAITH AND PRACTICE." The judge took no notice whatever of the fact that the Bible is the authority on excluding members from a Baptist church. Details concerning this part of church life were not inculcated in the constitution for the reason quoted above from the constitution. The persons were excluded from Ansted Baptist Church on scrip tural grounds: but the judge set aside the Bible also.

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This decision must not be allowed to stand! ! By judicial edict the judge placed, over the vote of the church, 130 unwanted people on the roll of mem bers, 42 of whom were not mem; the ed bers at all. By despotic and dictatorial language to be expected only from a Hitler, also removed the pastor of the Made church as moderator of its busi anythin ness sessions. There is an en try on the records of the church soon after the present pastor took up his work as pastor recording the fact that the church book elected the pastor to be the moderator over its business ses sions. This action by the church has never been rescinded by the unders

Since when, in America, di we begin living under a system that provides for a judge grant membership to non-mem bers of a church and to give him the power to set aside the vo of a church, and to remove pastor as moderator for church who had been duly elected to that office? Is such thing already here, or is thi merely a taste beforehand what all Baptist churches in the land may expect in the near fu

Before the judge's decision was made public, the Anste Baptist Church had already vol ed unanimously that if the de cision compromised its right and liberty in any manner, case would be appealed to State Supreme Court of Af peals. The church is fighting battle for all Baptist church Ansted Bapt everywhere. Church does not have the mo to appeal the case and furn necessary legal counsel. It v cost at least six hundred lars for the appeal alone. total cost of the case may close to fifteen hundred dollar They need the help of our Bal tist brethren, and other Chri tians, everywhere. "Come o' into Macedonia and help us They have only sixty days which to appeal, and two well of this is gone.
