previous article that the socalled faith-healer lacks faith himself, and therefore would not qualify as a healer according to Bible standards. Now let us look at prayer, and see for ourselves through the Word of God that the faith-healer (and all others who follow his philosophy of prayer) are de-pending upon a false promise regarding prayer.

A definition of prayer by John Bunyan (Pilgrim's Progress) is the best I've seen -"Prayer is a sincere, sensible, affectionate pouring out of the heart or soul to God, through Christ, in the strength and assistance of the Holy Spirit, for such things as God hath promised, or according to Word, for the good of the the Church, with submission (in faith) to the will of God." Be-

fore we take up the Scripture lesson, let us look at this fine exposition of what one must do to pray. At first sight it looks as if he had left out that most important element of prayer which is—we can only expect fulfillment of prayer when we pray that all shall be to the glory of God, in the name of Jesus Christ. A study of His words will show that this element is covered in several ways -"according to the Word," "for the good of the church," with submission (in faith) to the will of God. What saith the petitioner to these things?

What saith the Lord? "And this is the confidence that we have in Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He heareth us: and if we know that He hear us, whatsoever we

A preacher friend wrote me recently of an experience that will admit that you don't know much about Him, won't you?"

This preacher friend of mine said, "That is right. Though I preached about Him, I'll admit I don't know much about Him; but what little I do know about Him has certainly changed my life.'

Beloved, what little that you and I know about God has changed our lives. The only thing in this world that will ever change your life is an experience of grace with God. I don't care what your sin may be, or how vile you may be in

it, an experience of grace will change your life. There is nothing else that can. You can join a church and be baptized and do anything else that you want to, but it won't change your life. There is only one thing that will change your life, and that is an experimental know-

ledge of God in Jesus Christ. This leads me to my text when the enemies of Jesus asked, "Who can forgive sins but God only?"

"Who Can Forgive

THIS IS AN AGE-OLD QUESTION.

It began in the Garden of Eden and has been a question from that time down to this. Men of all ages have discussed and have wondered about it. Adam was the first man that ever faced it. After he and Eve had sinned, they hid themselves from the presence of God. Even though they had made garments of fig leaves to cover their nakedness, they hid themselves from the presence of God. They were facing the problem of who can forgive sins, and it was the biggest problem that had ever come into their lives.

In the days of our Lord when, in the course of human events, Jesus spoke peace to a paralytic and raised him from a bed of paralysis, the enemies of our Lord, standing around criticizing His ministry, said as they spoke the words of my text, "Who can forgive sins but God only?" Even though they were the enemies of the Lord, they realized that none but God could forgive sin.

When Paul and Silas were incarcerated in the jail at Philippi, as they sang and prayed, God shook that old jail with an earthquake, loosed their bands, and delivered them from the The Philippian jailer prison.

"Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"—Acts 16:30.

I don't know whether that question had ever come into his life previously, but, beloved, the problem that stood out in his mind that night was the problem of the forgiveness of sin.

I say to you, you can begin at the book of Genesis and study all the way through the Word of God and you will be amazed at the fact that page after page, chapter after chapter, brings you face to face with this question, who can forgive sin? From the time the first man sinned, the question of forgiveness of sin has been uppermost and paramount in the minds of the fallen descendants of Adam.

MANY FALSE ANSWERS HAVE BEEN GIVEN TO THIS QUESTION.

Time would fail me to mention even briefly the false answers that have been given to this question as to who can forgive sins, but I'll mention a few that you might see how many, many false answers have been given.

In the Old Testament we read about the god of Molech. Mighty. few people today would dare to do what many parents did in the Old Testament dispensation, thinking they were pleasing

We read of heathen people who were troubled with this question as to who could forgive sin. Hoping to get forgiveness, they would bring their child and put a helpless infant up into the arms of that metal god, Molech, that had a fire built inside it and around it, and they burned their child as a living sacrifice while the priests would beat loudly upon their drums in order to drown the cry of the burning infant. Thus the priests of Molech offered an answer to this question as to who can forgive sin. They told the parents that their sins were forgiven because they had offered their own offspring as a sacrifice to the god of Molech.

Notice also that mother over in Africa who has gone down into the valley of the shadow of death to produce a life, and who loves her baby the same as you love yours. A heathen priest tells her that the answer to the question as to the forgiveness of sin lies in a sacrifice of her own child. She walks out to the Nile River and throws her babe in the river to the alligators, thinking that by the sacrifice she has made she will find peace and satisfaction with God, and that she will find the answer to the question of who can forgive sin.

Over in India they have an answer to this question. Once a year in the streets of a sacred city of India, they roll a big wheel, heavier than the wheel of a steam roller, along the street. Were it not for the efforts of the English government, multiplied thousands of those heathen would throw themselves underneath that wheel to be crushed, thinking that by such a self-sacrifice they will find the answer as to who can forgive sin. Before the English government saw to it that policemen lined the avenues to keep people from thus self-sacrificing themselves every year in their annual service of worship, thousands of those heathen would destroy themselves, thinking that by their self-destruction they had found the answer to this age-old question.

Again, beloved, there is that individual in many lands of the world today who is lying, with his body nude, upon a bed of spikes, thinking that by selftorture and affliction of his body he will find the answer to the

question, who can forgive sin. I have a preacher friend who is quite wealthy (by inheritance, of course), who, a few years ago, made a trip around the world to the various mission fields at his own expense and studied the situation as it confronted the missionaries all over the world. After returning to this country, he told me that the most pitiable sight he saw on any mission field was that of the people lying upon a bed of spikes, mutilating their bodies, trying to find the answer as to who can forgive sin.

In the light of our knowledge of the Word of God, to us these answers are far from the truth. Not a person here would dare offer his offspring to the god of Molech. Not a mother would dare to throw her child into the river to the alligators. Not a person would dare throw himself down to be crushed by a heavy wheel. Not one here would dare to lie upon a bed of spikes, hoping to find the answer to the question, who can Though forgive sin. wouldn't dare do these things, there are lots of other answers that have been given through the ages gone by, that are just as far-fetched.

Take for example the answer of the Catholics. The "Junior Catholic Messenger" of January 12, 1951, published under the seal of the Archbishop Cardus J. Alter of Cincinnati, Ohio, told how sins can be forgiven. Lis-

"Today the priest has this same power of forgiving sins. He has received it from Jesus. He says to us: 'I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.' These are called the words of absolution. The priest speaks them to us when we go to Confession. (To absolve means to forgive, or take away, sins.)

The sins that the priest forgives in the Sacrament of Penance are actual sins. No matter how many our sins are, or how great they are, they can be forgiven by the priest. But we must be sorry for them. We must confess them to the priest. We must be willing to do the penance he gives us. Then the words of absolution will take away all our sins.

WHAT PENANCE DOES FOR US

WHAT PENANCE DOES FOR US First, Penance takes away our sins, if we do our part correctly. It takes away both venial and mortal sins.

if we do our part correctly. It takes away both venial and mortal sins.

Second. the Sacrament gives us grace to keep from sin. Whenever we go to Confession, Jesus tells us what He said to the persons He forgave while He lived on earth: "Go, and sin no more." (He says this to us through the priest.) Then He also gives us grace to sin no more.

Third, this Sacrament increases the super-natural life of our soul. Often we may have no mortal sin when we go to Confession. In that case, we already have sanctifying grace when we receive the Sacrament.

Fourth, the Sacrament of Penance gives us back our merits ("good marks") if we have lost them through mortal sin. Suppose a person has done many good things while he was in the state of sanctifying grace. Each one of these good deeds will give him added merit, or good marks, for heaven. A mortal sin loses all these merits. A good Confession will give them back. It is like the Prodigal Son's getting

back his robe and sandals and ring after he came back to his father's house. So you see Penance does many things for us. Don't you think we should all receive it more often."

In the light of this editorial, you can see the Catholic position as to the forgiveness of sin —that is, you will be forgiven by the words of the priest when you in turn do certain acts of

I tell you, beloved, no priest, no rabbi, no preacher, nor no human being has any right to forgive sin. That right is the right of God. Even the enemies of our Lord said, in the words of my text, "Who can forgive sins but God only?"

There are other answers that have been given to this question as to who can forgive sin. We have a lot of modern answers in Christendom, some of them even in so-called Baptist churches, that are just as farfetched. Go in some churches and ask the question as to who can forgive sin, and they will tell you to come to the mourners bench, pray through, mourn for your sins, and the Lord will forgive you thereby.

Over in Ironton, Ohio, a few weeks ago, a man became very contrite because of his sinful condition. He sent for a Baptist preacher to come to his home at two oclock in the morning. He wanted to be saved. This preacher came, and when he found out what the man wanted, instead of him getting his Bible and showing him the truth that Jesus Christ died for his sins, and that the only way that any man can be saved is by seeing the truth that Jesus Christ died for his sins-instead of this, he told him that the best thing that he could do was to get right down beside his bed and pray. For two hours that preacher prayed with this man. This man told me himself that when those two hours had passed, he was still as much a sinner and as much lost as he was when he sent for that preacher to come to his home. Beloved, that preacher was ignorant as to who can forgive sin.

Just across the river, a man holding a revival meeting, stepped down from the rostrum and took hold of a bench and set it out about three feet. Then he walked around to the other end of the mourner's bench and set it out about three feet. He said, "You know what I have done? I have brought salvation three feet nearer to you."

Beloved, there are multiplied thousands of people who will put a mourner's bench up before people and tell them to pray, and confess their sins, and they will be saved. The most ignorant person in all the world ought to know better than that, even if he had never seen the Word of God. The more I read of God's Word, the more I am convinced that the mourner's bench is an abomination in the sight of God.

I am reminded of the Holiness man who lives nearby, who wanted to know where they got the mourner's bench. He went to a fellow who believed in the use of it, and said to him, "We use the mourner's bench in our church. Now where do we get it?" This fellow told him that he would look it up and let him know. A little later he came back and asked him again where they got the mourner's bench. This fellow said to him, "I tell you, I think we got it from the sawmill."

Listen, beloved, he told the truth, because he couldn't find it in the Bible. It just isn't there.

Of all the false answers that have been given as to the forgiveness of sins, probably the chiefest answer has been to join

the church and be baptized and do the best you can, and when you come down to die, just before you die confess all your sins and everything will be all right. Beloved, it isn't so. God doesn't forgive men because they are sorry that they are sinners and join the church and are baptized and do the best they can. God doesn't forgive any man on that basis.

"Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by the faith of Christ, and NOT BY THE WORKS OF THE LAW: for by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified."

-Gal. 2:16

Or that mother who is throwing her child in the rive She is sacrificing her child. Peru that man who throws himself underneath the heavy wheel and his life is crushed out. It is self-sacrifice. Or the man who lies upon a bed of spikes. He is sacrificing his own flesh and his own personal pleasure. Take the Catholic who does penance, who does without meat and eats fish, who does without other things for forty days, trying to get enough religion to permit him to live like the Devil the rest of the year. Mark it down, beloved, that is an old trick of the Devil; it can't be done. You have to have fresh grace everyday if you are going to live for the Lord. Yet his attempt is that of self-sacrifice.

The man who comes to the Jee mourner's bench is making a sacrifice in that he kneels and becomes contrite in the presence of God. The man who is trying to be saved on the basis of his own works is making a sacrifice personally. In everyone of these false answers, there is the element of sacrifice.

III

THE BIBLE GIVES THE TRUE ANSWER.

I insist, beloved, that sacrifice is necessary for an individual to be saved, but it isn't selfsacrifice. It is the sacrifice of Jesus Christ at Calvary.

Beloved, when you see that truth, you are saved. He is the sacrifice.





(Preceding page, Column four) a notice had to be published in the paper stating their intentions and requesting anyone who knew of any reason why they should not marry to present themselves and say so. Finally after making four trips to Iquitos-this requires a day to come down and at least a day for doing what had to be done and a day to go back. After three weeks they were able to get married. Brother Lewis, father and I went back with them. Took them back in the boat with Brother Lewis' motor. The water was down low and we had to walk for about an hour and a half through the woods, crossing about 20 foot logs. Our baggage was transferred to a smaller canoe and paddled up. A child of the brother of Don Adolfo had died the night before and most of the people had spent the night at the wake, drinking and dancing, so few came out to the service that night. The baptism was the next morning at 8:30 and a number came for that. Three were baptized-Don Adolfo Nunez, his wife Otilia and their daughter Lucia, who is 14, who made a profession of faith quite some time ago. She is quite small for her age. She apparently had infantile paralysis years back and both legs were affected, but she is able to walk. Don Adolfo is the Lieutenant Governor of the whole creek region and in exercising his authority should be able to give good testimony for the Lord. The children are already suffering persecution in school. In the service in the evening after the baptizing there were three professions of faith, three children of a sister of Don Adolfo. She is a believer and one of her boys had already made a profession of faith, but his father is a drunkard and no good and forbade the boy to be baptized. The woman cannot be baptized as she is not mar-The Momon River and Polis Creek are made up of just one turn after another. Brother Lewis rigged up a steering gear (portable, to be removed each time it is used so it won't be stolen) to attach to the outboard motor to make the steering easier. This is all for now. A boy grabbed on the back of a truck to steal a ride and fell off and broke his leg. The truck owner had to pay the doctor bill and now the boy's parents are bringing suit against the truck owner. truck driver did not know the boy was on his truck. The same law applies to us and the trailer, so we will have some one go along with a "club" to keep the children from getting hurt. We find the language difficult as there are so many rules to memorize, etc. The Lord was with those poor ignorant unlearned disciples (Acts 4:13) and the Lord has promised to be with his ignorant unlearned preacher in Iquitos, Peru, so we will keep trying and I am certain the Lord will bless. Lewis and Benny are well. Preparing meals here is a large task as everything has to be prepared. You can't step out to the local A&P and buy canned goods, etc. Am sorry to hear that the Smiths had to come home. We do pray for them, especially Mrs. Smith at this time. We pray for Billy that the Lord might keep him and his in good health. I am beginning to understand how much a young missionary needs the prayers of God's people. It is difficult to wage a warfare when one has few friends, the language is difficult and the majority of the people against you. I am thankful that the Hallums are here to help us in time of

"Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. And He that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because He (the Spirit) maketh intercession for the saints AC-CORDING TO THE WILL OF GOD." Romans 8:26,27.

See the 119th Psalm and observe how many times David requests the Lord to act according to His Word and His Will. See the model prayer as it starts with "Hallowed be thy name," continues with "Thy will be done," and finishes with "Thine is the glory." In this presumptuous age we need to lay hold of this thought — that we are not dictators to the throne of God. He is not bound nor indebted to fulfill OUR wishes. We are suppliants before the King's throne, desiring to know the King's will, and submissively willing to obey whatsoever He may command to be done. This even though His command may be just the opposite of our petition. Watch the Great Example as He prays-"And he went a little farther, and fell on His face, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me: NEVER-THELESS NOT AS I WILL, BUT AS THOU WILT." "He went away again the second time, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if this cup may not pass away from me, except I drink it, thy will be done." Matt. 26:39,42,44. The first time Jesus asked that the cup be removed, but agreed to abide by the Father's decision. The second time He shows that He realizes He may have to drink the cup, and He is showing His willingness to do the will of the The third time He Father. prays, He is obviously gathering strength from His communion with, dependance upon, and obedience to the Father. Jesus (and all the praying saints in the Bible) shows

us that we may be fully as-

sured that the Father's will is by far the best thing that can happen to us. (Romans 8:28).

Suppose the faith-healer had a night when it was the Lord's will that no one be healed; what would happen to the crowds that attend so faithfully the services of that fel-That, I assure you, will never happen for these fellows are NOT depending upon the will of God, but on their own wisdom, their own selectivity of certain kinds of diseases and ailments which are subject to their hypnotic suggestions or partial healing, and their own contrivance as to the people who appear in their "healing lines." You'll live a long time before you hear any of them say "it was the Lord's will that you remain crippled." No, they say, "You had too little faith." Since we are to pray accord-

ing to the Father's will, and

according to His Word, then let

us look behind these instructions and see why. Does not the Word tell us to do all to the glory of God, yea even that our purpose for existing is to glorify Him? If we ignore His Son, if we ignore His Will, if we ignore His Word, or any one of these, then we certainly are not seeking His glory. Let us then say that no prayer shall ever be answered if it fails to glorify God and Jesus Christ; furthermore no prayer may be answered unless it has the assistance of the Holy Spirit. God will not hear the prayers of the majority of people alive today because they are lost people, and their prayers are not pleasing to God at all -Isa. 64:6; Rom. 8:8; John 9:31. The others must pay close attention to James 4:3, "Ye ask, and receive not, BECAUSE ye ask amiss, that ye may consume it upon your lusts (pleasures in Greek)." To ask for personal help, such as healing, one must desire that help for the glory of God, then it must be according to the purpose and will of God before it can be fulfilled. Take Paul's prayer for deliverance from his "thorn in the flesh." He fulfilled the first condition, desiring freedom from physical ailment so that he could more freely serve the Lord Jesus Christ and glorify Him. But as for the fulfillment, he was told that the grace of God was sufficient. Paul accepted this answer as final and in latter days he gloried in his infirmity

ness PRAYER IS SPIRITUAL! It is our prayer that you will begin to see this important fact. Prayer is not carnal, not material, not physical, not fleshly, not selfish. One cannot expect to interest God in such things unless they will rebound to His This includes health which is a thing bound to this world. There will be no illness nor affliction in the world to come. Adam's sin brought these into this world and they will ever be in this world. Sin has so permeated human nature until body, mind, and soul are ruined—the understanding is darkened, and man is alienated from God. usually have many "converts" to show for it. But note what is the content of his testimonials, his pictures, his advertisements, You will find that he emphasizes the healing show. Is that not so? Doesn't he very slickly put that healing foot forward in order to draw the crowds? He will tell you that is so he can preach to them. He appeals to the fleshly nature in order to get spiritual results. Show me a place in God's Word where this is recommended, or in any way justified. On the contrary, we are constantly told to mortify the carnal desires of the flesh, and to magnify our spiritual nature. How many people in that healing line are actually sinners in need of the cleansing Blood of Jesus Christ? Is there any care shown to see that no one but saints are in the healing line? No, there won't be! Now how do these wicked, unregenerate people get their healing? Is it by faith? If so, faith in what? Not faith in God or they would be concerned with their souls and not their bodies! Does the healer invite a sinner to pray to God? That is an abominable act and very displeasing to God-Isa. 64:6. You can't exercise faith until you have accepted Jesus Christ. Not that faith is the determining factor, but I want you to see just how sandy is the foundation of these healing shows. The whole affair from advertising, to the letter inquiring for a place in the healing line, to the trip down there, to the half-open mouths of the spectators, I say the whole show MAGNIFIES the material, physical side of this world. Now God does not do that. Look at Job, read that book and see where the emphasis is. Ninety-nine per cent of that book about an afflicted man is on the subject of spiritual relationship with God. It would be well for all afflicted people to read the 4 chapters wherein God rebuked Job. "Whatsoever ye do, do ALL to the glory of God."—I Cor. 10:

pray for you in illness is to follow God's Word. To go to a healer for prayer is to insult the Holy Spirit, and is contrary to the Word of God. Why go? Does that man have more power, more standing, more persuasion with God than you have? (I want to say again the Gift of Healing, Divinely giv-en, ceased with the completion of the Bible. If these fellows had that gift they would heal every single person INSTAN-TANEOUSLY as did all the Divine healers) I say it is Jesus that is the ground for any answer for prayer. The Spirit forms your prayer, intercedes to cause your prayer to be in acceptable form-according to His Will-but it is Jesus who by His wrought-out righteousness and obedience that makes your prayer obtain results. God is no respector of persons, but He is a respector of the Sav-The Saviour in turn knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit-"For through Him we both have access BY ONE SPIRIT unto the Father." It is the Spirit, I say, that knows what you should pray for; and it is the Spirit that "worketh in you both to will and to do." THE SPIRIT DOES LEAD YOU TO A SERVICE WHERE THE PHYSICAL IS MAGNIFIED, and the spiritual minimized. He is not going to be where man is praising man for doing what is claimed to be Divine work. Watch those people that are healed. When they go home, when they go out, when they talk, who is it that gets their praise and their glory. Who is it they give the most time and description to? THE HEALER, OF COURSE! Now the Spirit will have no part of such an attitude. If ye would seek by prayer to find out the Will of God as regards your being healed, and if ye would seek this in the desire to glorify God with your renewed body, then DO NOT go looking for a healing man. Go to the Spirit of God-"For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? Even so the things of God knoweth no man, but the Spirit of God." While prayer is being made, God is searching the heart to see what root and what spirit has caused your prayer to be lifted. You cannot fool the Spirit of God. In that which is according to the Will of God, He heareth us. The Pharisees were far more righteous and eloquent than most people today, but their prayers were rejected. Why? Because man, as man, is full of wickedness-"God is not in all their thoughts," and so they cannot keep a word or a thought, much less a piece of prayer clean. If you are in a close walk with God, the Spirit will show you your infirmity and your need for His intercession to pray for what you ought. It is the Spirit "that searcheth all things, yea the deep things of God." He it is that can bring you before God in the right attitude and the right petition. "He shall (Continued on page four)
