### Some Bible Trees"

"And out of the ground made the Lord God to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight, and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of knowledge of good and evil."—Gen. 2:9.

"Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed."—I Pet. 2:24.

I am satisfied that every Bible student has often reflected and wondered just why it was that the Cross of Jesus Christ was spoken of as a tree. I'll be frank with you and say that for a long, long time I used to read this text in I Pet. 2:24 too, and wonder why it was, and I could see no reason as to why it was that the Cross of Calvary should be referred to under the figure of speech of a tree. Then one day I read this first text in Gen. 2:9 and it came to me, beloved, that there was a decided contrast and comparison between the tree of life that is spoken of in Gen. 2:9 and the tree of the Cross that

in a Garden-one in the Garden of Eden, and the other in an unknown garden, near to the city of Jerusalem. Thus we can see this morning, beloved, that both the first Adam, as our first forefather, and also the second Adam, the Lord Jesus Christ, died in a garden. The

IT IS INTERESTING TO SEE THAT THE FIRST OF THESE TREES WAS PLANTED BY GOD, WHILE THE SECOND WAS PLANTED BY MAN.

If you will turn to the second chapter of Genesis and read my text again, you will find that this is speaking about the Garden of Eden which the Lord made. That garden, beloved, with the trees that were within it, were all established by the Lord, so that we can see at a very first glance that the tree of life spoken of in Gen. 2 was planted by God.

In contrast, beloved, the tree of Calvary was not planted by God, though it was planned by God. The tree of the Cross, while it was planned by God, was planted by man, for it was man, beloved, who took Jesus Christ to the Cross and there crucified Him. We read:

"And they crucified him, and parted his garments, casting lots: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet. They parted my garments among them, and upon my vesture did they cast lots."-Mt. 27:35.

Notice, beloved, this second tree—the tree of Calvary—was planted by man. It was man who crucified Jesus. It was man who nailed Jesus Christ to the Cross. It was man who sat down and watched Him die, gloatingly exulting over the crime that had been perpetrated. It was man who planted this second treethe tree of Calvary.

THE FIRST TREE WAS PLEASANT TO THE EYES WHILE THE SECOND TREE WAS REPULSIVE.

If you will go back to the early chapters of the book of Genesis, you will find that there wasn't anything in all that Garden of Eden that was much more attractive than was the tree of life. We read:

"And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was PLEASANT TO THE EYES, and a TREE TO BE DESIRED to make one wise, she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat." -Gen. 3:6.

I am satisfied that of all the trees in the Garden of Eden and of all the foliage and the grass and the shrubery that grew within the Garden, there wasn't anything that was quite as attractive and pleasant to the eyes as was this tree of life that God had planted.

Now, in contrast to this, beloved, the tree of Calvary certainly wasn't pleasant to the eyes. I don't know of anything SALVATION BY GRACE ALONE

that could be said to be more repulsive than was the tree of Calvary. Even the prophet recognized this to be true, for he

"For he shall grow up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground: he hath no form nor comeliness: and when we shall see him, there is NO BEAUTY that we should desire him."-Isa. 53:2.

Oh, what a contrast between the tree of life in the Garden of Eden and the tree of Calvary in that unknown Jerusalem garden! Beloved, that tree of life was pleasant to the eyes. It was interesting to the eyes of man to look upon it. Beloved, when we come to the tree of Calvary, there wasn't anything attractive about it. The prophet said concerning the cruifixion of Jesus that He had no form nor comeliness, and he further declared that when we see Him, there is no beauty whereby that we should desire Him.

Just stand with me, if you will, at Calvary and observe the Lord Jesus Christ as He was crucified. Look at that blood as it flowed drop by drop from the nail prints within His hands. See His forehead that wore the crown of thorns. See those cheeks that were flaked with blood, and look upon Him whose beard had been pulled by the roots from His face. See Him with a spear thrust in His side. Look at Him as the pain leaps along the very arteries of His body. See the Lord Jesus Christ as He suffered, as His bosom heaved and fell beneath the pain that His body was undergoing. When you see all this, beloved, look down around the Cross at those soldiers as they rolled the dice for His garments, as they mocked and cursed and blasphemed Him. Look down here and see an old Jewish infidel as he insultingly looks up at Jesus and says, "Come down from the Cross and we will believe you." Look over here and see another as he wags his head and looks up at Jesus and insults Jesus for His inability to come down from the Cross. My brother, when you stand thus at Calvary, you will certainly agree with me that there wasn't anything pleasant to the eyes of man about the tree of the

Oh, what a contrast is this! The first tree—the tree of life in Eden's Garden—was pleasant to the eyes of man, but there was nothing pleasant about the tree of Calvary. Nothing but repulsiveness could you find at the III

GOD FORBADE MAN TO EAT OF THAT FIRST TREE, BUT HE FREELY INVITES MAN TO EAT OF THE SEC-OND TREE.

If you will go back to the book of Genesis, you will find that God put a prohibition upon man concerning that first tree, for we read:

But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die."—Gen. 2:17.

You will notice then that God forbade man to eat of that first tree. He literally said to man, "Don't touch it. You can't eat of the fruit of it. It makes no difference how pleasant it is to the eyes, it is not for you. The day that you violate my commandment, you are going to die." Thus God forbade man to eat of the fruit of the tree in the Garden of Eden.

In contrast, God freely invites man to eat of the second tree. Listen:

"Ho, everyone that thirsteth, come ye to the waters, and he that hath no money; come ye, buy, and eat; yea, come, buy wine and milk without money and without price."-Isa. 55:1.

This is God's invitation by way of prophecy to you relative to this second tree. Though God fenced that first tree round about in Eden's Garden and said to man to stay away from it, God tears down every barrier and removes every hindrance and makes the way clear to the second tree, and God invites you to freely eat of the tree of Calvary.

Notice another Scripture that likewise gives us a free, wideopen invitation by way of access to the tree of Calvary:

"And Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger: and he that believeth on me shall never thirst." -John 6:35.

This is God's invitation to that second tree. Unlike the first which was forbidden to man by God, this second tree is wide open to man, and God says to the individual, "Here it is. You are freely invited to take and eat thereof."

We have another remarkable invitation on the part of God to the second tree. Listen:

"And sent his servant at supper time to say to them that were bidden, Come; for all things are now ready." -Luke

Go back to the book of Psalms and you will hear the Psalmist David sav:

"O taste and see that the Lord

is good: blessed is the man that trusteth in him." - Psa. 34:8.

I tell you this morning, as the first tree was thus planted by the Lord and man was forbidden by God to eat of that tree, in contrast, beloved, this second tree of Calvary, which was planted by man, God freely invites you and urges you to eat of the fruit of that tree.

As the words of the old song

"Come, humble sinner, in whose breast

A thousand tho'ts revolve; Come, with your guilt and fear oppressed, And make this last resolve.

I'll go to Jesus, though my

Hath like a mountain rose;

I know His courts, I'll enter in, Whatever may oppose.

Perhaps He may admit my

Perhaps will hear my prayer; But if I perish I will pray, And perish only there.

I can but perish if I go; I am resolved to try; For if I stay, I know I must forever die."

I say to you, beloved, as God forbade man to eat of the fruit of the first tree so God invites and welcomes the sinner to eat of the fruit of the tree of Cal-

SINCE GOD FORBADE MAN TO EAT OF THE FIRST TREE, SATAN USED EVERY MEANS HE COULD IN ORDER TO GET MAN TO DO SO. LIKEWISE, SINCE GOD TO-DAY INVITES MEN TO EAT OF THE FRUIT OF THE SEC-OND TREE, OR THE TREE OF CALVARY, THE DEVIL USES EVERY POWER THAT HE CAN TO KEEP MAN FROM EATING OF IT.

Go back to the Garden of Eden and hear the Lord as He gave man a prohibition concerning that one tree. Then notice how the Devil used every means that he could to cause Adam and Eve to partake of that forbidden fruit. Beloved, he lied to them. He insinuated against God's goodness and God's love. He appealed to their vanity and he said, "You will be just as wise as God Himself." He made every conceivable proposition unto Adam and Eve in order to cause them to partake of that fruit of the tree that God said they were not to touch.

In contrast, beloved, since God invites men to come and partake of the fruit of the tree of Calvary, the Devil does everything within his power to keep sinners from eating of the fruit of this tree. He will say to you who are lost, "You don't need to be saved," and he will say, "You are just as good as a lot of the church members." Beloved, lest that should excite your ego, I will pause and say, "Unless you are a lot better than a lot of church members, you are in bad condition." The Devil will likewise come

to you and tell you that you can save yourself. He will also tell you that there is plenty of time-just put it off and wait a little while longer.

Beloved, as God invites and urges upon men the value of partaking of the fruit of the tree of Calvary, Satan does everything within his power to keep men away. Notice:

"In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them." -II Cor. 4:4.

man will ever see the Paradise of God who doesn't come just exactly like this thief who saw Jesus dying for his sins, and who looked up and said, "Lord, remember me.'

I like to think of these two trees in contrast—the one tree that brought death, and the other that brought life-and when I do so, I am reminded that back yonder long ago Abraham one day had some visitors. Listen:

"And the Lord appeared unto him in the plains of Mamre: and he sat in the tent door in the heat of the day; And he lifted up his eyes and looked, and, lo, three men stood by him: and when he saw them, he ran to meet them from the tent door, and bowed himself toward the ground, And said, "My Lord, if now I have found favor in thy sight, pass not away, I pray thee, from thy servant: Let a little water, I pray you, be fetched, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. And he took butter and milk, and the calf which he had dressed, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree, and they did eat."—Gen. 18:1-8.

That was only a natural tree in the experience of Abraham. Under that tree Abraham entertained the angels of Godstrangers to him. He set food before those angelic visitors, and they sat down with Abraham under that tree to eat and commune with him, so that tree became, in the life of Abraham, a place of eating and a place of communion.

Let's bring that over into the spiritual realm. May I insist that the man who sees Jesus Christ on the tree of Calvary, can find food for his soul and can have communion with God as he sits beneath the tree of Calvary.

In the book of Exodus we read how the children of Israel were journeying from Egypt to the land of Canaan. Not all of that wilderness was pleasant, and at the same time not all of it was rigorous. There were some seasons when God blessed, and other seasons when it looked like the hand of God was against them. One of these times when it looked as though the hand of God was against them, was at the little place known as Marah. They had been wandering in the wilderness for days. Their water was gone and they were thirsting. As they neared Marah, they thought of the wells with the water gushing out before them and how wonderful it was going to be, to bathe there and to drink of that water. When they arrived at Marah and reached down to take a handful of water to their lips, they found that the water was so bitter they couldn't swallow it. Listen:

"And when they came to Marah, they could not drink of the waters of Marah, for they were bitter: therefore the name of it was called Marah. And the people murmured against Moses, saying What shall we drink? And he cried unto the Lord; and the Lord showed him a tree, which when he had cast into the waters, the waters were made sweet: there he made for them a statute and an ordinance, and there he proved them." Ex. 15:23-25.

The water was so bitter that Moses and the children of Israel couldn't drink it. God told them to take a tree and throw it into the water, and when they did so, that water was cleansed, and made so sweet that the children of Israel could drink

Sin, beloved, has been a mighty bitter thing in your life. You might not admit it. You might think it is pretty nice, but if you will sit down in the quietude of time with no one about

(Continued from page one) New Birth is a consciousness of sin. Paul, the great apostle said, 'I am carnal, sold under sin. I do not understand my own actions and I know that within me dwells no good thing." And again, the beloved apostle John, in 1st John 1:8 said, "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us." No saved person will think himself sinless. Those who do are deceived and are without the truth and are not saved. The person who is born again has the enlightening unction of the Holy Spirit, I John 2:27, "But the anointing which you have received from Him abides in you and you have no need that anyone should teach you." A saved person does not need interpretation of the man's Bible, if he will study it earnestly for himself, the Holy Spirit will enlighten his mind and he will not be blind to sin. Again in Romans 6:14, "For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law, but under grace" and in Galatians 5:24 we read, "And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires." And again in I John 1:6, If we say that we have fellowship with Him and walk in darkness, we lie and do not live according to the truth." And again in I John 2:4 is a strong statement against those who claim to know our Lord, yet are not willing to walk according to His Word, "He who says I know Him, but disobeys His commandments is a liar and the truth is not in him." We should uphold the hands of honest officials, and should seek to remove corrupt officials. To assume that we have no responsibility as citizens is to dishonor our Christian profession. Would we let a bunch of robbers terrorize the community and make no effort to join with others in apprehending them?

#### WHAT THE BIBLE SAYS ABOUT IT

Jesus said to "render unto Caesar the things belonging to Caesar," (See Matt. 22:21) In other words there are certain things that we owe to our government, and those things we are to pay. Jesus himself paid

The 7th evidence of the New Birth is progressive purfication. We read in I John 3:2-3, "Beloved, we are God's children now; it doth not yet appear what we shall be, but we know that when He appears we shall be like Him for we shall see Him as He is. And every one that hath this hope in him purifieth himself even as He is The believer never attains sinless perfection in this life, yet everyone who has the hope of the Lord in his heart grows daily in the grace of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ and strives to purify himself of

The eighth evidence is a love of other believers. We read in I John 3:14, "We know that we have passed from death unto life because we love the brethren." What does it mean to love the brethren? Does it mean that we must love the sin and error of those who call themselves brothers? I think not. For we read in I John 5:2, "By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey His commandments." If we love God and keep His commandments we know that we love His children. The love of the brethren will not cause us to compromise the Word of God, it will not cause us to lay aside controversial doctrines, but on the other hand, it will cause us to preach the whole counsel of God without fear of man or devils. It will cause us to tell the lost of their hell bound condition and of salvation only by the grace of God through the death of the Lord Jesus Christ. It will cause us to teach the saved that they need to be baptized by the authority of a New Testament church and that they should observe the Lord's supper as members of a local church. It will cause us teach the saved all of the things whatsoever He commanded us. We can be sure that we love other believers only when we love God and keep His commandments.

The 9th and last evidence of the New Birth which we give here is a patient continuance to the end. In Matt. 10:22 we read, "And you will be hated by all men for my name's sake, but who endures to the end shall be saved." None will reach heaven but those who endure to the end and who overcome the world. In Col. 1:23, we read, that we shall be presented holy and blameless before Him, "Provided that ye continue in the faith stable and stedfast not shifting from the hope of the gospel which you have heard." This does not teach that we can fall from grace. Some affirm that it does, but let us see what the Word of God has to say about it. In Rev. 3:5, we read, "He who conquers shall be clad in white garments and I will not blot his name out of the Book of Life." And who is it that.
