When Will Gog Invade The Land Of Palestine?

THE PROFITABLE MYTH OF PURGATORY

One of the most profitable doctrines of the Roman Catholic Church is that of Purgatory. Every Catholic is obliged to believe that after death he will be sentenced to Purgatory, there to undergo torture of unknown duration.

He is further taught that the best way to shorten the sufferings of Purgatory either for himself or for his friends and relatives is to have masses said. Application of a low mass for the relief of a suffering soul costs a minimum of one dollar; a high mass costs about twenty to twenty-five dollars; a solemn high mass costs much more. The more masses said the better for an agonizing soul. Wealthy people are urged to leave several thousand dollars to provide for masses to be said perpetually for them after they die.

The Redemptorist Fathers, founded by St. Alphonsus Liguori, 173 East Third Street, in New York City, established in 1856 a "Purgatorian Society" that is still making good profits. Membership is fifty cents a year. It prints a manuel for members of the Purgatorian

The Kingdom Age On Earth"

Read Isaiah 11

A little while ago, an elderly gentleman, one of the dearest friends which I have, though not a member of this church, yet a man who knows the Word of God in a very unusual way, asked me if our Lord were going to literally reign here on this earth. Somehow he had in mind that our Lord was going to set up a kingdom, but it had never dawned upon him that our Lord was going to literally reign from a literal throne, right here within this world. Of course, it was a joy to me to try to offer some little explanation and to tell him that Jesus Christ is coming back to this world again, and that when He comes, after He has purged the world during the tribulation, period, then He is going to set up His throne and literally reign from a literal throne in the city of Jerusalem for a thousand years, which is called in the Word of God, the Millen-

Let me insist this morning that this is true. I don't know when the Lord Jesus Christ is

coming. I'm not even venturing a guess; I'm not even making a suggestion as to when He will come again; however, one thing is certain, I know from the varied and manifold teachings of this Bible, that the Son of God is coming back to this world some day.

I know, furthermore, that in the books of Daniel and Revelation particularly, as well as in other portions of the Word of God, we are taught that there is to be a tribulation period, which, in itself, while it only

(Continued from Page One) lasts for seven years' time, will be a literal hell on earth for those who are living at that particular time.

I know, also, that the Word of God makes it clear that after the tribulation period that the Lord Jesus Christ is going to set up His kingdom and is going to demonstrate through His kingdom, what this world might have been if Adam had never sinned.

This 11th chapter of Isaiah tells us in a very decided way the story of that kingdom age when Jesus Christ reigns from Jerusalem.

You will notice the first verse tells us as to THE KING'S AN-CESTRY. It says:

"And there shall come forth a rod, out of the stem of Jesse, and a Branch shall grow out of his roots." -Is. 11:1.

The King, beloved, of the Kingdom Age, is the Lord Jesus Christ. None other than the Son of God will answer for the King. This Scripture refers to Him as a branch growing out of the roots of Jesse. It is rather conspicuous that if you cut down a cedar tree, that tree stump will rot and perish in the ground and will never sprout again; however, if you cut down an oak tree, from the stump of that tree, new life will come forth. In the preceding or 10th chapter of Isaiah, he refers to Assyria under the figure of a cedar tree cut off, never to rise again; whereas in this chapter, he refers to Israel pro-ducing the Lord Jesus Christ under the figure of an oak tree that is cut off with the stump giving forth new life, and new growth coming from the stump. Thus it refers to the Lord Jesus Christ as a branch that shall grow out of the roots of Jesse.

Word of God we can see how the Lord Jesus Christ came from such a lowly ancestry. When, in the providence of God, a king was being chosen as a successor for Saul, Samuel went to the house of Jesse. When the first son passed before him, he thought that surely this was the Lord's annointed, but God said, "Not so." As the second stalwart, manly son passed by, Samuel thought surely this was God's annointed, but God shook his head in the negative. Finally all the sons of Jesse had passed before Samuel. God had refused them all. Then it was he sent out into the fields and brought in the shepherd boy, David, the last of the sons of Jesse, the least of the family, the very farthest from the throne in the eyes of man, and God said, "This is he." You might as well say, beloved, that God took the

sucker off the stump when He chose that little lad David to be the king over Israel, and thus an ancestor of the Lord Jesus.

Then, beloved, look at the birth of the Lord Jesus Christ. Of whom was He born? Why not of royalty in the sense in which we use the term royalty. Instead, beloved, he was born of peasants. His mother, Mary, was a Jewish peasant girl. Surely when you look at the Lord Jesus Christ being born of peasant stock and of peasant ancestry, you can see again the Lord Jesus Christ was just a "sucker off the stump."

Then, beloved, notice that He grew up in the city of Nazareth. The Word of God would indicate to us that Nazareth was a hated place because of the vileness and the sin of the city. The immorality of the city was such that when Philip came to his friend Nathaniel to tell him about Jesus, Nathaniel said:

"Can any good thing come out of Nazareth?" -John 1:46.

I tell you, beloved, the King who one day shall reign from Jerusalem, the King who one day shall reign over this world, the King who one day shall control the nations of the worldthe Lord Jesus Christ-from His earthly ancestry, He can surely be described as a branch that grew off the stump-despised by man and cast aside by the world, yet God will make Him the King over His kingdom within this world.

The second verse tells us something of THE SPIRIT THAT SHALL REST UPON OUR KING.

"And the spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord." -Is. 11:2.

Notice: The Lord Jesus Christ is going to have the spirit of wisdom resting upon Him. He is going to have the spirit of understanding, the spirit of counsel and of knowledge. I'm glad that the Lord Jesus Christ who is going to reign over the world one day will be thus. If He is going to possess this spirit when He reigns, He possesses it right now, so that we can say this morning that the Lord Jesus who is going to reign from Jerusalem, has today the spirit of wisdom; He knows; He under-

There are lots of things that confuse and confront you and me because of our lack of wisdom, but, beloved, the Lord Jesus Christ has the spirit of wisdom. There isn't anything within this world that the Son of God doesn't know all about. Long before modern science discovered the intricacies of life, God knew all about them. Long before the secret of the atom was unfolded to man, the Lord Jesus Christ knew everything concerning it. I say to you, there isn't a discovery that man the made but what Jesus Christ knew all about it. He has the spirit of wisdom.

Then, beloved, it says that He has the spirit of understanding. I'm glad that He does. I'm glad He can understand you and me. So many times you have been misunderstood. So many times even those maybe of your own family, have misunderstood you. So many times even those of your friends have prehaps misunderstood you. So many times the motive of your heart has been misinterpreted. I'm glad the Lord Jesus Christ has the spirit of understanding. He understands the problems that confront you today. He understands the thorns that you trample upon and the stones that you stumble over. He understands, beloved, the trials

that you have and the testings that come your way. He understands the things which man could never understand. He understands when the tears flow thick and when your heart is broken, and when you can't see your way out. I'm glad there's--

"Never a heartache and never a groan,

Never a teardrop and never a moan;

Never a danger, but there on His throne;

Moment by moment He thinks of His own.'

He has the spirit of counsel. That's what I need. That's what you need—the spirit of counsel. You don't have the intelligence to know what you ought to do. You don't have the mental capacity to know the moves you need to make. You certainly do not have the mental perception to know what you ought to do in this life, but thank God for this blessed truth—that Jesus Christ, the one who is going to reign over this world some day, has the spirit of counsel. I'm glad that he can counsel you, that He can direct you, that He can show you, that He can lead you, that He can teach you,where you ought to live, what you ought to do, the attitudes you ought to take toward life and toward His church. He can guide you in all things. I don't know of anything that ought to thrill the child of God more than to know that the Lord Jesus Christ possesses the spirit of counsel, and that He can counsel and direct us.

III

You will notice in the 3rd through 5th verses that this passage talks about THE CHAR-ACTER OF HIS REIGN when He sets up His kingdom. It says:

understanding in the fear of the Lord: and he shall not judge after the sight of his eyes, neither reprove after the hearing of his ears: But with righteousness shall he judge the poor. and reprove with equity for the meek of the earth: and he shall smite the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips shall he slay the wicked. And righteousness shall be the girdle of his loins, and faithfulness the girdle of his reins."

When Jesus Christ sets up His kingdom, He is not going to judge men by what He sees with His eyes nor hears with His ears. That's the only way earthly men can judge. That's the only way an earthly court can be conducted, - on the basis of what is heard with the ear and seen with the eye. The Lord Jesus Christ, however, beloved, is not going to reign on that basis. The Word of God makes it clear that the Lord Jesus Christ does not have to depend upon sight and hearing. Listen:

-Is. 11:3-5.

"And Jesus KNOWING THEIR THOUGHTS, said, Wherefore think ye evil in your hearts?" -Matthew 9:4

Notice: "Jesus knowing their thoughts." He doesn't have to ask you and listen to your answer. He doesn't have to observe you with His eyes. He knows your thoughts before those thoughts are ever put into words. Before those thoughts ever become actions, Jesus Christ knows all about you. Listen again:

"Judge not according to appearance, but JUDGE RIGHT-EOUS JUDGMENT." -John 7:



Now I would like to tell you about my trip. I left Manaus at hype thirty in the morning and ved there the same day. How rent this is from the long tedious journeys that missdries in other times had to lect themselves to in order themselves to my of the world. When I ved in Cruzeiro do Sul, I lust as fresh as I was when left. I flew there in a Cataline. the because they can land are great planes for this ere, and there is barely any place that is beyond their reach.

On arriving, I looked for a place to stay. They have a place there they call a hotel, actually it is an old house that has four bedrooms and a large dining room in front. I went to the place to inquire about the charges. They said that I could have my room and board for two weeks for 900 crs. My baggage was still in the baggage room of the Panair Agency so I did not have to secure a room right then. I decided to look up Miguel before I did anything else and began to make inquiries. I found that Miguel was not in Cruzerio do Sul but was in Rio de Janeiro for medical purposes and had had two operations on his eyes. He had boarded a government plane and went to Rio to get treatment that was not available in Cruzeiro do Sul. The government has a medical plan for taking care of the poor and the plane ride was free also so he did not have to pay anything for this. (The care of the sick is very poor though, and even the doctors admit that usually very little if anything is done for the unfortunate people who are forced to ask for this care that God gives to His children). I saw his wife and she asked me to go to the home of Bro. Newton, a deacon of the church and a preacher for many years. I went to his home, but found that he was working at his job as secretary of the Prefeitura of Cruzeiro do Sul. However there was a man there who I later found was a missionary of New Tribes Mission, a mission that stands for just about every thing and has no specific beliefs at all that I can find. He eats at the house of Bro. Newton and pays him so much every week. I did not realize that he was an American to begin with for he is very dark skinned, being of Spanish ancestry himself. He speaks the language so well that it is impossible to tell his speech from that of one of the natives of this land. He told me that he was living in the deserted house of Bro. Brandon's when he was in Cruzeiro do Sul which is ver seldom. He said that he would get out and that if I wished he would lend me a hammock of his to sleep there. I told him that I would be glad to do this as I would just as soon stay there as in the hotel that they have there. During all this time he never spoke a word of English and I thought that he was one of the preachers there. I asked him what his name was and he said that it was Jose (Portuguese for Joseph). Since he even gave his name in Portuguese, I thought certainly that he was a citizen of this country. He told me that he was a preacher and I was trying to remember if his name was on the list of our

workers and since I couldn't re-

member it, I thought that he probably was a new preacher that they had there and that he wasn't on the payroll of the mission. They do have quite a few there who are members of the church that preach all the time that they are not working. I invited him to stay on with me in the house and he thanked me and helped me set the other hammock up and a mosquito net. I, thinking that he would know all about the work there, inquired of him as to what they were doing in the various places. He said, "Why don't you go see for yourself?" I said that I would like to very much but that with Miguel gone I didn't know how that I would get to any of the places. He then informed me that Mario, Cicero, and Eufrazio were in town for they had not been payed for three months since Miguel was in the hospital in Rio and there was no one to receive the money at the bank. They had wired Miguel for him to give them authority to take out their salaries. He suggested that we all go to the different places together. I thought that this was an excellent idea and agreed to it at once. The next morning I went to Miguel's house and borrowed the motor. I then got Eufrazio and Cicero to go with me. Mario waited for the wire from Rio de Janerio. We got some rice, beans, and eggs and started our journey. Neither Cicero or Eufrazio told me that

he was a missionary of New Tribes, the same one that Miguel had mentioned so bitterly in his letters some time back. I can readily understand how, that Miguel mistook him for Lawrence sometime back. I go into all this detail in order that you might know how that a missionary from New Tribes missions happened to be accompanying me on my journey. It was not until I was half way to my destination that I found out who he was. I was musing on the problem of how that I could preach to these people with my limited knowledge of the language when he told me that he would translate for me. I asked in amazement if he knew English and he then told me who that he was. I did not like his deception one bit and told him so and asked for an explanation of his actions. He then told me that he was afraid that I would make him get out of the mission's old house and that he didn't have a cent and didn't know where he would have stayed in Cruzeiro do Sul (he only gets 60 dollars a month). I then asked him just what he was and he said that he was a Baptist, that he was baptized by Mr. Dye who was then pastor of the Tabernacle Baptist Church in Saginaw, Michigan. Mr. Dye is dead now. Savages killed him in Bolivia while he was carrying the gospel to them there. He then said that he knew one thing, that Jesus Christ had died personally for his sins and that he thought that that was all that was necessary to further the gospel. I told him that that, was all that was necessary for the salvation of one's soul but that we must have much more knowledge of his will in order to serve Hin intelligently and obediently. From that time on, I spent every spare moment teaching him the things commanded in the Word. I never had a more interested pupil. Since he was baptized into a Baptist Church, I thought that considering everything, that I might ts well let him translate for me, and I was able to preach many times by this method during my stay there.

When we reached the point nearest our destination by water we then stored the motor and remaining gasoline away out of sight and put our packs on our backs and started to make our way inland. The current was very strong on the Moa river that day and we had not made good time. It was dusk before we started our overland journey. I never knew that walking could be so hard. We followed a trail through the jungle, and in the night time it seems as if every branch and snarling root reaches out to trip or scratch you. We stumbled along for some time and still did not reach our destination. It was supposed to have

time we arrived at Yapiinei, a small settlement of people who have cleared a little of this land to raise mandioca, a plant they make farinha from, a horrible meal that the people like very much here, sugar cane, a few pigs and chickens and rice. We went to the home of one of the people there and they received us very kindly. They did everything possible to refresh us. The wife of the house got up and killed a chicken and fried it for us and we ate this with rice and beans and a starchy bread they make from farinha. Then her husband gave us some soap and took us to a spring that he had built a bath house over. The water was clear as crystal and we all bathed and hung up our hammocks and slept until about ten o'clock the next morning. The man of the house left early that morning and went to every farm around there which covers some miles to tell them to come and hear me. By noon there were about a hundred people at his home and he killed a pig to feed them. I wonder how many people at home would go to that trouble in order to bring people to hear the gospel? I preached that afternoon and also again that night and it seemed as if they hung onto every word that I said. We stayed another night and then the next morning, we started back very early. We reached the river where we had left our canoe at about 9 o'clock and since we would be going with the current we expected to be back in Cruzeiro do Sul by evening, but on the way down we saw a little house off the bank of the river in a little clearing with a few chickens running around it. We stopped to see if we could buy some eggs and have them boiled to eat. While we were there, Eufrazio and Cicero asked these people if they were Christians. They said that they had heard of Christ, but did not know who We then began to tell them the gospel. They were very interested and wanted us to stay and tell them more. We stayed for the night at this place and held a meeting in the evening. They went inland a little way and brought their neighbors to hear also. There were about thirty of them. I preached again and since they knew so little, I began with the account of the creation and fall of man in Adam and showed how that all men were sinners and that it demanded a Saviour to pay for their sins. I asked them if they were aware that they sinned, and they said that they were well aware that they were not good in any way and that it of-(Next page, column one)

(Preceding page, column 5) ten troubled them. This from people who had only heard that there was a Christ but did not know who he was. After preached they were fascinated by the gospel and all wanted to be believers. Eufrazio and Cicero promised them they would stop again on their way back to their areas where they preach and tell them more that they might have a believing knowledge. The family that we spent the night with said they would not rest until they returned to preach to them. It was Sunday morning when we left again for Cuzeiro do Sul and we had another service before we left with Eufrazio preaching. The only ones that were there to listen in this service were the family we staved with as the others had gone back to their homes after the evening service the night before. We arrived in Cruzeiro do Sul that afternoon. It gave us time to bathe and change our clothes before the Sunday evening service. That night I preached on the duty of a church to the pastor in Cruzeiro do Sul. I told them it was not right for them to have a pastor and not support him and also attempted to awaken them to the necessity of being missionary minded themselves. Later on, two of the members said that they were starting to tithe from now on.

The next day, Monday, I taught a class in music in the afternoon. They were very enthusiastic about singing and liked my voice an awful lot. There are some fine young Christians there and they were singing very well at the end of the class. They just love to harmonize their voices, but they did not know how. Of course you can't teach music in one lesson, but I did teach them to sing different parts on four songs. And they sing them continuously for the remainder of the time that I was there. That night we all had prayer together. I do not speak well enough to preach yet but I do pray in Portuguese in the meetings now. The women all went in one room together and the men in another and the fellowship that we had was very good for us

The next day was Tuesday, and we started on another journey to a place called Boa Fe. Cicero said that there were some Indians up there that were civilized to a great extent and would I like to go up there and preach. I wanted to go very badly so we started out early that morning. It is a nine day journey up there and a very tedious one for men to paddle against the current but with Miguel's 7 H. P. engine, we made it up there in three days and back in two, for we were going with the current on the way back. The river is low at this time of year and very treacherous and we had a couple of close calls after we got off the Jurua and went up a smaller tributary to Boa Fe. When we got there we found that they were quite aways inland, and we had to walk about 7 hours to get there. Since none of us knew the country at all, we hired a man to take us the rest of the way. We got about half

self so they would know who | B left them if there were any savages about. We then went on and arrived without incident simply by following the trail. I became sick at this time and ran a high fever that night. I had come down with malaria but I brought along some arelin pills and really had only one bad night, for I caught it right at the beginning. By morning, my fever was gone but my lips were full of fever blisters and I felt quite miserable for I had gotten badly sunburned on the way up and it was really beginning to smart. I was hungry and I ate some meat the Indians there gave me. It was turtle. They really have some large ones here. It really doesn't taste bad but I couldn't eat much just knowing what it was. I felt so bad that we decided to go back. Eufrazio preached to them that morning and we started back. The walk back sure seemed long but we actually made good time. On the way back we noticed that the things that we left were gone. Somebody had taken them but we don't know who. The trip back was torture to me. The sun gets so hot on the river, there just isn't shade to be had. We arrived at Cuzeiro Do Sul on Sunday afternoon and I preached twice on the way up to Boa Fe. The people here are the most hospitable people that I have ever seen. When dusk would come we would stop at the first little hut we saw and ask them if we could stay the night with them. We were never refused, and not only that, but were cared for in a very tender way. They were always willing to listen to the gospel so we had a service at every place that we stayed at.

I promised Mario that I would try to go to the place that he was preaching at when I first came there. Miguel had wired them the authority to take the money out of the bank so as soon as he received all of his pay he left for home, as his wife was expecting their 9th or 11th child, I have forgotten now which. Anyway he told those at Cruzeiro do Sul to tell me that he would announce to all the people there that I was coming to preach to them. There was nothing to do but go. I was sunburned very badly and did not feel like going anywhere, but intended to spend the remaining days in Cruzeiro do Sul. We started very early in the morning on Monday. It was four thirty when we left. We could not see anything for awhile and it made me uncomfortable in the canoe, but the Jurua is very navigable even when the water is low and there was not much danger of hitting a fallen tree or some other object especially near Cruzeiro do Sul. 300 ton boats come all the way up the Jurua from Manaus, so it is really quite some river. The canoe leaked badly, however. and I had to take off my shoes and bail out the water often during the trip. It was a very hot day and I had my pants rolled half way up to my knees to keep them from getting all wet from the water in the boat.

Then, even the nature of the wolf, will be changed so that the wolf and the lamb shall lie down to-

Then, beloved, you will notice that it says the calf and the young lion and the fatling shall lie down together. Every natural instinct of these beasts will be changed when our Lord sets up His kingdom. Beloved, this old world is going to be worth living in then. Can you imagine a child putting his hand down into the hole of the asp? In that day, beloved, a child can play safely on the den of the cockatrice and he can put his hand into the hole of the asp with safety. Why? Because the Lord Jesus Christ is going to change the nature of the beasts in that day. It is going to be good to be in the world when our Lord sets up His kingdom.

Here is another text that tells us something also of what the world will be like when the Lord sets up His kingdom. Lis-

ten:
"Until the spirit be poured upon us from on high, and the wilderness be a fruitful field. and the fruitful field be counted for a forest." -Is. 32:15.

When our Lord Jesus Christ comes back, the wilderness is going to be a fruitful field. You can drive along the highway today and see these old barren hillsides where you couldn't grow anything, but some day, the Word of God says they are going to be fruitful. I used to drive across the bridge in Ashland heading toward the Ohio side and I would look over at that hillside eroded with deep gulleys—a most unpleasant sight. Many a time I have driven along and looked at it and I have said, "That old hillside will look differently when the Lord Jesus Christ comes. He is going to make even the wilderness to be a fruitful place.

Futhermore, it says, "And the fruitful field be counted for a forest." What now produces as a fruitful field, will then produce so greatly, it will be like a forest.

Notice again what the Word of God says about the world when the Lord Jesus comes a-

"Instead of the thorn shall come up the fir tree, and instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle tree; and it shall be to the Lord for a name, for an everlasting sign that shall not be cut off. —Isa.55:13.

From whence did briers and thistles come? They came as a result of sin. God cursed the world as a result of sin, but some day, the thorns, briers and thistles be taken away. It's going to be good to be in the world when the Lord Jesus Christ sets up His kingdom.

There is so much in the world today that is nothing but desert. Think, this morning, of the great Sahara desert in Africa. Think of the miles of burning sand there. Go out to Death Valley in California or to the Grand Canyon and there is nothing but desert-nothing but wasteland-nothing could grow there under any circumstances at all. God says that one day it is going to be changed so that even the desert will blossom like a rose garden.

It is highly conspicuous to me in reading about these animals that are mentioned that the Lord never mentioned the crocodile, the tiger and other animals that are unknown to Palestine; but rather, that He mentioned the animals that are commonly known in Palestine. This certainly proves to me, beloved, the inspiration of the Bible, for if man had written it, he would doubtlessly have made mention of some animals which were unknown in the land of Palestine. It proves to me beyond any pre-adventure of a doubt that this Bible was written by God.

NOTICE THE EXTENT OF HIS KINGDOM.

When a man is president of the United States, he thinks he has an important place,—he thinks he has control of considerable of this world's goods. If a man were king of England, he would think he was reigning over a great portion of this world. If a man has a position as emperor over even a small portion of this world, he thinks his position is one of tremendous importance; but, beloved, listen to the extent of the kingdom of

our Lord Jesus Christ:
"They shall not hurt nor destroy in all my holy mountain: for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea." -Isa. 11:9.

Listen, beloved, there is a day coming when the whole earth is going to be full of the knowledge of the Lord.

I'm not a post-millennialist-I don't believe this world is getting better every day, and I don't believe that some of these days it will come to the place, of its own accord, where everybody in the world will be saved. I don't believe that, but I do believe that when Jesus Christ comes back and takes this world through the tribulation period, and when He sets up His kingdom with all the unsaved of this world bowing in subjection to Him, then and then only will the knowledge of the Lord cover this earth.

I'm not looking forward to a great time within this world. I've never lived in a town where everybody was saved, and I never expect to be. I've never lived in a county, a state nor a nation where everybody was saved, but I'm expecting to live in a world with the Lord Jesus Christ as my King, to live under Him, when everybody within the world does the will of God and the knowledge of the Lord covers the earth. It is going to be worthwhile to live then.

Would you like to live in a world where everybody did God's will? Would you like to live in a town, beloved, where everything that was done was according to the Word of God? Would you like to live here in Russell when everybody in Russell served the Lord? Some of these days, the whole world is going to be just like that. There will be no controversy about the Bible, there will be no controversy over doctrine, there will be no controversy as to what the Word of God says. Some of these days the whole world is going to be perfect in that respect, with our Lord Jesus Christ as King.

I'll not take time to discuss it verse by verse, but will say this: It is all going to be set up on the basis of the rest that we find in Him. Listen: And his rest shall be glorious.' around the basis of that perfect rest that is ours in Jesus Christ.

I have a peace in my heart this morning. I have a joy in my soul today as God's child but beloved, the world knows nothing of that peace and joy. Some of these days, however, God is going to set up a kingdom and it is going to be centered around that peace which we have in Him. Do you want to know how you can participate in it? Listen:

"There remaineth therefore a rest to the people of God. For he that is entered into his rest. he also hath ceased from his own works, as God did from his." — Hebrews 4:9, 10.

What does it say? It tells you how you can enter that rest. God worked six days and rested on the seventh. Rest came after work ceased. Jesus Christ came to this world, lived and died, and certainly you can say that death for Christ was work, and after His work of death was ended, He entered into rest. Now it says that just like God worked and ceased from His works and then came rest, so beloved, you and I receive rest when we cease from our work. Do I speak to someone who is trying to work his way to heaven? Do I speak to someone who thinks if he joins the church, is baptized and lives the best life he can, and just before he dies, confesses his sins, he will go to heaven? You are working - you haven't ceased from your work. There wasn't any rest for God the Father until He ceased His work of creation; there was no rest for the Son of God until He ceased from His work at Calvary, and there will be no soul rest for you until you cease from your works and then God will fill your soul with rest.

(Continued from Page One) Society that it also sells for fifty cents. In the front of this manual are a number of detachable pages for advertising the Purgatorian Society. The following is an exerpt from one of these advertisements:

"Many worry about what provision for masses will be made for them after death. Will any masses be said for them? Why not you yourself question and settle this important matter during your lifetime by becoming a member of the Purgatorian Society?

"Living as well as deceased persons may become members at any time during the year. The year begins with the day of enrollment. Absent persons may be enrolled by mail. The annual contribution is fifty cents. During the year contributions may be sent as often as person wishes to do so."

Fear is the motive behind Catholic belief in general and behind the doctrine of Purga-

tory in particular. The following quotation from page 30 of the Manual of the Purgatorian Society, established in 1930 with imprimatur of Cardinal Hayes, illustrates the truth of this statement.

"According to the holy Fathers of the Church, the fire of Purgatory does not differ from the fire of hell, excepting in point of duration. 'It is the same fire' says St. Thomas Aguinas, 'that forments the reprobate in hell, and the just in Purgatory. The least pain in Purgatory,' he adds, 'surpasses the great sufferings of this life.' Nothing but eternal duration makes the fire of hell more terrible than that of Purgatory.

Why masses afford the suffering souls the greatest relief from their torments and why masses should be said as frequently as possible is shown in the following quotation from pages 50-51 of the Manual:

The Sacrifice of the Mass is the greatest devotion of the Catholic church, and of all the means to assist the souls in Purgatory, none is more valuable or meritorious . . . From this inestimable efficacy, however, we may not infer that the offering of one Mass is sufficient to release the souls we love: for though the Sacrifice on Calvary was infinite, we cannot conclude that the application of it, through the Mass, must also be infinite. St. Thomas Aquinas tells us, it was not the intention of Jesus Christ to bestow the full efficacy of His sufferings and death, which is celebrated in every Mass, upon us. . . It is very salutary, therefore, to have the Holy Sacrifice offered frequently for the repose of a soul."

The above is in flagrant and blasphemous contradiction of New Testament teaching. The Sacrifice of Christ, once made, was complete, perfect, universal, and in the words of St. Paul, saves us "to the uttermost."

(Continued from Page One) teaches that one must work in order to be saved. God declares in His Word that one must stop working. "But to him that worketh not, but believeth on Him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for righteousness." (Rom. 4:5).

The natural man thinks that it is "to him the worketh", but God says it is "to him that worketh not." How much work is there in "worketh not"?

One of the meanings of the word here translated "worketh" is "to produce", or "to exercise." Whatever man produces is a work of man. In the light of this truth it is apparent that there is much "works for sal-vation" being preached being preached and taught by those who profess to believe in salvation by grace.

A "work" may be something done with the head, heart or hand. Of course if one says that he believes that one must be baptized in order to finally be saved, we know that he believes in salvation by works. We can see that. But, suppose someone preaches that the lost sinner must be sorry for his sins, turn away from his sins, give up his sins, beg God to save him, and "exercise" faith of a certain kind, before he can be saved. It that not salvation by works

God's gospel is good news. It is not something for poor, lost, helpless man to do, but it is a message of what a loving, gracious and merciful God has done for him. And what He has done for him is reckoned, or counted to him, not for work performed or promised, but to him "who worketh not." It is counted for righteousness when he "believeth in Him that justifieth the ungodly." This verily is the message of grace.

If lost men are not to work for salvation, how then may they be saved? They may be saved eternally and unconditionally by grace. Grace is favor shown of God upon utterly unworthy sinners.

How does He impart His wonderful grace? He does it through the Lord Jesus Christ who is revealed only in His Word. "The Word of God is quick (life-giving), and powerful" (Heb. 4:12). "Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the Word of God, which liveth and abideth forever" (I Pet. 1:23). "The gospel of Christ is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek. For therein is the righteousness of God revealed" (Rom: 1:16, 17).

Men may hear His Word and learn of Him. "Every man therethat hath heard, and hath learned of the Father, cometh unto (John 6:45). Those who hear God's Word, and see Him God reveals therein, Whom come to Him, or believe in Him, and are born of God. "This is the will of Him that sent Me, that every one that seeth the Son, and believeth on Him may have everlasting life; and I will raise him up at the last day" (John 6:40).

1. Rosh (Russia), Meshech (Moscow), Tubal (Tobolsk). 2. Togormah (Armenia), now taken over by Russia and Turkey. 3. Libya, or Put. The name of Put is found on some Egyptian monuments, scholars tell us. They identify it as all the north shore of Africa, west of Egypt and the Nile river. It is possible that it may be Eritrea or Somaliland. 4. Persia (Iran). We are familiar with this land through much Bible history, and by happenings of recent time.
