This is one of the greatest disappointments we have ever had relative to any work. Brother Crace is truly an able preacher. Everything had gone so smoothly relative to their going to New Guinea, and it looked as if God were leading every step of the way. Sufficient support in his behalf was available, and for him to be there to augment the work of Brother Halliman seemed to be a perfect missionary set up.

We will never know until we get to Glory just why God has planned it thus. We submit our wills to Him today with the fullest of assurance that what He has done is well done.

Further announcement will be made as to her condition, and other details will be released, just as soon as we learn them. 1. Baptism is a divine command. "And he (Peter) commanded them to be baptized in the name of the Lord." - Acts 10:48. See also Acts 2:38, 22:16, and Matt. 28:19-20.

2. The water baptism commanded in the New Testament is immersion only. "One Lord, one faith, one baptism." - Eph. 4:5. That the New Testament teaches immersion only is proved by the following facts:

(a) The Greek word "Baptizo," translated into English as "baptize," means to immerse, to dip, to plunge, to submerge, to overwhelm, etc., and nothing else. "But as many as received Him There is a good Greek word for "sprinkle," which is "rantizo";



Because a true Baptist 1 Church stands for the largest body of New Testament truth of any church in your community. 2. A Baptist Church is modeled after the New Testament churches in the following respects:

(a) It requires regeneration before baptism and church membership.—John 3:7.

(b) It does not baptize infants. (c) It has no man-made creed, but takes the New Testament alone as its creed.

(d) It is a pure democracy; it is independent of all bishops, popes, councils, conventions, synods, conferences or human overlords. Christ alone is its head, and it conducts its affairs as He directs through the Holy Spirit. But Baptist Churches may and do c'ooperate.

(e) Every member has equal and the Lord's Supper, and privileges in a Baptist Church.

(f) It has only two classes of church officers, pastors and deacons. Bishop, elder, shepherd, and pastor are New Testament words all standing for the same office.

(g) It stands for equality of ministers; no graduations in the ministry, with some the overlords of others.

(h) It stands for the direct approach of every believer to God, without the aid of human mediators, rituals, ceremonies, or forms.

"But of that day and hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels of heaven, but my Father only." — Mt. 24:36. (Continued on page 4, column 3)

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



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


"Is one Church as good as another?"

I do not mean that Brother Gilpin acted silly in giving us this question. It is well to have it aired. But the very idea of anyone thinking that a church started by Henry VIII is just as good as the one started by the Lord of glory is absurd to the Nth degree. This old renegade lived with six different wives during his church's first fourteen years of existence. One of them died in the dungeon where she had been thrown in order to get her out of his way. Two of the others had their heads cut off for the same reason. And still another one of them died of some cause or other after only one year with this old cut throat. If a man like that could start a church just as good as the one our Lord started it just means that our Lord did not do too good a job of it Himself. # HE GIVETH SEED TIME AND HARVEST

By the spring of 1917 the German scientists had solved the problem of growing food and grain, and perfected it as it had never before been perfected in the history of the world. They announced that Germany would have the potato crop of all time: that they had put in each potato hill that which would kill every enemy of the potato under ground and above ground. And how the potatoes of Germany grew. When those uncounted acres and miles were in blossom, lo, a blight heretofore unknown swept the potato fields of Germany, and in a day they were scorched, scabbed, shrivelled as though fireswept, and hungry Germany learned the bitter truth uttered by Napoleon.
