

Parents must be careful to accede to every whim of the child, give him everything he wants within the parents' ability to give. This might wreck the family finances, but, never mind, they can recover after the child finishes growing up!

This discipline is required because the parent loves his child, and realizes that he must be carefully and firmly trained; the child is unable to make a proper adjustment to life Lord." without such discipline.

Discipline is demanded of parents:

Prov. 13:24: "He that spareth his rod hateth his son: but he that veth him chasteneth him betimes." See also Prov. 22:15.

Prov. 22:15: "Foolishness is bound in the heart of a child: but the rod of correction shall drive it from him."

Prov. 23:13: "Withhold not correction from the child."

Prov. 29:15: "The rod and reproof give wisdom: but a child left to imself bringeth his mother to shame."

Prov. 22:6: "Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he old, he will not depart from it."

And Ephesians 6:4, firmly commands parents to "bring their children up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord."

"My son, despise not the chastening of the Lord, nor faint when thou fu art rebuked of him: for whom the Lord loveth He chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom He receiveth. If ye endure chastening, God dealeth with you as with sons: for what son is he whom his father chasteneth not? But if ye be without chastisement, whereof all are partakers, then are ye bastards and not sons." (Heb. 12:5-8).

May God help parents to be consistent in the most important business in the world — child training!

Should the Board of Deacons "run" a Baptist Church?

There are two things that I do not understand about this of Deacons"?

Nowhere do I read in the Bible of such a thing as a "Board of Deacons." We do have the work of the deacons outlined in Acts 6:1-4, and the qualifications of a deacon outlined in I Timothy 3:8-13. None of these qualifications or duties would suggest or of Deacons."

Second. What do you mean "run a Baptist 'Church"?

Nobody "runs" a Baptist Church. In Acts 20:17-35 we are given the account of Paul teaching the Elders (or Pastors). In verse 28 the pastor is told to watch the flock because he is the overseer. This does not teach that the pastor runs the church. Certainly if anyone could be justified to "run" the church it would be the pastor and not the deacons.



God calls men to be "overseers" over his flocks, and these men are designated "bishops, elders, or shepherds (pastors). They are never desig-nated "deacons." If the beginning of the office of deacon is found in the 6th chapter of Acts, as I fully believe, then deacons exist for the purpose of helping the ministry-taking from them the burden of material things such that they can more readily give themselves to "prayer and ministry of the Word." (Acts 6:4). However, this certainly does not mean that they are to take over and run things without regard to the God-called ministers.

Incidentally, there is no Scripture for a "BOARD" of deacons. The term and meaning of the word "Board" has been added. In many instances deacons consider it their perrogative to both almost add, with a good swift kick in the pants. The climate of our day is one of intellectual pride, with the insistence that truth is relative and that nothing is absolute. Even evangelicals are beginning to feel uncertain. Neat slogans are swallowed without even being tasted. 'We preach Christ, not a creed," we hear, and "Let us propagate the gospel, not argue about it." It is true that the propagation of the gospel is important, but so is its preservation. Let us sound forth the truth, but first let us make certain that what we send forth is the truth.

Worse than incorrect and incomplete doctrine, however, is unapplied doctrine. The application of sound doctrine to life makes truth more than an intellectual concert, more than an accumulation of facts. The English word "doctrine" is found fortynine times in the King James Version of the New Testament. There are three Greek words thus translated, two of them translated forty-eight times as "doctrine" and also appearing in other refer-ences as "taught," "teaching" and "learning." In all but four of the passages there is clear emphasis upon conduct and duty.

Fourteen times the word is mentioned in the Gospels, describing the ministry of Jesus. We read several times that the people were astonished at His doctrine. He warned against the doctrine of the Pharisees and Sadducees, calling it leaven and pointing out their hypocrisy in honoring God with their lips while their hearts were far from Him. To Jesus, doc-

In the Book of Acts the word occurs four times. At Mars' Hill the philosophers requested Paul to make known this "new doctrine." They were wrong in thinking that his teaching was just another presentation of philosophical speculations, given in words that would sound beautiful to the ear as from the tongue gifted orator. Paul's doctrine included the creation, the resurrection and coming judgment. The real issue is pointed out by the record of his audience's response to what he said: some mocked, although others believed. Doctrine is to be believed.

"Known unto God are all his works from the beginning of the world." -- Acts 15:18.






