

> The next day (the first Sabbath of May, 1853), the sun seemed to come out from the horizon and rise above our heads with more than usual magnificance. 

There are two things that would indicate to me that these witnesses "might" be Elias and Moses. Yes, I believe that these two witnesses will be Elias and Moses. The reason that I believe them to be the two witnesses are the characteristics which surround these two witnesses. These have power to shut heaven, that it rain not in the days of their prophecy: and have power over waters to turn them to blood, and to smite the earth with all plagues, as oft as they will. Read Rev. 11:

We know that the miracle of shutting up the heavens that it rain not in the days of their prophecy, is characteristic Elijah, who in the days of Ahab shut up heaven so that it rained not for the space of three years and six months. Read James 5:17.

The miracles of turning waters with all plagues is characteristic of Moses, who in the days of Pharoah king of Egypt, performwater into blood, and smiting the earth with plagues.

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The Lord was not referring to John The Baptist for John had already been beheaded by Herod. Therefore he was referring to a future date when Elias is to come and restore all things. As John the Baptist was the forerunner of the first event, so will Elias be the forerunner of the second event. John the Baptist did not restore anything, and Malachi's prophecy that Elijah would not come until just before the great and dreadful day of the Lord

to come. Read Mal. 4:5. Now I realize that there are a great many who believe that Enoch is to be the second witness, the reason that they give for their theory is, that Enoch was translated, and did not taste death; therefore he must be brought back and taste death. Read Heb. 9:27. But at the time of the preaching of these two witnesses there will be a vast company in Heaven who did not taste death, for the rapture will have taken place before these two witnesses are sent to earth. Read I Cor. 15:51-52.

Enoch is a type of the saints who are to be raptured before the tribulation period, and for him to be one of the two witnesses does not bear out the type.


"By faith Enoch was translated that he should not see death." Heb. 11:5.

We are told that these two witnesses "have power to shut heaven, that it rain not in the days of their prophecy; and have power over waters to turn them to blood, and to smite the earth with all plagues, as often as they will." - Rev. 11:6.

If we study the lives of Elias and Moses we will find that they indeed had power to do these things. Elias stopped the rain. 'Elias was a man subject to like passions as we are, and he prayed earnestly that it might not rain: and it rained not on the earth by the space of three years and six months." - James 5:17 and ". . . As the Lord God of Israel liveth, before whom I (Elijah) stand, there shall not be dew nor rain three years, but according to my word." I Kings 17:1. Moses turned the water to blood and brought plagues upon Egypt as we are told in Exodus 7 and 8.




