

The New Testament was written by Baptists. Those were the only persons that could have written it, for there wasn't anything else back there. Every individual who wrote any portion of the New Testament had received Baptist baptism. So, beloved, the New Testament was written by Baptists, and certainly was written to Baptists, because there wasn't anybody else in that day but Baptists. Certainly it is written about Baptists, because there wasn't anybody else they could write about, and God knows we are to make Baptists.

That was true not only in that day, but it is true in this day. Therefore I want to talk to you about Baptist peculiarities, and I take this text as the basis of my message. When God talks about us being a peculiar people, He is talking about Baptists -because, as I say, the New Testament was written by Baptists, about Baptists, for Baptists, and to make Baptists.

We ought to magnify our peculiarities. I know people who try to cover over their peculiarities and try to see how nearly like everybody they can be. I know Baptist preachers who take an extreme position in trying to cover over their peculiar beliefs as Baptists. I tell you, beloved, if there is anything I try to do, it is to magnify our peculiarities so as to cause people to want to know what we believe.

I remember years ago when I first became pastor of the First Baptist Church at Russell one of the ladie's of the church was talking to another woman, who was a Methodist. I overheard the conversation and this lady who was a member of the church of which was pastor was saying to this Methodist lady, "There is not much difference between you and us—just more or less the matter of baptism." I said, "Sister, don't that lady go away from here thinking that you are telling her the truth, because you are not.
