Suppose you were in a smith's shop, and should see there several sorts of tools, some crooked, some bowed, others hooked, would you condemn all these things, because they do not look handsome? The smith makes use of them all for doing his work. Thus it is with the providences of God; they seem to us to be very crooked and strange, yet they all carry on God's work. I shall make this clear to you in two particular

First, God's people are sometimes low. It seems to be out of order that they who are best should be in the lowest condition; but there is much wisdom in this providence, as appears thus: (1) Perhaps the hearts of the godly were lifted up with riches, or with success; now God comes with a humbling providence to afflict them and fleece them. Better is the loss that makes them humble than the success that makes them proud.

Again, (2) If the godly were not sometimes afflicted, and suffered an eclipse in their outward comforts, how could their graces be seen, especially their faith and patience? If it were always sunshine we should see no stars; so if we should have always prosperity, it would be hard to see the acting of men's faith. Thus you see God's providences are wise and regular, though to us they seem very strange and crooked.

Second, here is another case: The wicked flourish. This seems to be very much out of order, but God in His providence, sees good sometimes that the worst of

Without this wise providence of God there would be anxiety and confusion in the whole world, just like an army when it is routed and scattered The providence of God infuses comfort and virtue into everything we enjoy. Our clothes would not warm us, our food would not nourish us, without the special providence of God. And does not all this deserve your admiration of providence?

2. Learn quietly to submit to divine providence. Do not murmur at things that are ordered by divine wisdom. We may no more find fault with the works of providence than we may with the works of creation. It is a sin as much to quarrel with God's providence in his master-wheel that turns these letter wheels, and God will bring His glory out of all at last. 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

(4) Let it be an antidote against immoderate fear, that nothing comes to pass but what is ordained by God's decree, and ordered by His providence. We sometimes fear what the issue of things, will be, when men grow high in their acting but let us not make things worse by our fear. Men are limited in their power, and cannot go one hair's breadth farther than God's providence permits. He might let Sennacherib's army march towards Jerusalem, but shall not shoot one arrow against it. "Then the angel of the Lord went forth and smote in the camp of the Assyrians an hundred and fourscore and five thousand" (Isaiah 38:36). When Israel was encompassed between Pharaoh and the Red Sea, no question some of their hearts began to tremble, and they looked upon themselves as dead men; but providence so ordered it, that the sea was a safe passage to Israel, and a sepulchre to Pharaoh and all his host.

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

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

bringing their sick and disabled line, laying hands on all, while great numbers. The native Navajo religion is almost totally occupied with the healing of the body by the process of driving out the demons, hence it was quite natural for them to respond to the appeal of the white medicine man.

The Navajos do not have ready access to medical care and as a result will allow their ailing ones to become advanced in their illness before they will seek help. In cases of accident the victim will often allow a broken or crushed limb to heal without medical care, resulting in obvious, permanent disabilities. Blindness is common among Indians often because of too little attention being paid to the arresting or correction of sight problems. A congenital deformity of the hip joints is common among Navajos swelling and numbers of obvious cripples; thus when the healing campaign was announced a vertitable wave of these unfortunates advanced on Window Rock.

There are no hypochondriacs among the Indians. When an Indian hurts, he really hurts, thus every case presented was gen-

In asserting his authority as a healer, Mr. Roberts read the incident in Luke's gospel, chapter 4, verses 16-19, in which the Lord Jesus asserted his Messiahship in these words:

"The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the broken hearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind." Mr. Roberts then said, "I, too, have this anointing."

Prayer cards, a prerequisite to admission to the healing line, were issued at the morning sessions to great numbers. The climatic healing service was scheduled for Wednesday afternoon, the closing day of the crusade, when all bearers of prayer cards would be prayed with who had not been cared for previously.

On Wednesday afternoon the stands were a riot of color such as can be seen only in Navajo land. A stage had been erected on the racetrack in front of the grandstand. This was not large enough to accommodate the crowds bearing prayer cards but was large enough to screen from the view of the spectators the 50 or more "blanket" and wheelchair cases who were ushered into this

After the preliminaries, the holders of prayer cards were ordered to leave the stands and assemble in the track in front of the stage. They were then ordered to form a single line and march around the one-mile race track. These sick ones could be seen hobbling around the track in the hot afternoon sun until a solid line had formed occupying the entire circuit, with the exception of about 250 feet, immediately in front of the stands. Many were clustered at the end of the line waiting for the line to advance.

"Behold, I stand at the door, and knock; if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me."-Revelation 3:20.

Every Arminian in the country has a sermon on this text, and I have never yet heard them preach it to mean anything else but this: "Christ is standing at the sinner's heart, knocking, longing for entrance within. But the latch is on the inside of the door, and Christ is helpless to come in, unless the sinner opens the door.

The idea that the "door" referred to is the "door" of the sinner's heart, is an undisputed interpretation among the Arminians. Such a notion makes good preaching for the high-pressuring decisionist, for when he comes to give an invitation, he, in so many words, says, "Christ is at the door; He's knocking; He wants in. But He can't come unless you let Him. It's up to you. Now let's sing another verse of 'You Must Open the Door.'

But contrary to the ideas of the Arminians, I want to show you from God's Book that this verse in no wise means that Christ is knocking on the "door" of the sinner's heart; and then, I want you to simply notice from God's Word at whose door Christ is knocking.

(1) To interpret the "door" of Revelation 3:20 to be the sinner's heart is to give an interpretation that is not even hinted in the passage itself, in its context, in the Book of Revelation, nor in the whole of the Word of God. There is not a grain of Scripture that even hints that Christ is knocking at the "door" of the sinner's heart.

Look at Revelation 3:20 again, and tell me, Do you read, "Behold I stand at the door of the sinner's heart and knock?" Why, no you don't. It just isn't there, nor is it to be found elsewhere in the Word of God. When there is nothing given in the Word of God by which we can interpret the figure of speech Christ here uses, we had better stick to the context for the meaning, especially since the meaning is quite clear from the context, as we shall soon notice.

(2) But I wish to call your attention to Scripture which definitely reveals that this "door" at which Christ is knocking could not be the "door" of the sinner's heart. Listen to Ezekiel 36:26

"A new heart also will I give you." What does it say? A "new heart!" What does God do! He "gives" a new heart. Now, I haven't the space to discuss the matter of the "new heart," but if you believe that God gives men a new heart in saving them, then you and I will have no conflict as to our understanding of Revelation 3:20. For you and I do not believe that Jesus wants into the old, rotten, depraved, vile heart. Instead, He gives a "new heart," and He dwells in it. The old heart is full of iniquity (Jeremiah 17:9); it is the fountain-head of sin (Mark 7:20-23); it is the source of ignorance (Ephesians 4:18). Certainly, Jesus doesn't want to enter such a heart. So He gives a "new heart" just as He gives "all things" new.

We, as saints, have a new song (Revelation 5:9), a new man (Colossians 3:10), a new life (John 5: 24, Ephesians 2:1, a new mind (I Corinthians 2: 16), and we shall have a new body (I Corinthians 15:51-58). It is no wonder that we have all things new, for the "old things" (II Corinthians 5:17), were and are wholly unprofitable (John 6:63).

Jesus said that men do not put new wine into old wineskins (or bottles) else the old skins will burst. Neither does our Lord take up His abode in the old "wineskin" of the depraved heart. No, Jesus doesn't knock on the old heart; instead, He gives us a new heart. So Revelation 3:20 could not refer to the sinner's old heart.

(3) In view of man's total depravity, those who teach that Revelation 3:20 refers to the sinner's eart, impute gross ignorance to the Lord Jesus Christ, our all-wise Sovereign. What if Jesus had gone out to the tomb of Lazarus (see John 11). and walked over to the tomb and knocked, knocked, and knocked, waiting for Lazarus himself to open the tomb so that He could come in? Why, such an act would have certainly disapproved the normalcy of Jesus' mind. Lazarus had been dead for this idea the incident in Matfor four days, and was stinking. Does anyone thew 14:22-27, emphasizing the think that Lazarus could have gotten up from death to "open the door" for the Lord to enter? Why no, no one thinks thusly.

Well, beloved, the sinner's spiritual condition is just as bad as was Lazarus' physical condition. Lazarus was dead physically; the sinner is dead spiritually, "dead in trespasses and in sins" (Ephesians 2:1). Lazarus' body was decaying, and the stench of his rotten, sinful nature is an abomina-

tion to God. Would it have been good sense on the part of Jesus for Him to wait for Lazarus to open the door? Why, if the Lord had left it to Lazarus, the man would still be in the tomb. Now, do you think that it is good sense to say that the Lord was outside the sinner's heart waiting for the spiritually dead sinner to open the door?" What can that spiritually dead man do by way of "opening the door?" He can't see and hear spiritual things (Matthew 13:13-15); he can't understand spiritual things (I Corinthians 2:17); his flesh is wholly unprofitable with regard to spiritual things (Rom-

No, beloved, the Lord has more sense than the Arminian credits Him with. He knows better than to wait outside the "door" of the sinner's heart. Instead of knocking on the old heart, Jesus gives a "new heart," as we have seen. His Word and Spirit quickened dead Lazarus to life.

(4) The Bible teaches us that the regenerating carded prayer cards. It bore this agent in the new birth is God's Spirit. Of course, the Spirit and the Word of God are both necessary. However, the Spirit is the One that "quickens" (John 6:63). The Word is the Spirit's Sword (Ephesians 6:17). When the Spirit works in the sinner, He doesn't "knock." The Lord is not the clay, and the sinner is not the potter. Note from God's Word that the Lord isn't helpless in any wise at all. We read in John 5:21, "For as the Father raiseth up the dead, and quickeneth them; even so the Son quickeneth whom he will." Jesus doesn't "knock;" He quickens; and He quickens

whom He will. In John 10:26, we read, "But ye believe not, because ye are not of my sheep." Some didn't believe. Why? "Because ye are not my sheep." The sheep, Jesus said, "hear my voice." Why? In the old days the young girls had songs they would sing to cast spells upon young men to prevent them from befriending another girl and they are still known but not practiced among the Christian people. A girl may threaten to commit suicide if she fears that her suitor is not interested in her or begins courting someone else. In the seven years that I have been in New Guinea I have never known of a man committing suicide, but I know of several women that have done so; most of them have hung themselves and a few have jumped in rivers and drowned themselves. These suicides have always been as a result of young men befriending another girl or else as a result of quarrels between husband and wife

Leading Up To The Giving Of The Bride Price

If there is mutual desire between the girl and her suitor, the girl may take the initiative and go to live with the suitor's mother. This usually happens several months after the exchange of the first gift. The young man is then obligated to take the bride price to the girl's father within the next few days. If he does not have enough pigs (15 to 18) to make a proper bride price he may urge her to return to her house and wait until he can get enough pigs, or he may ask some of his relatives (usually his older brothers and uncles) to assist him and at a later date he will pay them back. 
