

3. Lodges, the one mentioned, and others, take the time and money and service that a Christian ought to bestow on the Lord's work.

4. No reward will be received from God for service rendered in a lodge. Why not work and serve where it will count for something for eternity?







But a study of the Word of God reveals to us that merely the use of the name "God" is not all that is necessary. For example, there is the God of the Pantheists, who say that God is found in the universe as a whole and that there is no God other than the combined forces and laws manifested in the existing universe. This, you see, is a conception of God quite different from that which the Scripture portrays, for Scripture sets forth a God who is a Person; that is, who has the attributes of personality, who thinks, who hears, who feels, who sees, who loves, who speaks.

Then there is the God of the Mohammedan — Allah — a God whose only prophet was Mohammed. This is not at all the Scriptural conception of God. There is the God of the Buddhist, the God of the Theosophist, the God of the Confucianist, the God of all of the false religions which is not the God of the Bible.


