

I know of missionaries who went out on the streets and held meetings for children and strongly urged them to raise their hands and then counted them as "decisions" and sent reports to the Sword of the Lord. Since Rice delights in numbers they gave him numbers. Unlike the day of Pentecost when those that were counted were those who had been baptized and added to the local church, these who count decisions mostly count those they claim were added to the "invisible church" so no one can verify it or not. If the numbers given in missionary reports since the end of World War II were all added up, I doubt not that the sum would be greater than the population of Japan. 
