# History Of The Baptists In Great Britain

PART I

FROM THE FIRST AGES TO THE END OF THE 16TH CENTURY


1. The church formed in Jerusalem (A.D. 34) was composed of those who received the Word with joy, and were, on their professed belief, immersed into Christ's name. All other churches were formed after this model (I Thess. 2:14; I Cor. 11:2). This was the parent institution, and became the civil powers, they attended their pattern to after ages. "No persons were admitted to baptism," says Mosheim, "but such as had been previously instructed

in the principal points of Christianity, and had also given satisfactory proofs of pious dispositions and upright intentions."

The gospel is said to have made considerable progress in this island about A.D. 167, and the churches then planted were preserved for a long time from errors so common in the East. In the fourth century (A.D. 303), professors abounded there. Their steadfastness was severely tried by the edicts of Diocletian (A.D. 306). While thus obnoxious to the privileges with little pomp. By Constantine's favour, they emergworldly and corrupt. The sentiments of Pelagius rent the island (A.D. 315). Two divines from the continent succeeded in reclaiming the wanderers (A.D. 410), and these were rebaptized in the river Allen, near Chester.

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## The Holiness Of God

(Continued from Page One) is often asserted in the Holy Writ. The 144,000 Israelites sing of Him: "For thou only art holy" (Rev. 15:4). The word "only" is very expressive in this verse. It is used in a comparative sense. God is so pure that it may be said that in comparison with Him, no one else is holy. He sits as the Holy One "upon the throne of His holiness" (Ps. 47:8).

Negatively, it means God is separate from moral evil and sin. The second idea grows out of the former. In virture of His holiness God can have no communion with sin. This may be called the ethical holiness of God. God never has a sinful thought; His nature is "without iniquity" (Deut. 32:4). Elihu said: "Therefore hearken unto me, ye men of understanding: far be it from God, that he should do wickedness; and from the Almighty, that he should commit pression of Himself than anything iniquity" (Job 34:10). #### HOLINESS DECORATED

Holiness is a transcendental attribute of God. It runs through the rest of His attributes and casts luster upon the others. Holiness is an attribute of attributes. It is central and supreme perfection of God. Some say it is not so much a distinctive attribute as the combination of all His attributes.

Omnipotence is God's hand, omniscience His eye, mercy His bowels, eternity His duration, but holiness is His beauty. This moral perfection renders Him supremely lovely. The singers of Israel were appointed to "praise the beauty "the beauty of the Lord" (Ps. 27: 4). In the Bible His people are the beauty of holiness" (I Chron. 16:29).

#### HOLINESS DISTRIBUTED

In the Bible we read of "the holy God" in Joshua 24:19. "God" here is "Elohim," a uniplural noun in the Hebrew. It can be translated "the holy Ones." The reference is to the three Divine Persons — the Holy Father, the Holy Son, and the Holy Spirit. The seraphims of Heaven cry, "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord of hosts" (Isa. 6: 3). The God of the Bible is thrice holy, seeing He is holy in all three Persons. His power is spoken of twice (Ps. 62:11) but His holiness three times.

God the Father is called by the Son "holy Father" (John 17:11). All that can be said of the holiness of God belongs to Him. The epithet "holy" shows the Father is separate from the impurity and pollution of all moral evil.

The same may be said of the Son who is called "the holy One of Israel" about 30 times in the Book of Isaiah. When addressing the church at Philadelphia Christ said: "These things saith he that is holy" (Rev. 3:7). The Saviour was holy in His incarnation. In the womb of the virgin He was denominated "that holy thing" (Luke 1:35), and after His birth He was addressed as the "holy child Jesus" (Acts 4:27). The demons spoke of Christ as "the Holy One of God" (Luke 4:34).

The holiness of the Third Person in the Trinity is seen in His common title "the Holy Spirit." Like out immediately. the Father and the Son, He is holy in nature and essence. The Scriptures say He is grieved with the impurities of men (Eph. 4:29-30). Evil is contrary to His pure and holy nature.

(Continued from page one) in the very positive response which was given by the Lord; namely, "It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God . . . It is written again, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God . . . " and "It is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve" (Mt. 4:4,7,10).

Satan was unsuccessful with Jesus. Across the centuries, however, Satan has found multitudes to do his bidding. These may make continuing references to the Scriptures and even to Jesus, but their supposed places of worship and religious institutions are scenes of idolatry, and their repetitious praying is as futile as the efforts of those who spend a good part of their religious lives simply turning prayer wheels.

Strange as it may seem, the most successful religious leaders of our day have given the prayer wheels of the pagans a twentieth century turn. They have turned to sophisticated, and sometimes even computerized, prayer wheels. Whether on a local, statewide, national, or even worldwide basis, some religious leaders array their cheisant subjects for around-theclock praying. They suppose thereby to impress other deluded mortals and to storm the gates of causes, their funds, and their religious fantasies.

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

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



The Baptists now adopted a plan

from the pen of a Lollard, entitled "The Prayer and Complaint of the Plowman." It is the production of a Baptist, as it enjoins yea, yea, and nay, nay, in conversation; and baptism after teaching, as in Acts 2:38; Matthew 28:20. Its tone is querulous and severe against priests. Vices are condemned, and retaliation forbidden. In 1368, thirty errors in matters of religion were charged on the people in the neighborhood of Canterbury; one was, that children could be saved without water baptism (Du Pin); but none gave baptism to children at this time but for salvation (Wall).

5. In 1372, Wycliffe, who received his religious views from the Lollards, appeared as a reformer. His views on baptism were condemned at the council of Blackfriars (Du Pin); but he is described as "qualifying his assertions in such a sort, that he did mitigate and assuage the rigour of his ene-Baptists, Great Britain mies" (Fox). 6. The printing of the Scriptures called forth Colet, Latimer, and others, to preach publicly (1505), which aided the Bible-men, and led the way to the changes made by Henry VIII. Tyndale's New Testament threw a flood of light upon the English nation (1527). The king's misunderstanding with the pope led him to relieve and encourage the Lollards everywhere (1534); and their brethren, with foreigners of every sentiment, flocked into England to enjoy liberty, and strengthen true religion.

A book of the Lollards, entitled "The Sum of the Scriptures" was examined by the archbishop; he condemned the party who circulated it, for denying the baptism of the church. Fourteen Mennonite brethren suffered death cheerfully (1535); and the reproach of anabaptism now supplanted that of the word Lollardism. These martyrdoms did not check their sentiments, but rather led men to investigate them; and such was the alarm of the clergy, that a convocation was called, seventysix of their alleged errors condemned, and measures devised for their suppression.

After the deaths of Anne Boleyn, and Wolsey, means of a severe character were adopted. Their opinions were exhibited in the upper house (1537), and articles framed for the regulation of anabaptism. Private inquisitions were started in every parish for their detection; and all books on baptism, lately imported, were proscribed. These enactments did not silence them; they still censured Henry's church, and ridiculed all his measures of reformation. Strype says, "the Baptists pestered the church, and would openly dispute their principles in public places." From the general pardon granted in 1539, the Baptists in prison were exempted.

The Dutch Baptists still flocked into England, and some few of these Donatists fresh dipped, as suffered in Smithfield for their infidelity. All anabaptistical books were again condemned, and mag-

These people are worthy of greater commendation than others, on account of the harmlessness of their lives. But they are oppressed by all other sects." And Bullinger says (1538), (Hist. of Anab.), "Let others say what they will of the Anabaptists, I see nothing in them but gravity; I hear nothing from them, but that we must not swear; must not do any injury; that all ought to be pious, and live holy lives; therefore I see nothing of evil in them. They use yea and nay in their conversation."
