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THE IMPORTANCE OF THE SECOND COMING OF CHRIST JESUS

Taylor, Michigan "And said unto him, Art thou He that should come, or do we look for another?" (Matthew 11:3).

It is obvious that the coming to which John the Baptist refers in this question is what we commonly term the incarnation of Jesus Christ.

Also, in Hebrews 10:37 we read: "For yet a little while, and He that shall come will come, and will not tarry." The coming that is referred to in this chapter is the advent of Jesus Christ which is still future, which we term the second coming of Jesus Christ.

The incarnation was for the express purpose of fulfilling a covenant agreement which Jesus Christ had with the Father, that He should come and assume bodily flesh, and redeem those whom God had chosen in Him. This is not the first time the incarnation of Jesus had appeared on earth. In the Old Testament, you will find that the Angel of Jehovah that is referred to over and over again is, in reality, Jesus Christ in a preincarnate form. These appearances are referred to by the theologians as "theophanies," that is a temporary assumption of some bodily form with man. The incarnation, of course, is different from a theophany in that an incarnation is a permanent assumption of bodily form. Jesus shall never lay aside that

IS ONE BAPTIST CHURCH AS GOOD AS ANOTHER?

The answer is a positive no! Undoubtedly the seven churches mentioned in Revelation were what we would today term "Baptist" churches, because that early, there were no other churches - even as John Clark Redpath, Methodist historian said when he wrote, "In the first century-all Christians were Baptists." Now among those seven churches, was one as good as another? Compare the church at Ephesus (Rev. 2:1-4) with the

church at Laodicea (3:14-19). Quite a difference indeed.

Let us make some comparisons between Baptist churches of this day:

church that stands for the whole Word of God. Some Baptist churches in the north, particulary, have come to repudiate the full inspiration of the Scriptures, the deity of Christ and in general the fundamentals of Christianity. Such a church has ceased to be a real Baptist church and it is a sin to belong to such. Gods Word concerning such is "Come ye out from among them" (II Cor. 6:17).

Then some Baptist churches that hold to the fundamentals of Christianity are loose on other doctrines. They ignore what the Bible says about women speaking, leading in prayer, etc. in public, mixed gatherings of men and women. Yet the Bible is plain (I Cor. 14:34). They receive alien baptism-that is, baptism administered by manfounded churches. They practice open communion when the Bible makes clear that such is unscriptural (See I Cor. 11:18-20-Revised Version). A church that carelessly junks even a portion of the Bible is not as good as one that respects it all (See Matt. 5:19).

2. A church that is wordly in life is not as good as one that stands for separation (See Rom. 12:2). The average Baptist church is rotten worldly, and little is said against the worldly amusements that characterize (Continued on Page 6 Column 1)

If you will notice on the left hand side, the large letters reading down is T-U-L-I-P. tulip. I want each one of these letters to represent a particular doctrine - a doctrine that we find in this fourth chapter of John.

passage of Scripture — the fourth chapter of John - and I think this chapter illustrates to us every one of these truths. I think we can see in this woman of John 4 every one of these truths working. I think she can be said to be a sample sinner. and that we could push her forward and say, "This is a sample of what a "Tulip Baptist" is.

TOTAL DEPRAVITY.

There isn't any question but what this woman was totally depraved. I need not go back and argue as to what her nature was. Her practice is enough to show that she was totally

depraved. Listen:

"Jesus saith unto her, Go. call thy husband, and come hither. The woman answered and said, I have no husband. Jesus said unto her, Thou hast well said, I have no husband: For thou hast had five husbands: and he whom thou now hast is not thy husband: in that saidst thou truly" (John 4:16-18).

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I am not arguing about what her nature was. for there practice certainly proves total depravity. Apparently, she had been divorcing men in a wholesale fashion. She got tired (Continued on Page 2 Column 1)

I say to you, this woman is no exception. She is exactly and precisely like everyone of us here within the house of God. There is no difference. We all stand totally depraved in the sight of God. Listen:

As I say, this text in the Psalms tells us of God's introspection of this earth, and how God looks down upon humanity and comes to this conclusion, that "they are all gone aside, they are all together become filthy: there is none that doeth good, no, not one.' Without an exception, the whole human family is totally depraved.

The New Testament presents to us the same truth. When the Apostle Paul was writing to the church at Rome, he said:

"For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:23).

There is an underlying imagery here — that of a man shooting at a target with an arrow. One arrow goes up almost to the target. Another arrow falls just at the feet of the bowman. Other arrows fall in between. Not a single arrow hits the target. Not a single arrow overshoots the target. All the arrows fall short of the target. Paul says that we are all wiming at the glory of God; we are all striving to reach the glory of God, but we have all sinned and come short of the glory of God. Not a single person has reached the target. Not a single person has overshot the target. Some may have come up fairly close and others may have fallen far away, but all have fallen short of the glory of God. That is just another way of saying that we are totally depraved.

When the Apostle Paul wrote unto the churches of Galatia, one thing he emphasized above all else was the depravity of those Galatian individuals. They had heard the truth. They had turned from the truth. They had gone back away from the truth to the extent that Paul says, "Ye are fallen from grace" - that is, they have fallen away from the system of grace as taught in the Bible. In order to show them why they have done this, he says:

"But the scripture hath

possessed a big wart on the end painted this picture, and pulled back the curtain to unveil it, as gaze of Mr. Cromwell, Cromwell looked at it, to realize there was no wart on the end of his nose. Cromwell said. "Where is my wart?" The artist tried to tell him that he thought he would look better without it. and therefore he left it off the painting. Cromwell said, "That is not a painting of me. I want the wart on my nose.'

Beloved, there's not many people like Oliver Cromwell. We don't want the warts. We don't want the scars. We don't want the blemishes. We don't want the imperfections. We don't like to be told that we are totally depraved. We don't like for men and women to look at us in the light of the Word of God. because we have all sinned and come short of the glory of God. We don't like for the world to consider us as bad men and bad women. We like to think of ourselves as good and pure. We like for the world to think of us as somebody that is worthwhile. But, beloved, we stand in the sight of God totally depraved.

This woman is God's sample. God draws this woman out of His showcase and says, "Here is a sample - totally depraved."

UNCONDITIONAL ELEC-TION.

Here was a woman who was unconditionally elected of God unto salvation. There is not a condition laid down in this fourth chapter of John relative to her salvation. We read:

"And he must needs go through Samaria" (John 4:4).

A true Jew wouldn't have dared to set foot in Samaria. If a Jew were going from the southern section of Palestine to the northern section of Palestine, he would actually cross the Jordan River and go up the east side and cross back over the Jordan River to get back into the land that he wanted to go to, rather than journey through the country that was inhabited by the Samaritans. That was the ordinary travel on the part of the Jew from the South to the North.

Not so with Jesus. "He must needs go through Samaria." Unlike the average Jew, the Lord Jesus Christ had a need in going through Samaria, and that need was a Samaritan harlot who, before the foundation of the world, was unconditionally elected of God unto salvation. Now Jesus Christ passed through Samaria because there was a need that He go there. When the disciples came back and found Him sitting on the well of Sychar talking with this woman, they marvelled. They couldn't understand it. You and I couldn't understand it. You and I could never understand why God would save any of us, but unconditional election underlies the whole story.

Did He tell her to keep the law? Did He tell her to reform? Did He tell her to do any of the things that man ordinarily does today? No. Why? Because she was unconditionally elected of God unto salvation before the foundation of the world.

Whenever I think of this, it thrills my heart just to know that every man who is saved today, or shall ever be saved, was in the mind of God before the foundation of the world. This poor woman, a woman who had shed husbands as a winter's garment that she got rid of in the spring - this woman who was living in open sin with this individual who was not her husband. God knew that woman before the foundation of the world, and God elected her unto salvation.

Don't talk about salvation as though it were anything any of us deserve. Don't talk about salvation as though it were anything that any of us ought to receive from God. If this woman had gotten her just desserts, she would have gone to hell; and if you and I had gotten our just desserts every last one of us would have gone to Hell. We are all sinners. We are totally depraved. Like those of us who are saved, God had elected her unto salvation.

I don't know of anything that is more thrilling or more cheering than the story of the doctrine of election. I wouldn't have one reason to preach to you if I did not believe God had elected some of you to salvation. I know you are depraved. I know you can't save yourself. I know there is no hope for you unless God elected you to salvation.

We read:

"All that the Father GIVETH ME shall come to me" (John 6:37).

Thank God for this truth. If you have been given by God the Father as a part of the love gift that the Father gave to the Lord Jesus Christ, then all Hell can't keep you from being saved.

In that great High Priestly prayer that Jesus prayed. He said:

"As thou hast given him power over all flesh, that he should give eternal life to as many as THOU HAST GIVEN HIM" (John 17:2).

Who is it that is going to have eternal life? Every one that God gave to Jesus Christ.

Beloved, I could go through the Bible at length and read to you over and over again this blessed truth that you and 1 who are saved are the elect of God. We have been unconditionally elected. It is taught throughout the length and breadth, and the totality and entirety of the Bible. I thank God that I can look at this poor woman and can say that here is an example. If left to herself, she would have gone on shedding husbands. If left to herself, she would have gone on in her sins. But she wasn't left to herself, thank God! She was unconditionally elected of God the Father unto Jesus Christ, and unto salvation in Christ, before the foundation of the world.

woman, which testified. He told me all that ever I did" (John 4:39).

It doesn't say that this woman and all the city believed on Him, but it does say that this woman believed, and it says that many of theSamaritans of that city believed, and it says that many of the Samaritans of that city believed. Notice, it doesn't say all of them. His message of eternal life was a limited message. It was limited to the woman and to a number of the Samaritans in that city.

Beloved, mark it down, the message of salvation is not that all the world will be saved. That would be my desire. I would like to live in a world where everybody was saved. But the message in the Word of God is that the atonement that Jesus Christ wrought out at Calvary was a limited atonement.

In the Gospel of Matthew, when the Lord Jesus Christ was establishing the Lord's Supper and when He observed it for the first time, we read relative to the wine:

"And he took the cup and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of it; For this is my blood of the new testament, which is SH-**ED FOR MANY for the remis**sion of sins" (Mt. 26:27, 28).

Notice, He didn't say, "I die for everybody." He didn't say. "My blood is shed for all." Rather, He said, "My blood is shed for many, for the remission of sins." This is a lmited atonement.

This was prophesied in the Old Testament. Listen:

"He shall see of the travail of his soul, and SHALL BE SATISFIED" (Isa. 53:11).

Out younder in the future, the Lord Jesus Christ is going to look over all the ransomed throng and He is going to see the travail of His soul and be satisfied.

Will everybody be there? No. Will everybody be there that has ever been born into this world? No. There will be many thousands and millions and billions of earth's population that will not be in that ransomed throng. Yet He shall see of the . travail of His soul and He shall be satisfied. Why? Because every one for whom He died is going to be in that number.

66T Somebody may say, thought that Christ died for everybody." Beloved, if He did, there wouldn't be any need of preaching the Gospel. If Christ died for everybod we would all go to Heaven. If Christ died for everybody, there would never be a man go to hell, If Christ died for everyone, then we would have a universal atonement and everybody saved. If Christ died for everyone, then there would be no doubt that every man and woman in this world would be in Heaven. But you and I know that there have been multiplied thousands through the ages that have died and gone to hell, rejecting the Lord Jesus Christ. Why? Because His death was limited to the elect of God. Somebody may say, "Brother Gilpin, doesn't the Bible say that Christ tasted death for every man?" Yes, that expression is in the Bible, Listen: "But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honour; that he be the grace of God should taste (Continued on Page 3 Column 1)

NOT ONE" (Psa. 14:2, 3).

Can you imagine the Almighty introspectively looking toward this earth to see if He can find one human that understands and seeks after God? You would think out of all the millions and the billions that are living in this world that God would be able to find at least one person that is seeking after Him that God would be able to find at least one person that understands spiritual truth.

You can tell an individual anything you want so far as this world is concerned and hc will understand it. You can tell him how he can gratify his lust and you will have no difficulty making him understand. You can tell him how he can advance in wealth and wordly wisdom, and even in worldly education, and

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concluded ALL UNDER SIN" (Gal. 3:22).

The reason why these Galatian Christians had turned so completely from the system of grace to the system of works why they had turned so completely from truth unto error, was just one little three-letter word - sin. As he says, "The Scripture hath concluded all under sin."

I might turn through the Word of God and read Scripture after Scripture to prove this truth that all men are totally depraved. It isn't a subject that evokes very many "Amens" from a congregation. Very few people ever "Amen" a sermon on total depravity. The reason is, I am showing you what you are in the light of God's Word. I am showing you God's picture of you and me, and not many of us want that picture.

LIMITED ATONEMENT.

How many people did Jesus Christ appeal to in this fourth chapter of John? It was limited to this woman first of all. Then a little later, we read:

"And many of the Samaritans of that city believed on hm for the saying of the

death for every man" (Heb. 2:9).

But who were the men for whom He tasted death? The following verses say "many sons" and "they who are sanctified." A little later He calls them "breathren," and a little later He calls them "children." In other words, in verse 10 He refers to them as sons; in verse 11 as those that were snactified; in verse 12 He calls them brethren; in verse 13 He calls them His children. For whom did He taste death? For His sons, for those that were sanctified, for His brethren, and for His children.

You say, "But, Brother Gilpin, desn't the Bible also say that He is not willing that any should perish?" Yes, we have an expression like that in the Bible. Listen:

"The Lord is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentence" (II Pet. 3:9).

Now who is the "us-ward"? Go back to the first verse and you will find that He says:

"This second epistle, beloved, I now write unto you; in both which I stir up your pure minds."

To whom is He writing? To people who had pure minds, and He says, "This is the second espitle that I write."

Notice again:

"Simon Peter, a servant and an apostle of Jesus Christ, to them that have obtained like precious faith with us through the righteousness of God and our Saviour Jesus Christ: Grace an peace be multiplied unto you through the knowledge of God, and of Jesus our Lord" (II Pet. 1:1, 2).

To whom is he writing? To those who obtained like precious faith. When he says that He is longsuffering to us-ward, it means that He is longsuffering to the elect of God, that every one of them shall come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ/

How is it with you? Before you were saved, did you ever have a close call with death? Before you were saved, did you ever have an experience when you might have been wiped out of existence? I could go back to more than one such experience. I do mention one experience before I was saved when I could have been wiped out very quickly one Sunday afternoon, but God saw to it that that didn't take place. He was longsuffering to me that I might be saved. Beloved, I thank God that while the atonement is a limited atonement, it is limited to those that God has chosen to be His children, His sons, His heirs, His brethren, and those whom He has sanctified. It is limited to those whom He has chosen before the foundation of the world. I thank God that though it is limited, every one of the elect shall come to a saving knowledge of Him.

God's grace is irresistible. Notice:

"The woman then left her waterpot, and went her way into the city, and saith to the men, Come, see a man, which told me all things that ever I did: is not this Christ?" (John 4:28, 29).

This woman came to draw water. She didn't come to talk about her ex-husbands. She didn't come to talk religion. She came, I say, that day to get a pitcher of water at noontime, at the warmest time of the day, to slake her thirst. She didn't come to deal with Jesus Christ. But when she left that place, she forgot all about what she came for, and she left her water pot behind and went back to the city. For what purpose? To tell everybody what had happened in her life.

Talk about irresistible grace you have it here. She is irresistibly drawn by the Holy Spirit. That is the way God draws His own to Him. If you are one of God's elect, God is going to irresistibly draw you. You can't keep from it.

I often think how God draws His own — how remarkable it is that all of God's elect are drawn to Him. You can take some steel filings and ashes, mix them together and lay a magnet down at a known distance away from the pile, and that magnet will draw every one of the steel filings and leave all the ashes, without disturbing them one particle. Beloved, that is the Lord Jesus Christ. He irresistibly draws you.

In the Old Testament, David said to Ziba, "Fetch me Mephibosheth." They had told David that he was the only one of the household of Saul that remained, that he was the lame son of Jonathan, that he was lame on both feet, and had become lame as a result of the fact that his nurse had allowed him to fall one day. David said, "Fetch me him," and Ziba fetched him. He didn't go to Mephilbosheth and say, "It might be to your advantage to come and see David." The Word of God says, "Fetch him," and he fetched him.

Beloved, that is the way the Holy Spirit deals with the unsaved. God irresistibly draws men to Himself. This woman couldn't help being saved. She had to be saved. She came out there expecting to find water that day and she got so concerned and so interested in spiritual truth that she forgot all about what she came for. She was irresistibly drawn.

just one drop of water on his tongue. He was thirsty in Hell. Men that go to Hell thirst. Jesus said, "The man that drinks of the water that I give him shall never thirst," as if to say, "You are saved — you are saved for ever. There is going to be perseverance. There is going to be preservation. You are going to be a child of God from now on." That was what he was saying to this woman.

You say, "What about her later life?" I don't know. The Word of God doesn't tell us but Jesus said to her. "If you will drink of the water that I give, you will never thirst. Therefore, He guaranteed to her that she would never go to Hell. I know this, that up yonder in Glory, singing the praise of God and listening to me while I preach, is that poor soul who was irresistibly drawn by the Holy Spirit. I know she is in Glory today because Jesus said, "If you will drink of me, you will never thirst.

CONCLUSION

T-total depravity; U-unconditional election; L-limited atonment; I-irresistible grace; P-perseverance. I chose to call this message "Tulip Baptists." You say, "How do you know

that this woman became a Baptist?" I know one thing, she could not have been anything else. The Lord Jesus Christ had Baptist baptism. He had been baptized by John the Baptist, and every one of His disciples had Baptist baptism. They had all been baptized by John the Baptist, and every one of His disciples had Baptist baptism. They had all been baptized by John the Baptist. I am satisfied when she associated with them that she also became a Baptist. If she were baptized, and I am sure she was, I am satisfied that one of these Baptist preachers - one of the twelve apostles baptized her. Beloved, I say to you, if I were not a member of a church, I would certainly want to be. and I would want to be a "Tulip" Baptist. I would want to be a Baptist that believed these five great truths of grace. I ask you, are you saved but not a member of a church? Are you saved but have never followed Jesus by baptism? ing which we look forward to is in two aspects.

I believe that there is that aspect which we refer to as the Rapture when Jesus Christ comes for His church and takes out His bride. There is also that aspect which we refer to as the Revelation, when Jesus Christ shall come at the end of the seven years tribulation period in all of His glory, Lordship, and Kinship to establish the throne of His Father David in Jerusalem.

The Rapture, or the first of these aspects, is imminent. I take great joy in preaching that Jesus Christ may come at any moment. Before I finish this message we may be ushered into the presence of God. What a joy that Jesus is coming at any moment.

Ephesians 5:26, 27 reads: "That He might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word. That He might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish."

The only way that the church of Jesus Christ is cleansed is by the preaching of the Word of God, which is truth, as it says in John 17:26.

"And I have declared unto them Thy name, and will declare it: that the love wherewith Thou hast loved Me may be in them, and I in them."

The word "spot" (Eph. 5:26, 27) gives the idea of being unfaithful. The word "wrinkle" refers simply to the signs of old age. All you have to do is look around you and you will see that all of us submit to the signs of old age and humanity. God was very true in I Corinthians 1 when He said that He did not choose those who were the best looking and most wise, and for the truthfulness of that, all you have to do is look at the fellow next to you, and then go home and look at yourself. None of us are ever going to win a beauty contest or be known for our worldly wisdom. But that He might present to Himself e defects, a spotless without church, a chaste virgin, and that we be ushered in to the presence of the Father, the Rapture is imminent! The Revelation will come, not for the church, but for repentant Israel. We see history and prophecy being fulfilled before us today. The Old Testament has said that God would call to the land which He gave to Abraham, His people that He would call them back in unbelief. Isaiah says that from the north, the south, the east and the west He would call back His sons and daughters; that He would bring them from afar. and He would establish them in His land. Those Arabs, Jordanians, and Egyptians are fighting a losing battle. God is fighting on the side of the Jews. They are fulfilling His prophecy and don't even know it, just like He said they would.

shall be caught up with those who are raised from the dead to meet Him in the air, and so shall we ever be with the Lord. In the first phase of this coming, He is not going to put His foot upon the earth. We shall be ushered into His presence between earth and heaven just as Rebekah was ushered into the presence of Isaac outside the home in Genesis 24.

In the second phase of this coming, however, He shall come to the earth. He shall put His foot upon the earth, and topographical and geographical changes shall take place all over the earth: mountains shall cleave, earthquakes shall occur. The sun shall cease its shining in the face of Him, who is the Son of Righteousness, Mountains shall change their course because the Creator has arrived.

In Revelation 19:11 John says, "And I saw Heaven opened, and behold a white horse ... " Notice John says. 'I saw Heaven opened." He did not say that Heaven did open. but "I saw Heaven opened." which is to say that some force opened it. God opened it. The Book of Revelation is very clear when it says that it is His will that those who are in the armies of the anti-Christ shall be brought to the valley by the will of God. Now, if you want to preach "lovy-dovey religion." there is something for you to explain away - - whom Jesus Christ destroys, shall be destroyed by the will of God.

He is also a God of judgment as we shall see. "His eyes were as a flame of fire..." Revelation 19:12. I want you to remember that. Now, let us look at verse 16.

"And He that on His vesture and on His thigh a name written. KING OF KINGS, AND LORD OF LORDS."

I would just about as soon preach Jesus as King of kings and Lord of lords as anything that I know of. If you want something to thrill your soul and put you on the mountain top of preaching, just preach Jesus Christ as King, and you'll get a blessing out of it.

We have too much preaching in this age of Jesus sitting in Heaven, all frustrated because He loves everybody and nobody loves Him. I tell you, my friend, that the Jesus I preach and serve, is King of Kings - He is Lord of Lord, and it makes no difference whether you believe it or not. He is King - He always has been, and He always will be. He is simply biding His time until he demonstrates that Kingship to every unsaved reprobate on the face of the earth. In His Revelation, He is coming in judgment. Joel 2:2 refers to the day of the Lord. " A day darkness and of of gloominess, a day of clouds and of thick darkness, as the morning spread upon the mountains: a great people and a strong; there hath not been even the like, neither shall be any more after it, even to the years of many generations." That is literal my friend. The firmament will recognize Jesus Christ. 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



I Corinthians 6:20 says we are bought with a price. Who were we name of the Lord Jesus," bebought from? And to whom was that price paid?

In speaking to those who were "called to be saint," as "sanctified in Christ Jesus" (I Cor. 1:2), the apostle Paul said: "...ye are bought with a great price; therefore, glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's" (I Cor, 6:20).

When something of great value is bought at an agreed price, it is normally proper to enquire, "From whom did you buy it?"

However, in this most unique case, the price for the redemption of God's elect people was formulated in the Trinity, "According as He hath chosen us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him, in love: Having predestinated us unto the adoption of sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will, to the praise of the glory of His grace, through which He hath made us accepted in the Beloved" (Eph. 1:4-6).

So, to this end, Christ came into the world "to give His life a ransom for many" (Mt. 20:28). This "ransom" was the redemption-price which He gave "to save His people from their sins" (Mt. 1:21).

This perfectly satisfied the requirements of God's justice; in other words, this ransom price was not paid to the person of a whom; but, rather, to the satisfaction of God's justice by the love of God in Christ Jesus for the redemption of His people yes, "for as many as were ordained to eternal life; that is, for as many as the Father gave unto Him, no more or no less.

flesh is in the blood" (Lev. 17:11), the purchase was "with His own blood" (Acts 20:28).

Consequently, in answer to the "ransom," as paid to the satisfaciton of God's justice, "Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us...' (Gal. 3:13).

Then, in answer to this fact, we are told that "when He had by Himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high" (Heb. 1:3).

Thus it is affirmed that this 'purging" was "Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by His own blood He entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us" (Heb. 9:12).

Also, Peter, in speaking to the "elect" (1 Pet. 1:2), affirmed their knowledge which they had of "the precious blood of Christ,...Who was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in those last times for you" (1 Pet. 1:19, 20).

So, finally, in "a new song," it, in God's justice, was affirmed that the Lamb of God "hath redeemed us to God by thy blood...And hath made us unto our God...a kingdom of priests" (Rev. 5:9, 10).

These few of many instances do not, in any way, infer that, when we were bought with the blood of Christ, the purchase was from some person who owned them for sale; but, on the other hand, it is known that God, the Father, Who gave His elect-people to Jesus, owned them, even before the world began. So, when they sinned, the blood of Christ was strictly a ransom-price to satisfy God's justice for their redemption.

In paying this ransom, as required by God, the Father, we are told that He "was raised again for our justification" (Rom. 4:25). Then, being now justified by His blood, "we shall be saved from wrath through Him" (Rom. 5:9).

ing by grace through faith, and apart from works.

Who, then, "shall lav anything to the charge of God's elect? It is God that justifieth? Who is he that condemneth? It is Christ that died, yea, rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, who also maketh intercession for us" (Rom. 8:33, 34).

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"For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's" (I Cor. 6;20).

Yes, we were bought with a price. That price was the precious blood of Jesus as of a Lamb without spot or blemish. That price was the only price in all the universe that could have paid the required price and redeemed the elect of God. Oh, how we love Him - how we adore him - the one who went to Calvary for us. On the basis of this truth, we are commanded to glorify Him in all we do. We were obligated by creaturehood to do this, but now there is an added reason why we should do such.

I would not make any issue at all out of the matter of to whom was this price paid. I do not think the Bible goes into such a subject at all. I will say that most certainly the price was not paid to the devil as some have taught. I would put the matter like this.

Because of our sins, we were subject to the claims of God's broken law against us. The law demanded that the penalty for our sins be suffered. The law of a thrice Holy God will never discharge one from its power and obligations except all claims be fully met. This law is the expression of God's holy character, and God's holiness demands that sin be properly and adequately punished. Jesus Christ took voluntarily upon Himself all the guilt of all the sins of all the elect of God. No more and no less. God punished Jesus Christ with the exact equivalent of what the total elect would have suffered in an eternal hell. I most emphatically mean the exact equivalent - no more, no less. So that none but the elect will be saved by His death. And, praise God, all the elect will assuredly be saved thereby. I believe that this suffering by Christ of the exact equivalent of the total hell for the total elect is what is meant by Christ buying us with a price. If we must say who it was paid to, it was paid to the

Father in satisfying completely the claims of His holiness and of His holy law against the elect. However, I would hesitate to use this terminology, but again if it is a payment to anyone, it was to the Father, and we were bought from under the claims of His law

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The Bible tells us that we are all sinners. "...As it is written, there is none righteous, no, not one...For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." (Rom. 3:9-23). We are completely sinful deserving nothing but death. "For the wages of sin is death..." (Rom. 6:23). God being a perfectly just God demands the payment of sin.

We are told that we are bought with a price. The price was not paid to anyone as such. The price was the ransom necessary to satisfy the just demands of a Sovereign God. ... That He might be just, and the justifier of him which believeth in Jesus" (Rom. 3:26). Thus we were bought not from anyone - for we were not held by anyone - but from our own guilt as sinners.

This price was the sacrifice of a guiltless person, the Lord Jesus Christ, paid in place of the guilty. "The Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give His life a ransom for many" (Matt. 20:28). Galatians 3:13 tells us that "Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us." The Greek word for redeem here means to ransom or rescue, or in other words to loose with a price. I Timothy 2:6 speaks of the ransom in the sense of "a corresponding price." "Who gave Himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time."The price that was paid corresponds to all our sins so that we stand perfect in Christ before God.

Again the price that was paid is the death of Christ - and His shed blood. "...Unto Him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in His own blood" (Rev. 1:5).

entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us...For Christ is not entered into the holy places made with hands, which are the figures of the true; but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us" (9:12, 24).

And the blood which our glorified Lord presented to the prejureless court of the sin avenging God in the tabernacle. heavenly speaketh better things than that of Abel (Heb. 12:24). God's justice looked upon the penalty paid by the perfect and sinless Son of God, and was eternally satisfied. The infinite and eternal mind speaking in view of His fallen, halpless, and hell deserving people, said, "By His knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many; for He shall bear their iniquities" (Isa. 53:11). While the true goodness of God cannot be exaggerated, it is not such as to preclude justice and severity. "The judgment of God is according to truth" (Ro. 2:2), and every sin shall receive a just recompense. Christ was recompensed for the sins of His people, suffered their awful penalty, the just for the unjust that He might bring them to God (I Pet. 3:18).

It certainly was not to the Devil, redemption price was paid, for the only thing God owes him is, everlasting damnation (Rev. 20:10).

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In answer to this question let us first look at a few passages of Scripture. In I Peter 1: 18-19 "Forasmuch as ye know that ve were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; But with the precious blood of Christ, as a lamb without blemish and without spot:" Also in Romans 3: 24-26, "Being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus: Whom God hath set forth to be a prooitiation through faith in His blood, to declare His righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forebearance of God; To declare, I say, at this time His righteousness: that He might be just, and the justifier of him which believeth in Jesus." In Gal. 3:13 we see, "Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us: -" These passages as well as many others show that Christians have been purchased, redeemed, or recovered to God. The price was the blood of Jesus, as an atoning sacrifice, a ransom, which accomplished the same ends in maintaining the truth and honor of God, and in upholding His law, as the eternal condemnation of the sinner would have done. Therefore it can be said that the price was paid. The question is not from (Continued on Page 5 Column 1)

Thus, He took our obligation to be punished, and, instead, laid upon us a new obligation to obedience, which answered to the justice of God's eternal purpose.

Too, since "the life of the

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The price paid for the redemption of God's elect was the blood of Christ. The believer was bought from his "vain conversation" or "from the curse of the law" (I Pet. 1:18 & 19; Gal. 3:13). The price was paid to the Judge of all the earth, almighty God, who will even deal justly with those who say, He is unjust (Gen. 18:25). God's justice is absolute, and will in no wise overlook the first infraction of the holy law (Na. 1:3), and "without shedding of blood is no remission" (Heb. 9:22). Thus it is, we read of Christ, "...by His own blood He

wilderness: yea, and nothing shall escape them."

Have you ever talked to anyone who has recently come back from Israel. That is the most fertile and productive area in the Middle East today.

Again in Joel 2:6 we read: 'Before their face the people shall be much pained: all faces shall gather blackness." I want you to notice that the means by which Jesus shall destroy the armies of the anti-Christ is fire. Verse 7, 8 and 9 indicate that those who come with Jesus Christ as glorified saints will be invulnerable. Notice: "They shall run like mighty men; they shall climb the wall like men of war; and they shall march every one on his ways, and they shall not break their ranks." Nothing can penetrate their formation, you see. The battle of Armageddon isn't going to be something that see-saws. There is never any doubt as to who the victor

"Neither shall one thrust another; they shall not be wounded." (vs. 8) Isn't that glorious? Nothing is going to hurt that army. Nothing can hurt that army because they are the glorified saints who have had the sting of sin removed.

When I started studying this, I became very impressed with the times in the Word of God where a manifestation of the glory of God is mentioned, that fire is also mentioned. Did you ever notice that? If you will notice in Isaiah, the sixth chapter, fire is mentioned when Isaiah saw the Lord high and lifted up.

Fire is mentioned also in Ezekiel 1:27, 28:

"And I saw as the colour of amber, as the appearance of fire round about within it, from the appearance of His loins even upward, and from the appearance of His loins even downward, I saw as it were the appearance of fire, and it had brightness round about. As the appearance of the bow that is in the cloud in the day of rain, so was the appearance of the likeness of the glory of the Lord. And when I saw it, I fell upon my face, and I heard a voice of one that spake.'

When Ezekiel again, in the 8th chapter, saw the manifestation of God's glory, fire is mentioned as it is also in the 10th time a manifestation of the glory of God is seen in the Old and New Testaments, fire is somewhere involved.

In Revelation 4 John is ushered into the presence of God in glory and sees Him in all of His majesty and glory and seven flames burn before the altar. Fire is invariably mentioned when a manifestation of the glory of God is revealed. There is a reason for that.

"And the sight of the glory of the Lord was like devouring fire on the top of the mount in the eyes of the children of Israel." (Exodus 24:17).

Do you remember when Elijah prayed and God rained down fire? That was devouring fire-it not only consumed the sacrifices but the sand, altar, rocks, and everything else.

"For our God is a consuming fire." Hebrews 12:29. The glory of God in the Scriptures is identified with consuming fire. That is why no unsaved person can stand before God. His glory forbids it. They would be immediately consumed by the glory unless they are protected by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.

II Thessalonians 2 speaks of the time when Jesus Christ shall be revealed from Heaven against the anti-Christ and all of his millions of his armies who will be arrayed there outside of Jerusalem in all of their arrogance and pride against the God of glory. We read in verse 8, "And then shall that Wicked be revealed, whom the Lord shall consume with the spirit of His mouth, and shall destroy with the brightness of his coming." The very presence of Jesus Christ shall consume those who are arrayed against Him like consuming fire.

Listen to what Zechariah 14:12 says: "And this shall be the plague wherewith the Lord will smite all the people that have fought against Jerusalem: Their flesh shall consume away while they stand upon their feet, and their eyes shall consume away in their holes, and their tongue shall consume away in their mouth." Divine fire! To be consumed with the brightness of His glory and we are going to be just like Him! What a glorious salvation we have in Jesus Christ. What a glorious truth-we are going to be just like Him. See I John 3: 1,2.

According to Zechariah 14:4 Jesus Christ shall appear on earth and the Mount of Olives shall be split. The Jordan River flows north and south in Israel and just right at the north end of the Dead Sea, is Jerusalem with only one natural obstacle in between and that is the Mount of Olives. This verse says that Jesus is going to stand on the Mount of Olives and it shall cleave, half to the north and half to the south and a great valley shall be opened up. It will be a valley almost 200 miles long and 50 miles wide and it is in that valley that the blood will flow thick as horses bridles, which will open His way straight to the east gate of Jerusalem.

the east gate which has been blocked all these many years, and He is going to establish Himself in Jerusalem as King of kings and Lord of lords. Thank God!

He said as he stood at the foot of the Mount of Olives and looked upon that mountain, he noticed path that was running from the west to the east and he asked his guide why no one lived along this path that seemed to be running right across the middle of that mountain. The guide, an unsaved man who did not know any of the Bible said, "That is not a path. It would seem that the mountain is beginning to cleave and in some places the cleft is 6 inches wide.

Beloved, Jesus Christ is coming again! He is coming very soon. Aren't you glad that you have been born again and are ready for His coming.

that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for RIGHTEOUSNESS" (Rom. 4:5).

JESUS SAID

"Verily, verily I say unto you, He that heareth my word and believeth on him that sent me HATH EVERLASTING life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life" (John 5:24).

Yes, we must have our faith in Christ's BLOOD for forgiveness of sins-plus nothing minus nothing. If our faith is in Jesus Christ, the Son of God, then we are safe.

If one's trust in good works, as was the Pharisee's, then that one needs to accept Christ and trust in what He did on the cross at Calvary for us.

"As many as received Him, to them gave He power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on His name; which were born, not of blood, nor or the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God" (John 1:12, 13).

The sons of God, then, are Christians-they have joined themselves by faith to the only begotten Son of God. By assent of mind, and consent of heart to Him, they have become in the peculiar, special, glorified sense of Scripture.

THE NEW BIRTH

"Except a man be born again, he cannot see the Kingdom of God" (John 3:3).

Through the gospel, the Holy Spirit, in a supernatural manner works upon the hearts of men, and by His operation they are regenerated, born again. There is an actual putting forth of Divine power whereby the sinner dead in sins and trespasses, is quickened, the rebellious will subdued, the hardened conscience made tender, and he who once despised the Son of God, is brought to cast himself down at His feet. A MORAL TRANSFORMA.

MORAL TRANSFORMA-TION

There is a radical change of life. The new birth gives the son of God a new nature; makes him love the things he once hated, and hate the things he once loved; makes his thoughts different and his habits different; makes him different in private and indifferent in public; so that to be a son of God is to be a new creature, to whom old things have passed away and all things have become new, and all things are of God (II Cor. 5:17, 18). upon us, that we should be called the sons of God: therefore the world knoweth us not, because it knew Him not" (I John 3:1).

As the world gave the only begotten Son of God no honor, gave Him only rejection and the cross, so it gives the sons of God no honor, and were a Christian to gain a place of worldly favor. he would not be in the path way of His Lord.

THE GLORIOUS DESTINY OF THE SONS OF GOD

There is for the sons of God, a coming day of glory and honor. together with their now rejected Lord. In I John 3:2 we are given a faint hint of a coming glorious change.

THE CHARACTER OF THE SONS OF GOD

In Phil. 2:15, we have the calling of the sons of God - to be bearers of a testimony to the world,... "among whom ye shine as lights in the world" (verse 15). It is not a simple declarative, as in A.V., but an imperative, a command, "Shine ye!" as in R.V.

WITNESSES FOR CHRIST

The sons of God are to be "lightbearers" to the rest of mankind. The only light this poor world has is "the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ" (II Cor. 4:4). The sons of God are to be witnesses of this light.

But a witness must have a character consistent with his testimony. In a court of law, a witness may bear a perfectly true testimony, but if the opposing council can prove that his character is bad; that he is not wholly reliable; that he can be bought and sold, his testimony will be thrown out of court. And that Christian whose speech is full of unbelief and doubt, or in whose life there is worldliness, or careless and open sin, will find that any testimony he may seek to give, rejected with scorn.

CHRIST-LIKE CHARACTERS

The sons of God, as witnesses

for Christ to a world of moral and spiritual darkness, must have more than a good moral character. Many worldlings possess, outwardly at least, good moral characters. Witnesses for Christ must have a character far above this. They are to have Christ-like characters, true reflectors of Him Who is the light of the world. In the chapter we are looking at we have a divinely given pattern of the Christ-like life. First, we find that the sons of God are to be: LOVING HEARTED

whom we were bought but from what were we bought? The answer is the "Curse of the law" (Gal 3:13). The law of God demands eternal punishment as the wages of sin. So Christ by His death purchased or redeemed us from that punishment. The price was paid to satisfy the just demands of the law of God.

We say, when a person has served a term in prison for a crime which he had committed, he has paid his debt to the demands of the law. Christ paid the debt that we as sinful creatures owed to the righteous demands of the law of God, a debt that we could never have paid in an eternal hell.

"For as the lightning cometh out of the east, and shineth even unto the west; so shall also the coming of the Son of Man be." (Matthew 24:27).

LOVE TOWARD SINNERS

3. A church that is part picture show and entertainment agency is not as good as the church that sticks to its divine mission as given by Jesus. That mission is stated in Matt. 28:18-20. Many churches have taken over functions that are not even mentioned in the Bible. This is unwarranted and perversion of what Jesus intended. We have read of a famous Italian Cathedral, "the dome of which is so constructed, that sounds beneath it come back in sweet replay of chiming melody, and the clash of discord is changed to harmony as the seasonant vault returns it to the waiting ear." Brotherly love is the harmonizing dome over an assembly of God, and if undamaged the sounds of discord or fraction will never be heard. -Light and Liberty

For December 7, 1980 Ruth 2:21-3:1-5


Intro:-The Book of Ruth sets forth beautifully in type, shadow, example, and illustration, the story of the Redeemer and the redemption we have in Him; however we must not forget it also sets forth everyday situations which reveal the practical side of our duties and responsibilities in our relationship to each other, especially the facts of a proper attitude in regards to courtship and marriage, which is so desperately needed in our warped society. This lesson deals with an easily misunderstood or misapplied meaning to the proper attitude and action of a man and woman. The Bible is very careful to protect the sanctity of marriage and of a proper relationship of husband and wife (Gen. 2:24). Because of sin, this natural, normal, and Godly union has been abused and misused (Rom. 1:26, 27). We need therefore to once again set before our young people the beauty of marriage, and to let them know it is normal and proper to save themselves for marriage. However, we must also remember that if one be overtaken in a fault, he is to be recovered if possible.

VERSE 21

"And Ruth the Moabitess said, He said unto me also, Thou shalt keep fast by my young men, until they have ended all my harvest." Since Boaz had given instructions to the young men to take special note of Ruth, he would naturally give her proper instructions as to her privileges and respon-

VERSE 23

"So she kept fast by the maidens of Boaz to glean unto the end of barley harvest and of wheat harvest." The readiness and willingness of Ruth to heed God's message through His human instruments is a classic example for all the saints of God. If your Pastor is God's man, giving forth God's message, he is to be heeded, for he will direct your steps into following the Lord.

"And dwelt with her mother-in-law." In spite of her outward success and the natural tendency to be on her own, she still had respect for, and felt an obligation to her mother-in-law. This also manifests the mutual feeling they had for each other.

deceitfully advised. Naomi assured her this is proper; first, because of the fact he was a kindred by marriage, and next, because of the attention and affection Boaz had shown to her over a period of time.

"Behold, he winnoweth barley to night in the threshing-floor." We can rest assured the intention of Naomi, Ruth, and Boaz were honorable. What Boaz was doing, and where he was doing it, gave occasion for the fruition of the bringing together of Ruth and Boaz; not only for Ruth's redemption, but that the Godly line may be continued.

VERSE 3

"Wash thyself therefore, and anoint thee, and put thy raiment upon thee." Proper adornment and a proper deportment for a woman is always important (I Tim. 2: 8-15). However, the real beauty of Ruth and all Godly women is on the inside (Prov. 31:5; I Pet. 3:1-6) spiritually. You might compare this verse with Isa. 61:10 and Rev. 19:7, 8.

"And get thee down to the floor; but make not thyself known unto the man, until he shall have done eating and drinking." There is a time and a place for a woman to be in the background and in silence (I Cor. 14:34; I Thess. 2:11, 12). This does not make her inferior or of less importance than the man, but it does bring out the fact of the headship of the man. VERSE 4

"And it shall be, when he lieth down, that thou shalt mark the place where he shall lie, and thou shalt go in, and uncover his feet, and lay thee down." This was not to be done to any other man or in any other way. This, I'm sure, would seem peculiar, and even suspicious to the natural man, but if you know the custom of the day, and the purpose behind this, it would appear, as it was intended, in its real light.

"And he will tell thee what thou shalt do." Naomi was certain Boaz would respond in the proper way. This is a testimony of his character.

Mr. White's wife, reached by telephone in Glendale, said the State Department has confirmed the news of the pardon of her husband and Mr. Bailey. "The State Department said they don't know when and they don't know how — but the prisoners were released recently.

DALLAS (EP via RNS)-Dr. W. A. Criswell, a prominent Southern Baptist pastor, has broken a month-long silence to denounce a statement made by Mr. Bailey Smith, president of the Southern Baptist Convention, that God does not hear the prayers of a Jew. "I have illimitable love and affection for the Jew," said Dr. Criswell. "We wouldn't have a Bible we wouldn't have the Lord, if it were not for the Jews.

Dr. Criswell, pastor of the 21,000-member First Baptist Church here, the largest congregation in the Southern Baptist Convention, was president of the 13.5-million-member denomination in 1968 and 1969. When Mr. Smith made his statement about the Jews at a Dallas meeting in August, Dr. Criswell did not speak out about it because, he said, he did not want to appear to be causing divisiveness within the denomination.

Mr. Deukmejian's announcement followed the U.S. Supreme Court's rejection of an effort by the Worldwide Church of God to require the attorney general's office to return church documents seized last year during a preliminary investigation of church finances.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. (EP)—"The people of God, if they are really the people of God, are on the side of the poor," said author-educator Ron Sider who addressed a Baptist conference on developing a **Responsible Christian Lifestyle.** Speakers at the three-day meeting repeatedly called for simplified lifestyles and closer identification with the poor and hungry

Mr. Sider, author of "Rich Christians in an Age of Hunger," warned against adopting legalistic definitions of "simple lifestyle" but said Christians must confront the Bible's "clear teaching" about responsibility toward the poor and hungry in the world. He said the "desperate poverty of hundreds of millions," coupled with "billions who have never heard of Jesus Christ," are two compelling reasons for American Christians - the "rich minority" — to live more simply.

JERUSALEM (EP via RNS)—Prompt action by a Jerusalem fire-fighting brigade prevented a fire from spreading from a chapel in the Church of the Holy Sepulcher and seriously threatening the veneral structure.

The fire, which broke out on the night of Oct. 14 in the Armenian Chapel of St. Helen, destroyed a religious painting and severally damaged much of the wood covering the stone walls of the crypt-like chapel.

The fire was discovered by an Armenian Orthodox priest assigned as a live-in watchman at the famed church, built over the traditionally accepted sites of Jesus's crucifixion and burial. Authorities ruled out arson. Investigation of the blaze indicated that it had begun accidentally; a pilgrim had left a burning candle on a wooden table in the chapel.

E. Wildmon, executive director of the NFD. He said buzzard was a slang term which is applied to advertisers following a similar practice in buying time on television. The NFD named five other companies as buzzards. They are Beecham, Inc. (Aqua-Fresh toothpaste, Cling Free, Calgonite, Brylcream), Thompson Medical (Dexatrim, Prolamine and Control diet tablets), Mazda (automobiles), Liggett Group (Alpo dog food), and Vidal 'Sassoon (hair care products).

"These companies are far more concerned about price than content. They are buzzards in the truest sense. They hover around a rotten program in order to buy time for peanuts" Mr. Wildmon said.

NEW YORK (EP via RNS)-The J.P. Stevens Co. and the Amalgamated Clothing and Textile Workers Union have called a truce to their rancorous, 17-year-struggle over the union's attempts to organize company plants.

Stevens signed 21/2-year contracts with workers at seven plants in Roanoke Rapids, N.C. The agreement is expected to serve as a model for contracts at other plants in North and South Carolina and Alabama where the union had won previous organizing elections. In exchange, the union promised to call off its four-year-old boycott of Stevens products and cease its drive to oust company directors and officers who serve on other corporate boards. The agreement left both sides claiming a victory of sorts.

ST. LOUIS (EP via RNS)—Breakaway

Presbyterians meeting here in September agreed to set up a network of communication, fellowship and shared resources" which they insist will not lead to the creation of a new denomination. According to its elected moderator, the Rev. Calvin Gray, the newly formed Association of Evangelical Presbyterian Churches should attract at least half of the 40 churches that in recent months have bolted the 2.5-million-member United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A.

Representatives of 25 breakaway churches, and 15 churches considering such a move affirmed six fundamental principles of common doctrine. Only a handful said he expects that the association will soon comprise churches with a combined total of some 18,000 members. Many of the churches involved bolted over United Presbyterian Church legislation to require female participation on their local church boards called sessions. All of them cited lax theological trends - exemplified, they say, in the appointment of a pastor who refused to affirm the full deity of Jesus Christ.

ELKHART, Ind. (EP) -ALEKSANDRA

KOZAREZOVA, mother of ten children and current director of the Council of Prisioners' Relatives, was recently convicted of Article 187 of the Ukrainian Criminal code. Sources in the Soviet Union report that the case was concluded in just five days in early October in Voroshilovgrad, Ukraine. Article 187 is frequently applied to Christians who have been involved in circulating documents detailing persecution of the church. Kozorezova's husband ALEKSEI was imprisoned eight years in Soviet prisons and concentration camps for his active faith in God, according to spokesmen here at the Council of Evangelical Baptist Churches of the Soviet Union, Inc.

SANTIAGO, Chile (EP via RNS)-Chile's military government has invited American Protestant evangelist REX HUM-BARD to visit the predominantly Roman Catholic nation and conduct mass crusades. The invitation was extended to the religious broadcaster at a meeting here with Chilean President Augusto Pinochet Ugarte. According to a Rex Humbard Ministry news bulletin, the invitation is "historic" and 'unprecedented," as it marks "the first time that the Chilean government has requested a visit by an American evangelist."

FOUNTAIN VALLEY, Calif. (EP)-The Athletes in Action basketball team announced today the signing of former Notre Dame star RICH BRANNING and UCLA veteran GIG SIMS. The new recruits give the Campus Crusade for Christ-sponsored team and first-year Head Coach Wardell Jeffries bolstered strength that they hope will move AIA toward its goal of becoming the number one amateur team in the world. The signings bring the total of new AIA players to five and complete the 1980-81 roster at 11.

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (EP

via RNS)-Citing a new state law that sharply curtails his authority over churches, state Atty. Gen. George Deukmejian announced here that he is dropping 12 investigations of religious groups, including the Worldwide Church of God, Synanon and the Glendale Faith Center.

A bill by Oakland state Sen. Nicholas Petris that was signed recently by Gov. Edmund G. Brown, Jr. divested the attorney general of power to prosecute cases involving tax-exempt religious organizations when there are allegations of misuse of funds or internal civil fraud.

"We urged the legislature to include a 'savings clause' in this bill in order to preserve actions which our office already had filed," Mr. Deukmejian said, "The legislature rejected that re-

TUPELO, Miss. (EP)-The National Federation for Decency has named Alberto-Culver the top advertising "buzzard" on television in a recently completed report. The NFD said "buzzard" is slang for an advertiser who intentionally buys into programs classified by the trade as "distressed merchandise." ignoring a great portion of the written Word, or hiding its teachings with a multiplicity of words which are meaningless to the Lord's people who desire to know the truth. Through their own ignorance of the truth, they juggle with the Scriptures as if the Bible were a book of idle tales. And these modern antichrists now occupy about all the places of importance as leaders in christendom, and the world has run greedily after them. But not the Lord's people, thanks be to God. His people can never be deceived for long into giving heed to seducing spirits and doctrines of demons. The elect of God are immune from the deceptions of antichrists. But in these last days there are few, very few indeed, who are proving that they are the elect of God, and that they love the Word of God sufficiently to study it so as to understand it. It is true the Bible was not written for the disinterested, lazy and careless class, but for the truly sincere souls who love it, and prayerfully seek daily to know its teachings in order to measure their Christian experience and daily walk by it. These and only these will ever know any part of the teachings of the Bible.

We speak from good authority when we say the modernist leaders in both the Northern and Southern Baptist Conventions are denying the virgin birth of our Lord. Denying the miraculous conception of the Virgin Mary by the overshadowing of the Holy Ghost. It was reported over the air just recently, that one prominent Baptist leader of the South made the following statement: "I know of no preacher of any note who believes in the virgin birth." This and many other things which the modernists are teaching, and which their followers are accepting, are sufficient to evoke an indignant protest from the very tomb of James Arminius, and he would blush, no doubt, were it possible for him to witness any one of the many popular church services of today. For he certainly had no idea that his heresies would ever become so popular in the modern world, and so soul destroying as at this present time. But how true are the words of the apostle with regard to these heretics, "And their words will eat as doth a canker" (II Tim. 2:17).

Arminianism, the invention of Satan, who is the father of lies, is responsible for this worst of all backward steps in the ranks of the Baptists, i.e. Modernism had its inception in Arminianism. But what could be more natural or more to be expected than for Arminian believers to drift into even worse heresies? good man only. Modern "high pressure evangelism" has done much to destroy what was once a great Christian organization. Baptists today, with the exception of a comparatively small number of churches and God-called ministers, who are holding their pastorates to the glory of God, are no more like they were in the days of John Gill or C. H. Spurgeon, no, nor like they were even forty years ago, than if they were not the same people. And it is only too plain in the eyes of any **GENUINE** Baptist that they are not the same people except in name. And everyone who has had interest enough to keep pace with the trend of Baptist thought, has had occasion to watch them drift farther and farther away from all the best and most important teachings which were once held as dear as life itself by the Baptists. They have also seen the leaders of both conventions espouse the most damnable heresies. And those creeping heresies have been, and are, eating at the very vitals of true Christian beliefs. While the few godly preachers are still holding forth the Word of life, giving their time and talents to the study of the Bible, ! knowing it to be God's book, given by Divine inspiration, the only book that God ever did or ever will give to a helpless fallen race of people, the only book that tells us of a God-given Saviour, who is Christ our Redeemer, yea, God in the flesh. Without this book we could not even know there is a Heaven or Hell. Those preachers who are still holding this old tear-stained book dear to their hearts, I say, are a small minority, and have been almost crowded out of church society. They are not wanted in the popular churches. The true teaching of the Word of God is not wanted. It is too straight for them. Is it any wonder then that godly men who have loved and reverenced the Bible, and have given the greater part of their lives to the study and teaching of _ it, is it any wonder that such men find it necessary to refuse to -fellowship with these modern heretics? Is it any wonder that - such godly men could no longer tolerate their flat denials of the bs Divinity and virgin birth of our Lord Jesus Christ? Oh, that

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God would be pleased to open the blind eyes and unstop the deaf ears of all those who continue to follow these blind guides ignorantly, carelessly. And who continue to pour their pennies, dimes and dollars into the pockets of such heretics to pay them for spreading their soul destroying falsehoods.

Not only are those antichrists denying the virgin birth of our Lord, they are also teaching people of our day, that it is a thing of the past and for the Jews only. This is the most damnable heresy that the Devil ever foisted on a gullible people. The Scriptures have told us in language too plain to be misunderstood, that without repentance there is no remission of sins. And even now the severe judgments of God Almighty are beginning to descend upon the heads of a Christless Christendom, who have defied the words of our Lord and His apostles. They have never exrepentance perienced themselves and therefore cannot teach it to others. They say they believe in one God, but the Devils also believe this and tremble. And what kind of a god do they believe in? Evidently the god of the Pantheists or one just as bad, but certainly not the true and living God who rules in the Heaven and the earth, and who will hold them to a strict account for their false beliefs and actions.

We hear much of so-called Christian America today. But dear reader, is our America really a Christian land? Is it not rather true that everything points to the fact that God has now taken just about all of His elect out from the Gentiles? For "God did visit the Gentiles to take out of them a people for His name." For this very reason, God has not but few true Gospel preachers, and there are few who will hear the true Gospel. True, there are very many preachers so-called, in the world today. And we often hear it said, "There are too many preachers." Shall we ever be persuaded that God knows just

exactly what He is doing? "Known unto God are all His works from the beginning of the world." God neither has too many nor too few preachers, but just enough at all times. The too many" are not God's preachers. The Lord's preachers love the Bible, study it continuously, and preach it boldly, defying the mockery of the modern critics. And they are careful that their churches do not contribute one cent to propagate the heresies so popular today. Men would scorn at the idea of contributing money to pay a hireling for taking the life of a fellow man, but they do not hesitate to contribute their money to pay a hireling for preaching soul-destroying heresies. Which is worse? Our Lord tells us not to fear Him who hath power to kill the body, but to fear him who hath power to destroy both soul and body in Hell. It is much worse to spread false teaching to destroy souls than it is to commit murder.

In view of all the evil before our very eyes in these terrible days, I wish to urge the true children of God to "a back to the Bible movement," with sincere prayers that God may enlighten our minds more and more to understand its teachings. But not to the twentieth century "Revised Standard Version" which seems to be Satan's masterpiece for the last days, and which may prove to be his final trick to deceive. This new Bible, revised by unbelieving modernists, can be a dangerous book in the hands of the unskilled. I have perused it for weeks, only to find that the modernist revisers have tried hard to obscure the teaching of the miraculous conception, the virgin birth and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ. No, dear reader, given to us by our parents and foreparents. The Bible which is a lamp to our feet, food to our souls, a sword of the Spirit to fight modernist heresies and Satan's lies with. It is the Good Seed which, when planted in good ground, will bring forth, some a hundred, some sixty and some seventy fold. Read it, study it prayerfully. God requires it of every one of us.
